It is important that you should be satisfied that the constitution of all Officers, whose names are submitted as Officers strong enough to fit them for life in a tropical source which they will have to satisfy the medical adviser of the Coroni Office. The Candidates must be of unexceptionable character and strictly suber habits.

The Customs Department of the Protectorate is premised as : lows :-

- I Chief of Customs, Salary £700 per annum,
- I Assistant Chief of Customs, Salary £300 rising by £10 pen annum to £400 per annum.
- 2 Assistants, Salary £250 rising by £10 per annum to £300 per annum.

It is proposed that the Officer chosen should be engaged in first that after a year service on a three years' agreement, but that after a year service on this Protectorate he should be allowed, if he so desired and it has work had been satisfactory, to join the permanent staff of the Protectorate.
