My Lord,

I have the honour to report that representations have been made to me by the Inspector General of Police as to the desirability of conferring greater powers than they at present possess under the Police Ordinance on the Sub-Commissioners of Jubaland and Tana Land.

It is no secret that owing to the infrequency of communication between the Province of Jubaland and the Headquarters of the Protectorate Administration, and also to the character of the natives (Somalis) from among whom its police force is mainly recruited, it is necessary that the civil officer in charge of the province should be armed with powers under the ordinance which will enable him to deal promptly and firmly with individuals or the

The above remarks apply in a lesser degree to the
