With reference to the sealed Telegraph of Your

Lordship's Despatch No. 207 of 20th June 1987 regarding  
the steps to be taken against carcinoma, you are  
detained at Zanzibar in connection with Death of Scher's  
husband, I have the honour to report that Government, under  
Section 20 of the Anti-Slavery Order (Amendment) 1986, the  
deportation to Rhodesia of two of the accused, namely Kifiso

Farah Duffe and others and, in view thereof, and  
following due consultation we are able to advise together  
with copies of the documents issued by that office  
certifying the presence of those men in Rhodesia  
as such to constitute a return to the prison and  
order of the Province.

those two men now wish to leave the Protectorate for good and I am disposed to grant their request.

With regard to the other four accused as there was no evidence obtainable against them to connect them actively with Sheikh Ali's murder, I ordered their release.

They do however yet another man, by name Ali Erdhi, suspected of complicity in the murder and also of being in communication with the other rebels by the English Adjutant Captain

Johnston, Esq., reported to my office batch No. 24 of January, Year 1900.

I have the honor to inform your Honor of the evidence against this man, which was given down by Major K. C. Patterson and Lieutenant Captain Falkland, or Justice had investigated the same, together with a certificate signed by Captain Falkland.

In opinion was of opinion that it would be advisable to deport him out of Uganda, and arrangements were accordingly made with the Acting Governor of the Island to receive him.

Qasr Mahmoud, Marti.

Mohamed Yusuf, Ali Suliman, Marti, having been duly sworn states:- About 7 months ago I was in town when HAJI Yusuf Duffe arrived with a safari. We could not get a good price there, so we went on to Nombada. We were talking together and Haji Yusuf said to me "There will be something very bad done in Kiamayu". This was before Sheikh Ali Juhar was killed.

Did you ask him what he meant by this?

Statement of evidence Against Haji Farah Duffe,

Ali Mohamed, Ali Mohamed, Herti, having been duly sworn states in this day about 7 seven months ago in Kisimayu I was passing through the town I saw Haji Farah Duffe, Ahmed Abdi, Masse Yaro and Mohamed Samater sitting close together. As I passed I heard one of them say "I won't forget Angar; until I have killed one of the three Ali Delimani". I don't know who said it. I went to Zamu soon after and when there I met Haji Farah Duffe, who said to me "There is going to be trouble in Kisimayu, I expected it before now, it is late". About 17 days after Sheikh Ali Delimani was murdered.

Statement of evidence against Ahmed Abdi, War-  
sengeli, Warsi in connection with the murder of

John Yasseef, Wardsheita, Somaliland, having been duly  
warned states: In January last I saw Ahmed Abdi in Kismayo.  
He was just going on board the "Tiba" cargo ship Montage.  
I asked him "Are you coming back?" He said "Not until I  
hear other news from Kismayo". I asked him what he meant  
he said. "I mean Ali Hamed who has got me into trouble"  
I said "Who are an Ali Hamed man" he said "I am a Somalil  
and have got other men behind me". I said "What have you  
got" He did not mention any names but said "You know tribe".

Fairly done up me this 5th day NC November 1960

Statement of evidence against Ahmed Abdi, Warsengeli,  
Hertie, in connection with the murder of Sheik Ali  
Wahab.

Haji Mahmood Tawfiq, Istar, Somali, having been duly  
sworn stated:-

before the master of Sheik Ali Wahab I met Ahmed Abdi in  
the coffee house at Hargeisa. Ahmed Abdi was talking about  
an article he had written for the East African Standard.  
He had a copy in his hand. I heard him reading this article  
to the other people in the coffee shop. I told him  
"You are wrong" he asked me "Why" I told him "You are a  
young man and should not write such things to the news-  
paper". He again asked me "Why" I said "Government may  
ask you to prove your words, can you do it?" He said "Yes"  
I said "How can you prove it?" He replied "I was told by  
the Hertie to write it" I replied "You will only get  
yourself into trouble" He said "You want to help the Ali  
bulletin, you can do so".

Another man who was present, Haid, an Istar Somali  
then said "I hear you were punished before on account of  
Ali Wahab and discharged from Government service" He  
replied "Yes, I was" I then said "I was in Kismayu at the  
time and heard about it" Haid, an Istar Somali then said  
"I know Ali Wahab, he is a good man for the Hertie" Ahmed  
Abdi then said "No, he is no good for the Hertie and I  
know the Hertie will kill him" I told Ahmed Abdi "Don't  
say those things, you are an Afsoor man and do not belong  
to the Somalis of Jubaland" He then replied. "Alright I  
don't want to talk to you". The other men were talking to  
each other about it when Ahmed Abdi jumped up and said  
"You will see what news copied by the 'Juba'". Haid then said  
"How do you know" and he replied "I know very well". A  
few days after the "Juba" arrived in Hargeisa and we heard

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Statement of evidence against Ahmed Shah, Muhammad Ali Haji, in connection with the murder of Sheikh Ali Salim.

Mohammed Salim, Ismaili, 20/10/1948 aged 20 years  
stated- About 30 days before I heard of Sheikh Ali Salim's death I was living with Ali Salim, I asked him the news from Khartoum and he said "You will hear news from tomorrow soon" I asked him what he meant and he replied.  
FATHER SHEIKH ALI SALIM OR THE KHARTOUM WILL DIE SOON" I said "What do you mean, Ali Salim alone cannot fight against the British". He replied "Don't worry, Ali Salim will die and you will hear soon" I said "You are foolish, the British cannot kill Ali Salim" He said "All right, you will hear something about the "Toba case".  
He went back to Sudan soon afterwards. About 10 days after I heard of Ali Salim's murder.

Evidence against Ali Brig. Mijertain, Omar Mahomed, Somalia.

Sheikh Mohamed Aman, Mijertain, Ali Suliman, Squali, having been duly sworn states:- When the Sub-Commissioner went out to arrest Ashgar, a mullah, I went with him. We came to Ashgar at Mandera, with about 100 men. They attacked us, and Ashgar was killed. Ali Brig was there with Ashgar. I saw him. Capt Balkeld asked myself and Sheikh Halaga to call to the people to come out and talk to him. I heard Ali-Brig say "Do not go out, kill the kaffir, kill the kaffir".

Again a month later, about 2 p.m. I was in Hafira. Ali Brig was at home and said "You see here, the Ali-Suliman, killed Ashgar, we, the dear Mahomed, will kill Sheikh Ali Hager. Either I will kill him or my tribe will".

Witness deposed:-

Q. Are you quite sure you recognized Ali Brig's voice calling out "Kill the kaffir".

A. Yes.

Q. Could you see him at the time?

A. Yes.

Ali Brig was permitted to ask the witness questions.  
Leave granted.

Q.1. When you heard my call out "kill the kaffir" what did I dress in?

A.1. You were in a black or blue shirt and had your hands behind in your hand.

Q.2. What was my headress?

A.2. You were not clean shaved, and you were wearing white turban.

Q.3. When the firing was on, was I in the house or out in the open?

A.3.

A.3. You were sitting just inside the bush, when I and  
Duallla Halaya called out, and I saw you.

Q.4. Then, according to you, I told you, we, the Gear  
yesterday, will kill Sheikh Ali Nahar, why did you not at  
once report to Government.

A.4. I reported it to Sheikh Ali Nahar, who was the  
Government adviser, I don't know if he told the Government.

The Court has no objection, though it points out it is

In evidence. Duallla Halaya, Isak, Somali, objects to being sworn  
according to Somali custom. Is accordingly sworn on the  
Koran, according to Mahomedan law. Having been duly sworn  
states:- The day before was killed, I was present at  
Hannafar with the Berkali. When the firing stopped Capt.  
Makind told me to call out to the Somalis to come out  
and talk to him. I saw Ali Brig standing close to a tree.  
Ever since that day he has always avoided me which I never  
have met him.

In questioned by Court:

Q.1. Have you known Ali Brig long?

A.1. Yes, about five years.

Q.2. Have you reason to believe him to be a man of an  
intriguing disposition?

A.2. I knew him, as a friend of Half Yarhan Duffy, and has  
recently been reported in connection with Sheikh Ali Nahar's  
murder.

Q.3. You are quite certain you saw Admiral when Admiral the day Admiral was killed.

A.3. Yes, and he was present when the smash turned Anger.

Q.4. When you saw Ali Brig at Anger did you hear him say anything and if so, what?

A.4. Yes, I heard him call out "Kill the officer".

Q.5. You are quite certain you heard Ali Brig say that?

A.5. Yes.

Q.6. Could you see him?

A.6. Yes.

Ali Brig was given permission to ask the witness questions which were granted.

Q.7. When you saw me at Anger what was I dressed in?

A.7. You had on a white cloth, two pyjamas and a shisha. There was much smoke and I could only see your white cloth.

Q.8. What was my behaviour?

A.8. I could not say.

Q.9. Then you heard me call out "Kill the officer", was I sitting down, standing up, running, walking about or what?

A.9. You were standing close to Admiral.

Q.10. During all the disturbance, how was it you recognised me?

A.10. I saw you after the fire was over, when we were talking with the smash.

Ali Brig makes leave to question the witness.  
Leave granted.

Q.1. What party children were present?

A.1. Muhi Sarah Duffi, Dr. Hassan Hamid and Dr. Ali Sharva.

Q.2. When you heard this, did you go and inform the Government?

A.2. I told Sheikh Ali Maher.

Q.3. How do you account for all the people being ready to follow this "shura"? I am not a shura?

A.3. Because they were all sensitive to the killing of Ashgar.

Q.4. We all knew you as a friend of Sheikh Ali Maher's so should we be likely to let you know our shura?

A.4. I tried but I was an Ogaden and you thought didn't matter.

Q.5. Did we decide to kill both Sheikh Ali Maher and Captain Mohamed or only one of them?

A.5. First you said both, but afterwards decided to kill Sheikh Ali Maher as it was he who was responsible for Ashgar being killed.

Q.6. When we had this shura, had the fine been paid to you?

A.6. before the fine was paid.

Q.7. How soon after this shura did you leave for the north?  
A.7. I don't know when you left.

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Sheikh Mohamed Farah, Omer Mahamed, having been duly  
sworn states:- This man, Ali Erigie, belongs to my faction.  
I remember, one day, about eighteen months ago, I was  
in my house in Timasho. Ali Erigie was there and was  
sheikh Ali Dahir. I conversed with him on this subject.  
Soon after which Ali was killed I was told from another  
and heard that Ali Erigie and eleven other men were killed  
by Ali Dahir making a attempt to kill Omer Mahamed and others  
and Abu Brgash, Police Inspector. Today here did me this  
I am an Omer Mahamed myself, and cannot be expected to  
say anything for or against this man. The Government knows  
everything.
