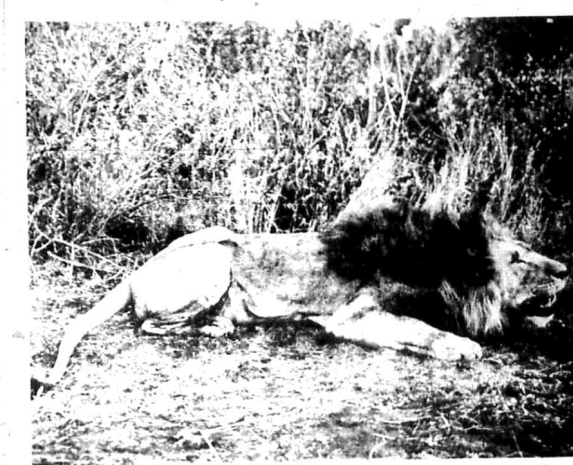

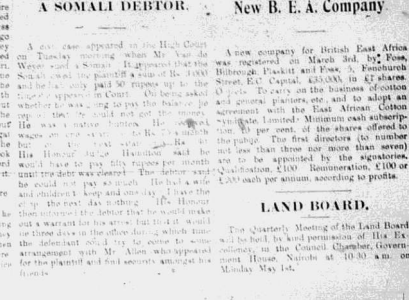

Dipping 150,000 Sheep. The operation of dipping the mountain sheep is being carried out by order of the Board of Agriculture as a preventive of disease.

Tilling Soil with Dynamite. Probably no stranger use for dynamite has been devised than the exhibition of place of the plough for the tilling of clay land. It is being put to work on a considerable experimental scale in Kansas, U. S. A. The first experiment at Spearman consisted of the exploding of a stick of dynamite in the furrow of a plough, and the resultant cut showed the benefit of the treatment. The next experiment was the dragging of an acre of field by dynamite. The cartridges were placed 2 ft apart in rows, and exploded by means of a fuse leading to the edge of the field. The explosion followed the men in a steady race that was dashed into the air, and covered the men from head to foot in dust and soil. The men were quite unharmed and the soil was distributed to a depth of four or five feet, it is said to be returned to its former condition by the use of a roller.

The House of Commons has resumed its sittings. Mr. Macarthur in reply to a question stated that H. M. S. "Shawarwa" had sailed from San Quintin, Mexico, on April 15 at the request of British and American officials to prevent their lives and property in Mexico officials being absent. They had remained on board until twenty-four hours.

Mr. Churchill introduced the "Prevention of Alien Crimes Bill." It said he had not intended to introduce it until the Government had taken steps to prevent the entry of alien crime. He proposed to insert the present procedure with regard to deportation. Whenever the Court does not recommend the expulsion of a convicted alien the Court will be asked to furnish reasons why the return of an expelled alien should be regarded as a serious offence. It was proposed to increase the penalties therefor and it is proposed to set a maximum for good behavior from one to three years. In default of sentence, if the alien should be a genuine political refugee, he would not suffer. Mr. Churchill announced that a "Patriot Bill" would also be introduced stipulating that an alien must obtain a special permission to enter a port. For the purpose of this Bill the power would be enlarged to include all ports.

The House resumed discussion on the Veto Bill. Mr. Agnew, moving the further application of the Veto Bill, stated that it would enable them to send the Veto Bill to the House of Lords and to say:

Mr. Chamberlain said that the order to the President of the United States to grant a permit to enter a port. For the purpose of this Bill the power would be enlarged to include all ports.

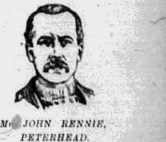
