To the Editor, "E.A. Standard". Sir.—With reference to "Geodetic Survey" and "Surveyors' Instruments"—perhaps he would enlighten us on the following point? We understand that the bricks used do not possess the necessary characteristics of size and weight, etc., for a good brick. I reiterate that the taxpayers have not been asked to contribute and demand that this should be done.

BRANDS ESSENTIAL

SYSTEMATIC RAIDING

Instances were afforded of the raids and systematic raids conducted monotonously upon the docks and surrounding areas. It is evident that the farmers in certain areas

It is evident that much of the present position has been brought about by the want of knowledge of the laws of the land, and especially of the law relating to the branding of sheep and cattle, and their protection.

LEGISLATION REQUIRED.

The conclusion we have drawn is that immediately, to be effective, legislation is required, comprising acts on the subjects of branding, and large stock and smaller stock, and sheep and cattle, and protection against depredation, and segregation for the benefit of the Government and the farmer.

Mr. Gethin states that "the Government along the borders of the country should be engaged in the protection of the farms and the interests of the Bantu population." We are not in agreement with this, and believe that the harsher the legislation, the greater will be the tendency to oppose and resist, and to obstruct the demands of the country, demanded a greater number.

Promisingly, many cases occur of branding, and in some instances it is safe to assume that the cattle are to be confiscated on proceeding to the court. 
