AFRICA PROTECTORATE.

My Lord,

I have the honour to recommend for Your Lordship's favourable consideration that the appointment of Mr. S. R. Hill, who has been performing the duties of Gaoler of the Nairobi prison since June 15th 1905, should be made permanent and reasonable.

Mr. Hill's work has been very well reported on by his superior officers and he is naturally hardly satisfied with the temporary nature of his post, which carries no privilege in regard to leave or pension and may be terminated at any time.

I should therefore be glad if his appointment, which is at the rate of £.180/- per annum, could be put on the same footing as those of other European subordinates on the permanent staff, and if possible made to rate from
