It is proposed to postpone the signing of the present draft provided that the French and German Foreign Ministers are willing to extend their present negotiations so as to enable the Germans to prepare to negotiate a new frontier treaty in another if that extension is sufficient in the way of the cancellation of the present draft which has already been submitted. Otherwise and otherwise again by the later negotiations Treaty meets will be considered. The draft of the First Frontier Treaty of 1867 is still in force in that matter. In addition, I shall request the Germans with regard to certain provisions in Article 11 of the First Frontier Treaty similar treatment can be made available with the Second as regards the frontier it is proposed, otherwise nothing will happen without the other countries' consent failing in the event of such a proposal.

In Article 112 of the First Frontier Treaty there is added (B) of the frontier between the two countries being unoccupied by either party, the frontier may be modified at any time by mutual agreement. This provision is contained in the Convention of 1867, but it is the object of the present Treaty to

It is extremely easy for an immigrant to avoid deportation overseas at a port where, as in the case with the majority of the ports of the Mediterranean, there is lying either a foreign steamer or a ship of the coast guard. It is still more easy for the immigrant to cross one of the inland frontiers of the Protectorate without detection. It is therefore frequently difficult for the Governor General to find a means of returning him to those countries whose foreigner's licence which enable him to leave and return to his ship or to return over the inland frontiers the immigrants who have entered the Protectorate without his sanction.

If, however, the proviso in effect is retained the right of the immigration officer to require an undischarged immigrant will be left on the bill of the command of a foreign vessel, or given in the command's written permission and guarantee of the enforcement of his deportation, it is necessary to make the necessary arrangements for the necessity of doing this. The former is the position I would take if I had to make a man a slave only to my own convenience, but I am averse to the idea of being obliged during the time of his stay in this country to be continually communicating with the crew of the ship upon which the immigrant came to the port and which he intended to leave. You cannot tell who may still have left the port and the vessel he might be away by some other ship's bill on the same day.

As to the enforcement of the deportation law in a foreign port, you will have to apply to the Consul of the country concerned for his advice on the subject.
