To His Excellency—

Sir—

As a citizen born
 the island of Trinidad, British West Indies, and privileged
 educational advantages to have traveled extensively, I shall
 not to know if I can not be of commercial service to your
 continent in East Africa. I assure you, that I am a patriot to the
 British Government, under which I was born. I am of the race
 which is known as the Coptic principally, recognized as the Abyssinians
 much. Having up school teaching five years ago, I have been engaged
 ministerial work in America. Lately I became a lecturer of the
 geographical and historical facts of East Africa, or my ancient home
 Abyssinia; and having had personal interviews commercially with the
 American merchants, I assure you that it is the intention of the country to
 compete with England the trade of Abyssinia. As I am naturally anti-foreign
 the Americans, I pray that you may permit me to hold an office in East
 Africa. Any so doing I can entice the better class of the black of the continent
 and have discovered love the liberty. England gives her subjects to come and
 develop by farming and other industrial pursuits, of course first becoming
 naturalized to the flag of England. I am eagerly awaiting an answer to
 address.
