World's News by Cable.

Libel on the King. Trial of Mylius.

Intense Public Interest. Sentence of Twelve Months' Imprisonment.

(Reuter's Special to "E. A. Standard," London.)

The Mylius Case, in which Edward F. Mylius is charged with libelling His Majesty in his paper the "Liberator" published in Paris, was opened amidst intense public interest. There was a great array of counsel at the Court.

The defendant at the outset demanded the attendance of the King but the Chief Justice replied, "His Majesty cannot be summoned here."

Sir Rufus Isaacs, Solicitor-General, speaking with great deliberation, said that this was a libel attacking His Majesty's honour, intended to reflect on the King and so to lower him in the esteem and respect of all right-minded citizens. He emphasized that no complaint was made against the republican sentiment of the defendant. The prosecution was brought because the accused had asserted that the King's marriage with the Queen was a sham, a sordid and heinous marriage and an offence against the church. The defendant had said that the King on the year 1890 while at Malta had married the daughter of Admiral Seymour, and further that when Prince George became heir to the throne in 1912, he foolishly abandoned the lady and marrying in order to marry Princess Mary.

The charges were printed in three articles in which expressions such as, "sainted matrimony with the daughter of the president of the Anglican Church" and other most offensive phrases were used. Sir Rufus Isaacs argued the case deftly with the utmost solemnity that the whole story from beginning to end was a tissue of untruths.

Sir Rufus Isaacs called upon Admiral Seymour who testified that he had two daughters, the elder one was married to Captain Napier in 1899 and the younger one was never married. She had never once spoken to the King who was not at Malta at all when his daughters were there. Mrs. Napier never spoke to His Majesty until 1902.

Mrs. Napier and her three brothers testified in corroboration of her father.

Sir Arthur Bigge gave evidence of writing in August 1910 authorizing the extradition of those having been any marriage arrangements. The defendant asked on questions whatever and was sentenced to twelve months' imprisonment.

The Chief Justice, impressively addressing the defendant, said that every honourable man with shame from the use of such weapons against anyone, and especially against the King to whom the Empire was devotedly attached. The sentence, he concluded, was wholly inadequate to the offence.

After the sentence had been passed on the accused, Sir Rufus Isaacs read a letter from the King. He said he had been advised by His Majesty to state publicly that he never went through any ceremony of marriage except with the Queen and he had not been advised that it was unconstitutional.
