The teacher selected will be required to sign an agreement to serve for three years, and to sail not later than one month after she has been found to be medically fit for service in East Africa. In addition to her salary of 150 rupees a month (about £120 per annum), she will be provided with free residence at Nairobi but will be required to make her own arrangements as regards board which should probably cost not more than 3 rupees per diem. She will receive a free second-class passage to Mombasa with third-class railway fare from her residence to the port of embarkation, and free transport over the railway from Mombasa to Nairobi, and a similar free passage home at the expiration of the three years agreement. She will receive also an outfit allowance of £15.
