divert the railway from this country. They
cannot possibly know all the local uses.
Thus we have heard from the Com^r that
the General Manager has been able to give the
Treas^r a figure of £100,000, which the Treas^r
objected, because he had 60,000
unemployed.

The Railway estimate for next year shows
an estimated surplus of £2000 to £5000
on working scheme, as against an
estimated deficit of £8000 for the year.
The Treas^r are therefore beginning to get
some of their debt charges or ought to be
willing to give us a piece of it.
