Sir,

I have the honor to, with reference to the appointment recommended in my letter No. 30, on 22/02/1966, to make definite recommendations, and to draft a cable, which I have well met with His Excellency's approval, with a view to transmission soon.

It is desired to ensure that he should fully use the opportunity available to him to become a member of what appointment Mr. Lomaxai is. It is also urgent in view of his present position, which he occupies in the appointment of a member of the Legislative Assembly, to have him released from his post. They have seen fit to do so in the interest of His Excellency's health, and I would be obliged if you will see him.

A further reason for this is the possibility of his being recalled to the Legislative Assembly, which can only be done by a decision for which he has been given a period of time.

With regard to the appointment of the Director of Surveyor General, and Assistant Deputy Directors of Surveyor General, they are already filled.

The above will be definitely appointed on the date mentioned. Date of appointment is 1st June, 1907.

I propose that Mr. Lloyd should be appointed as Staff Surveyor on probation for the remainder of the year. There is no doubt whatever of this gentleman's technical qualifications; but it is within His Excellency's knowledge that there was some doubt as to his character.

consider that probation for the remainder of
the current financial year should meet his case. The
appointment would be 1st August 1909.

This makes one vacancy among the Surveyor Staff
and I think it would be well to fill it as
early as possible for some time.

All these appointments should have the usual
conditions.

On the 1st August, 1909, date of appointment I
have in mind to fix the rate at £1,250., on three
years continuously expiring during the meantime.

Messrs. Mr. J. Layton and Woodruff held last year
the appointments of "Surveyor" on £1,250., on three
years' engagements.

Mr. Galtbreith held the position created by Mr. C.H.
Campbell, now Assistant Land Officer, but he did not
have an agreement.

The remaining vacancies in the interim have been
in temporary engagements.

If you can make arrangements there will be a
vacancy in December which will be available
again. It can best be filled by probationary Junior
Surveyors. I have a young man of about 21 years of age
who is physically qualified, but there is
a good prospect of their attaining sufficient technical
knowledge at the end of the year. They are
well acquainted with knowledge of the country and native language
which makes them useful. They are both hard workers.
