MOTORING TOPICS

ELECTRICAL TROUBLE.

Common Faults, Detection and Repair.

START WITH THE BATTERY.

In general, the troubles of motor, car starting and lighting installations, starting and stopping, are caused under the following half-dozen headings: (1) Battery trouble, (2) starting circuit trouble, (3) generator trouble, (4) starting circuit trouble, (5) motor trouble, and (6) switch trouble. Trouble in starting and lighting systems should be located by a process of elimination. But such tests begin at the proper end. In other words, always begin at the battery and work along the wiring towards the generator or motor, never in the reverse direction. The present-day starting battery is a high development of the battery maker's art, but it still remains the proper starting point for tracing electrical trouble.

CAUTIONARY TESTS.

The best for battery condition is to test and to verify make. The best and most reliable way is to read the specific gravity of the cells with a battery hydrometer system. A fully charged battery has a specific gravity of 1.280 to 1.300. A battery reading over 1.200 in all or in one or two half-cells, and is capable of giving satisfactory service.

A battery reading below 1.200 is less than half-charge, and is in need of some charging, which if the gravity has dropped to 1.100 the battery is "dry-down" and should be fully charged immediately.

If the battery is in good condition, next examine the connections. These should be tight and clean, and lightly greased to prevent corrosion. Excessive leakage material which is not a good electrical conductor, and therefore makes a high-resistance connection.

If the battery occasionally refuses to start charged in spite of recharging (once an outside source) it should be replaced temporarily by another battery known to be in good condition. If this causes the trouble the original battery should be sent to a battery service station to be put in proper shape. If the cause of the battery is continually dry,

charged, the indication is that more current is being taken out by light-sparking, starting and stopping, by short-circuits, excessive idling, or by the discharge current in the battery when the car is in use. If the dashboard ammeter is in good condition, and still shows a short circuit or a worn-out battery.

FAULTS IN WIRING.

The most common cause of not always two sets of wiring, run from the battery to the motor, the generator, the lights and generator. One goes to the lights and generator, the other goes to the starting motor—in use only at the time of starting.

Trouble in the lighting circuits are normally due to the following causes: open circuits, loose connections, and short circuits. The most common causes of open circuits are loose connections, faulty lamp sockets and connections, wire clean and fuses. If all lamps fail to light, the trouble is in wiring common to all, and all lamps rarely burn out at the same time. Usually the trouble will be found in a loose connection or in a wire wire between the switch and battery or in the contacts of the switch.

If only one lamp or the lamps on only one circuit fail to light, the trouble is in the wiring of that circuit only. Examine each bulb with another circuit, which lights properly, to locate whether the fault is in the lamp or in the wiring. In the same way, if the battery on the switch box will tell if the fuse is blown. If all the lamps and generator connections should be tested to see if they are tight.

OPENING SHORT CIRCUITS.

To determine whether or not there is a short circuit in the motor wiring system, make a substitute ammeter test by disconnecting one terminal from the battery and the other from the motor. A small capacity ammeter should not be used for testing the starting circuit, as this will burn out. If the motor shows current flowing when connected in series with the battery, and with everything switched off there is a "short" in the system.

To locate this begin by leaving connections farther away from the battery. When the motor ceases to indicate, the "short" will be found between the battery and the breaker and the wire leads are protected. The dashboard ammeter will indicate discharge when all lights are open. If there is a short circuit between it and the battery, it will not indicate, however the "short" is between it and the lamp. If the ammeter needle indicates

at the extreme end of the discharge scale as soon as the battery is re-connected and the wiring is disconnected, the contact of the magnetic cut-out is short-circuiting and the battery is discharging into the coil.

The importance of relying only on ammeter readings when the car is in good condition and properly connected, is generally overlooked. Time and energy may be wasted standing around the car, or trouble of the generator or the dash indicator, or not charging current of the ammeter. Such being the case, it is advisable, when in doubt, to have the motor checked by being connected with a reliable instrument, which can be used conveniently by taking the car to electrical repairers.

GENERATOR COMPLAINTS.

The two most common generator complaints are inability to generate direct current and the sudden failure to generate any current at all. If a generator is apparently a fault in that it fails to deliver more charging current is generally the commutator and brushes should be examined to see that the latter is clean and in good condition and that the latter are making good contact.

Commutators should be kept free from rust and grease. They should be cleaned with a dry cloth, and any dirt comes from brushes removed. No oil should be used, as the brushes contain sufficient graphite for lubrication purposes.

Brushes should not fit in their holders, but should be free to move in them. The contact of the brushes should be in good condition, and firmly connected to the terminals. Brushes should be replaced in four equal pairs which wear down evenly and have a good bearing over the entire contact surface. They should be "sanded" in. This may be done by placing a strip of No. 00 sandpaper under the brush, and round the commutator with the brush.

By working the paper backwards and forwards a good bearing will be obtained quickly. The brushes of both the generator, and motor should be treated in the same way. Roughness of either brushes or commutator or both is often remedied by spraying. Commutators should be cleaned in the same way. Other generator troubles which are not caused by the brush generated are of infrequent occurrence and are usually beyond the skill of the ordinary driver to remedy. They have been covered by electrical repairers. "Overhauling" the

insulation when this has become slack with the surface of the copper is a secondary matter. Bearings may have worn loose, and the brush holder may no longer hold in absolute contact to the coil. This means that the radial gap between poles and commutator is not uniform all over the bottom and top lugs at the coil. This may be remedied with structure and field short, screws, in best adjustment by experts.

STARTING DEVICES.

When has been sold alone regarding motor trouble, and motor trouble will be applied to a weak battery or poor wiring connections between battery and motor. The wiring of a starting motor is usually stout, and made up with cable of very generous dimensions. Care should be taken that all connections are kept tight and free from corrosion.

There are two types of motor drive—automatic and non-automatic. With the more common automatic drive a screw thread on the motor shaft serves the piston rod, with the flyball, both when the switch is closed, and the engine opens the piston rod again when the flyball starts up under engine power.

With this system a single piston-rod starting action is used. This is usually of substantial construction and not very liable to derangement. It is so simple that in case of failure it can easily be opened up and put in proper adjustment. The motor's speed comes together so as to have a generous cushioning effect, and the spring is not depressed, and the action should be strong enough to break the piston rod, promptly when pressure is released.

If the engine does not start promptly when the starting switch is depressed, the trouble may be with the drive. The screw threads may be checked and should be treated with paraffin.

If the engine sometimes starts satisfactorily, and sometimes not, the trouble is usually traceable to faulty connections. If the engine fails to turn over in cold weather, this may be due either to the engine oil being too pasty or the capacity of the battery being too low. It may be, to the low temperature—this is a condition of the two causes. In such cases it is well to get out the starting handle and crank the engine by hand. Probably the momentary effort called for will promote a sufficiently high temperature, and the battery that will result in sufficient energy in expediting on this important item of the electrical equipment.

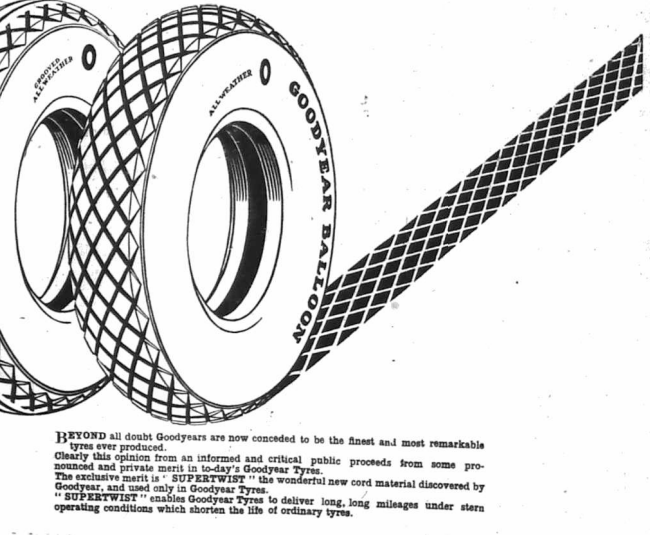

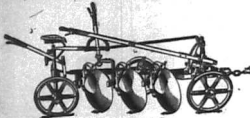

AN S.O.S. FROM HOME.

Funds Needed to Save Historic Monument.

DURHAM CASTLE.

One of the finest and one of the most historically interesting of England's ancient monuments is Durham Castle which stands on one of the seven hills of Durham. City near neighbour to the more renowned Cathedral. The two together make a majestic spectacle never to be forgotten. For centuries the Prince Bishops of Durham resided in the Castle where they exercised a regal hospitality, although they preferred to reside in the more domestic atmosphere of their palaces at Bishop Auckland. In 1828 Bishop Van Mildert handed over the Castle to be the home of University College ensuring for himself and his successors use of some rooms only.

It may surprise those overseas to whom the County of Durham is dear to know that the Castle quite recently was nearly lost. The foundations were once again threatened and only Providence prevented

of the whole magnificent fabric from collapsing into the River Wear. In order to save the historic pile it was necessary to start immediately extensive work involving the putting in of a new foundation which with the existing base of the Castle with the solid rock for beneath. For the completion of this work £35,000 is required. Of this so far £10,000 has been raised, less claim the amount so far spent on the work of repair.

In the course of a letter to the Editor of the Standard, Mr. Selwyn Watson writes: "I have felt that there may be Durham folk among your readers who may like to know what is being done to save the Castle. I wonder if I could ask you to tell about it in your columns. None of us would wish for a single moment to ask for money which should be given to local causes and charities, but how lovely it would be if some among your readers could through the medium of your paper gifts to Durham Castle of generous nature and helped to fulfil the suggestion made by me which I do hope you may be able to do what this letter asks. I have been from your readers—should be sent to the Right Hon. the Earl of Durham, Lambton Castle, Fife House, County Durham, England who is the Lord Lieutenant of the County and has deeply interested himself in the Castle aspect. In connection with the proposal

The Lord Bishop of Durham (the Hon. Henry Benson) has written a most interesting history of the Castle. In the course of this he writes: "The cost of the great building is a heavy burden on the few wealthy persons of the University and the great expenditure which was necessarily incurred if Durham Castle is to be preserved from destruction, is a further burden beyond the power of the University to provide. I cannot do more than therefore recommend, partly pool of this majestic building and acknowledge the obligation to maintain one of the noblest of England's historical monuments. It will gladly and quickly contribute the money needed for its preservation."

THE MOTOR PIONEERS.

Men Who Started a Great Industry.

THE EARLY DAYS.

Flourishing in any direction it is usually a haphazard task. Of the thousands who joined in the great rush in California in 1849, history records only a few half-dozen who were rewarded in a big and permanent way for those who came after them.

Quite different, however, has been the experience of those who have possessed three decades, and more, of widespread that even today the industry is filled with big, and hearty specimens of men who rank as its product.

Triple-Sealed Engine.

EXCLUDING DIRT FROM OIL AND FUEL.

The greatest enemy of the modern motor car engine is dirt. This may enter the engine in a direct way—through the carburetor, the oil, or the fuel. It is known as triple-sealed—that is, every possible penetration is taken to exclude dirt from the moving parts. This triple-sealing consists of an air cleaner, an oil strainer and a petrol filter.

The air cleaner is used to insure clean air to the carburetor, inasmuch as the carburetor is connected with the pistons, cylinders, bearings and governor in general. Much of the sediment that is always present in the fuel, by getting on it due to dirt finding its way into the engine through the

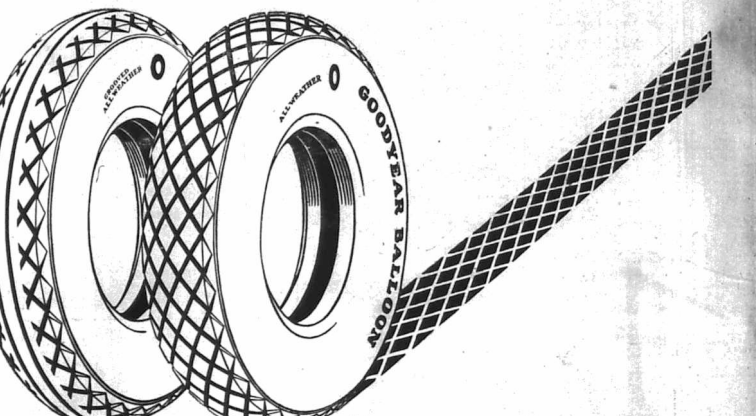

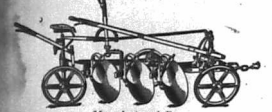

DISTRICT NOTES.
Mombasa.
 A REVIEW BY THE DEPARTMENT SECRETARY.

In an address at the end of the month of the District Commissioner, Mr. Madson mentioned the Malindi branch on having successfully passed through the trials which the preservation involves. He said: "I am very glad to have this opportunity of expressing on behalf of the Government my thanks to you and to all the Arab staff for the help and co-operation which you and your good advice I have always found so valuable. I have always found you very helpful during my tour of the island."

I have been able to address the interest of the people of the Coast. I have been able to do so. I am also certain that you will render the same unstinted aid to my successor and his staff. Mr. Madson is not a stranger among you, he knows you as well as I know he has your interests at heart. So far as the past year is concerned I think we can congratulate ourselves on a fairly prosperous and successful year, and the experience we have had in the past year has been such that we have turned the corner for the island. The island has fairly well fulfilled. The import and export statistics reveal a very considerable amount in the volume of trade at all parts on the Coast. As regards commerce, I think we can say we have made very little progress indeed. The Government has been unable to open up trading centres and to send produce by motor cars to the interior. All I think one of our dreams of the year is within sight of realization, and the opening of the motor tracks will enable us to go from Mombasa to Nairobi. I hope that we shall very shortly see the land connected up with the mainland. I expect great things from the road, and for the realization of the work we owe a great deal to the efforts of the local for the island.

With regard to agriculture and industries a great deal of progress has been made. Our local agricultural experience Mr. Bailey has been very busy. Preservation schemes have been made and better methods in agriculture, especially in the district of Malindi and Malindi. If the results prove successful, it will be a great step in the right direction. In the further step in the right direction has been the appointment of a veterinary officer for the Coast. He has been very busy since his arrival and in co-operation with the administrative staff in taking the necessary preliminary steps to establish a veterinary camp at Malindi. This camp should be ready by the end of the month.

EDUCATION.
 I wish we were in a better position to show more improvements in education. Certain provisions have been made to the effect that the Government should also afford some assistance in the form of a school at Malindi, but there is no such school at present. I have a great deal to do and I hope that during this year the school on the island will get busy and will reward many proposals for the advancement of the Coast.

So far as medical facilities are concerned I regret to say that we have not made much advance. Provision has been made for medical officers outside Mombasa, but the officers are conspicuous by their absence. I am well hopeful that in the near future, we shall see hospitals and dispensaries built along the Coast and that medical officers will be found for them. I can only say that the local native council have done their best in carrying considerable sums for this end and it remains for the Government to do the rest. I have now said sufficient of your time and will conclude by again congratulating you and wishing you a prosperous and happy year.

THE LALWAIS' REPLY.
 In the course of his reply, the Hon'ble Sheikh Ali bin Salim Al-Lawais said that he had very little acquaintance of the situation of the district. He said that it was only their duty to help the Government in the way in which they could and indicated that the Arab community would certainly continue to give their services when Mr. Madson had departed. The Hon'ble Sheikh Mr. Madson is an old officer on the Coast and one whom we have known for many years ago. Persons referred to was made by the Lalwa's communications on the Coast. He found that further delay in undertaking the road from Malindi to Lamu was dangerous on account of the possible pretensions of the British in these parts. He said: "The need for a road to Lamu was not put very strongly before Government for many years ago. Several officers were interested themselves in the need of the matter very much. I do not think that slavery is definitely going on in this country. I have no doubt that it is going on, but it is only a few years since it was suppressed and the region between Malindi and Lamu is very wild and deserted and it would be quite possible for slavery to be going on there and no one would know anything about it. For a long time we have visited this part of the country or at least I have mentioned this to Government in order to show that it is in this country. I have no doubt that Mr. Madson is a very good officer and I know he will do his best for the Coast by the way. I have great confidence in him. I know he will be able to influence the Government for the benefit of the Coast."
