World's News by Cable. French Chamber.

Question of Alliances

Official Assurances.
(Reuter's Special to "East African Standard") London.
While the French Chamber was debating the foreign estimates, M. Lucien Herbet, referring to the interview of the Tsar of Russia and the Kaiser of Germany at Potsdam, said that the triple entente had been somewhat disorganised by the death of King Edward of England, which had dealt it a serious blow.

Minister Feliou in replying said that nothing had happened in Europe to modify in any degree the friendship and alliance of France. The Anglo-French entente would continue under King George as under King Edward, whose memory was ever dear to France. Their alliance with Russia, he continued, was as firm and alive to-day as ever it was, and the result of the Potsdam interview was a fresh and very solid guarantee of the general peace. They had no more reason, he said, to take umbrage at the Russian German agreement regarding the Middle East than Russia had for taking umbrage at the Franco-Turkish agreement on the Mesopotamian question.

Minister Jaurez interposing asked if Russia had informed France that the Bagdad railway would be suspended at Potsdam.

M. Feliou replied that the companies at Potsdam were the subject of negotiations which had been in progress, as everybody knew, since 1907.

M. Feliou referring particularly to Britain said their attitude was never so good as on this occasion. There is not a single question on which the two countries are not at one with each other. It was a great result to be attained, and the countries were in an ever-growing confidence in each other, and in all circumstances to make pacific relations prevail. He stated by way of conclusion that he was certain that France would be able to succeed at a time he would be pleased to see the peace restored to Europe and possessing the friendship and goodwill of Italy, Spain and Japan. The Franco-Japanese agreement was one of the greatest acts of peace in the war. He concluded that this was the best result.

Russo-German Agreement.

Turkey Takes Umbrage.

Reuter's at Constantinople states that the Russo-German agreement constitutes an encroaching subject of interest. The papers indulge in various speculations (normal) as to what action, which is considered as tantamount to the complete abandonment of the Balkan and Russian interests themselves at the expense of Persia and Turkey. This explains the general feeling.

Strike of Gas Workers.
It is reported that Sydney, New South Wales, was without gas at night owing to a strike of twelve thousand gas workers. The strike was due to the gas Company's refusal to reinstate a dismissed employee, who was secretary of the Union. The resolution of the Premier resulted in an agreement that the Secretary should be suspended during the course of an inquiry which should be made into the circumstances of dismissal, the inquiry to be made by three of the employees. 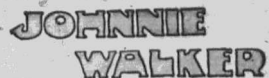

Declaration of London.

Effect on Food Imports.
(Owner's Special to "East African Standard")
London.
Mr. Osborne Buxton, one of the prime movers of the Declaration of London in its original form and of its re-issuance at the Naval Prize Bill passed last year, is to be seen with Germany, one of the provisions allowing for the capture of British food stuffs, the declaration of war, and the continuation of non-combatants into enemy territory, would give Germany the same right as the United States in the past to search for a year, and has been going on for long years. Nevertheless he did not believe that the Government with all its efforts would be able to make it pass the House of Commons.

The "Manchester Guardian" states that "our acceptance of the new rules in the Declaration of London in serious and sincere way and means the abandonment of a grand state which we have defended for a century." It is an accepted generally authoritative that the Declaration will not be ratified until it has been submitted to the Emperor.

It is reported from Sydney that Premier Fisher hopes it will be accepted at the Imperial Conference. He does not doubt the possibility of the Imperial Government supporting the Empire, but he would have been pleased if it had thought fit to take the declaration more into confidence before such a momentous change was made.

Lord Alverstone at the annual meeting of the Glasgow Shipbuilders Association stated that "our acceptance of the new rules in the Declaration of London in serious and sincere way and means the abandonment of a grand state which we have defended for a century." It is an accepted generally authoritative that the Declaration will not be ratified until it has been submitted to the Emperor.

World's News by Cable.

Sleeping Sickness Conference.

Notable Decisions.

(Reader's Special to "East African Standard") London. The Sleeping Sickness Conference has decided that in cases of new railway extension it is essential that the routes to be followed by the line should be inspected for the presence of paludic (the species of insect fly which transmits the disease); that maps of the dy areas should be prepared, the rail ways to cross these areas where they are narrow; that no buildings should be erected or stopping places made in these areas while during construction the spaces of a hundred yards should be cleared on either side and larger clearings should be made near rivers and bridges; also that openings in railway carriage should be covered with fly proof gauze. It recommends further that as the fly possibly does not exist South of the Zambesi that from the Congo watershed the work on the Rhodesian-Katanga railway be done in two sections so as to avoid the possibility of carrying the fly.

Duty on Whisky.

Question of Bounty to British Distillers.

The United States treasury has decided to impose a countervailing duty of 4 1/2% on Irish and Scotch whisky owing to the failure of their negotiators with the British to complete the allowance of 3d. granted to exporters, which America regards as a bounty. British distillers deny that there is any bounty, the amount allowed a merely one concession for the additional spirit involved owing to the regulations connected with the rectification of spirits. In the West Indies and Canada are placed at the action taken by the States because their old standing contract was disadvantageous compared with the British.

Gold Diggings.

Austro-Hungarian Budget

Large Expenditure on Armaments.

The Austro-Hungarian budget for 1911 shows an increase of twenty-five million kronen, chiefly for the army, besides extraordinary credits for the army and navy including fifty-five millions for the construction of a dreadnought, three cruisers, twelve torpedo boats and six submarines. The total cost of these is placed at 312 millions to be distributed over six years.

It is reported in connection with the navy estimates points out that the increase in the navy is due to the necessity of maintaining an open seaway for Austrian commerce and for the protection of her coast line, the important source of which is increased by the destruction of Bosnia.

Health of the British Army.

The Hittobook on the health of the army for 1910 shows a marked improvement. There were 419 deaths compared with 478 per thousand in 1908 and 905 in 1906. Of constantly sick there were 29,250 compared with 32,225 in 1908 and 40,428 in 1906.

Anti-Allen Bill in America.

The Washington Government has introduced a bill to the Senate which makes the shipping companies responsible for the introduction of alien and imposes heavy penalties for the unlawful landing of them, even including the seizure of vessels.
