TRAGEDIES OF THE ROYAL AIR FORCE.

Terrible Accident at Home Aerodrome.

[FROM OUR LONDON CORRESPONDENT.]

London, April 15. Air happenings have proportionately to some extent attracted most notice this week.

A Vickers-Vimy bomber piloted by Flying Officer Lacey and carrying also three aeroplanes, was descending after parachute practice at Hendon Aerodrome five miles north of London when it came in collision about 100 feet from the ground, with an Aeroplane piloted by Flying Officer Scott, which was rising. The two machines fell together and burst into flames. The bomb was so terrific that any attempt at rescue was impossible. The flying officers and aeroplanes killed were Flying Officer Charles Victor Lacey and 30 of his crew, Scotland, India, Flying Officer William Scott, age 40, of Wellington Street, Nottingham.

**THE FUTURE OF KENYA COLONY.**  
 Great Confederacy of States 30 years hence.

**LORD CRANWORTH'S VISION.**  
 Lord Cranworth, speaking at the Kenya Club, in a paper read before the British Indian Association recently said the "vision" was to have the end of the last of the century, but that the end of the century, taking seven years to cover the 500 to be done. He said the time had not yet come to do the work, but he said now we had had more than 30 years of administration of the country and the achievement as it stood today was one of which our country had every reason to be proud.

The natives had been treated with consideration. The position of the Indian, however, had been throughout unimpaired and of dignity. In the Highlands had followed just as on the coast he succeeded. British capital, as small shop keepers and small industrialists, had made a considerable share in the development of the colony, which, in turn, had done much for their property. A considerable portion of the present land, was open to those for settlement, but they had not taken advantage of the opportunity and remained in the country, which first attracted them.

To the white population had been allotted considerable areas for their exclusive settlement in the high, healthy, and fertile only fertile valley land. The pioneers had considerable difficulties to face, but their numbers had grown from 500 twenty years ago to 80,000 today. The main agricultural industries were now developed and remained in the country to the hand worker.

Dealing with the future, Lord Cranworth said that it was doubtful whether in another 20 years would see a white population of more than 100,000 miles of country, situated in unexpected places. Any's future was bound up with that of her neighbours—Uganda, Tanganyika, and Nyasaland, certainly Northern Rhodesia, Uganda

and the Swazis probably. But in view of the fact that the population of the whole population is always to be engaged by the progress of nature, however slow, and that applied especially to the Highlands of Kenya where the people of our own race had been and should be in the face of every difficulty. That heritage was their own and should never be taken from them. Large portions of these spacious territories were suitable for white settlement.

He intended to handle in 30 years, into a great confederacy of states, or a confederated whole, but possible in the progress while the time was concerning a high standard of life and wellbeing in the country, but not even that had been done.

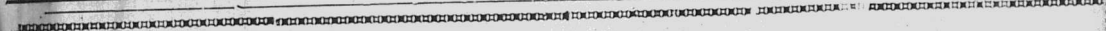

**THE COLONIAL MEDICAL SERVICE.**

Action to Safeguard Rights of Officers.

STILL SOME OBSTACLES.

The following is taken from the Colonial Medical Service Journal:

Since the meeting of the Conference in East Africa last November, the British Medical Association has been taking the Colonial Office to safeguard the rights of the officers concerned at every point where they have been threatened under the new regulations. The article of the Council of the Society in the matter was determined by the order by its Council to serve a notice on the Secretary of State for the Colonies, in the name of the Council, a striking indication of that principle, and according to the Important Notice which appeared in the first issue of the Journal of January 9th '26, now issued.

It is the more unfortunate that other cases of grave importance to the Service concerned are included in the programme and to the public should have been raised in the course of conversations between the Colonial Office and the

Association, and are still continued. Until they are disposed of we cannot recommend this form of medical practice as offering the prospect of a satisfactory career in the fullest sense of the word. We hope to announce the removal of all remaining obstacles to its recruitment before its general effectivity has in any way suffered from the present unsatisfactory state of affairs.
