With reference to the letter from the East African Syndicate dated May 19th last which was enclosed in Your Lordship's despatch No. 310 of the 11th inst. I have the honour to make the following proposals:

1. To grant the Masai a concession to Lake Obolobasi...
It is vitally necessary to the quiet and well regulated operation of their reserve by the Masai, an object in which I am supported by the recommendations of the Commissioner of Lands and the Secretary for...
