My Lord,

I have the honour to transmit herewith for Your Lordship's consideration a copy of a letter from the Manager of the Uganda Railway respecting the incidence of the charges in connection with the maintenance of the Zanzibar Quarantine Station.

During my recent visit to England I discussed this matter with Your Lordship's Office and gathered the impression that there would be difficulties in the way of effecting any reduction at present in the amount of contribution paid to the Zanzibar Government for the services referred to.



Your Excellency,

ZANZIBAR QUARANTINE STATION.

With reference to the last paragraph of Foreign Office despatch No. 345 of the 13th June 1904 to Sir Charles Eliot, asking for a report as to whether it will be necessary for the future to maintain the Zanzibar Island quarantine station, and if so, what proportion of the total cost of maintenance should be borne by the funds of the Uganda Railway, and your despatch of the 4th May 1906 on Mr. Cave's letter No. 8 of the 1st March 1906, listing that the general question of the Zanzibar quarantine station had your attention, will you be kind enough to inquire whether any decision has been come to regarding the discontinuance of the Railway share of the cost of upkeep of the station.

The estimate for next year will have to be compiled in a few months and as the question of providing a sum in the estimate towards the upkeep of the station has to be considered, I beg that you will kindly favour me with any decision that has been come to regarding the upkeep or otherwise of the quarantine camp.

Your Excellency will no doubt agree with me that the continuance of this charge, about £1,000 per annum, is a very unfair burden on the Railway and should be removed as early as possible.

I would ask the favour of your considering whether the whole contribution should not be borne by the Medical Department. I respectfully submit that for the Railway to bear £1,000 and the Medical £,500 is an unfair arrangement. As far as the general Protectorate Estimates go it comes to the same in the end but the Railway is the only Department run on commercial lines and which has to be judged by statistical results.

Perhaps the whole amount might be put under some special head which would perhaps be fairer.
