MAILS FROM MOMBASA TO LONDON IN 15 DAYS!

SPLENDID RUN OF THE PRINCE ROYAL.

In a recent issue we drew attention to the record run of the Prince Royal from Mombasa to Aden in less than five days. This was gathered from letters of passengers from Aden. We are now able to show by an abstract from the log of the ship that the Prince Royal actually did the journey from Mombasa to Naples in thirteen days, thus landing mails in London fifteen days after leaving Mombasa! This is indeed a record of which the D. O. A. L. should be proud.

MOTORS IN EAST AFRICA.

MR. GEO. WILSON, OF MAKES A STATE.

The Deputy Commissioner for Uganda, Mr. Geo. Wilson, C.B., who returned from England by the Grosvenor on Monday, has had, as we had hoped, brought his motor with him, but we hear that it follows by the next boat. The car which Mr. Wilson has bought is a De Dion-Bouton of six horse power, and we understand that Mr. Wilson has already had a two months' tour in it through England.

Apparently the Deputy-Commissioner heard, while in England, of a man who could arrange the car with two others—one for petrol and one for paraffin—and left it behind to be fitted.

The advantages of a motor car on such excellent roads as they have in Uganda cannot be overestimated. Take for instance an outstation, say a hundred miles from headquarters. After interminable correspondence it is found necessary to visit the station and, with no railway in existence, the seven days' march has to be faced.

Leaving the inconvenience and hardships of the march out of the question, the time consumed is absolutely wasted, seeing the distance could easily be covered in a day by a motor car.

On such roads as they have in Uganda, every District Officer should be provided with a motor bicycle, and we trust that Mr. Wilson's experiment will be so successful that this will be the result.

### The Latest Cables.

**London, Nov. 7.**—A deplorable condition of affairs in London, Liverpool, and Marseilles yesterday prompted a minister for the Colonies to bring the Government to take measures to protect British commercial interests in Morocco against encroachment by any foreign power.

**London, Nov. 7.**—The American State Department has received a telegram from Panama formerly announcing the establishment of the new Government.

**London, Nov. 7.**—The Colombian Federal troops have withdrawn, leaving the Indians in the hands of the revolutionists.

**London, Nov. 7.**—Several New York papers are vigorously assailing Mr. Roosevelt's meeting at and even indirectly supporting the revolutionists.

**London, Nov. 7.**—It is officially announced that Mr. Balfour, after consulting with Mr. Arnold Forster, has appointed Viscount Fisher, Admiral Fisher, and Sir George Clarke (Governor of Victoria) a Committee to advise the Government regarding the creation of a board for the administrative business of the West Africa, and to ascertain what the nature of this will be.

**London, Nov. 7.**—A mountain battery and the bulk of all available troops have left Wauchope for Warabul. The latter place is in the mountains; a month's march from the base of the Cape.

**London, Nov. 7.**—The United States have recognized the new Government in Panama.

**London, Nov. 9.**—The "Times" states that M. Delcasse has indicated the Cabinet and the Council that pacific prospects predominate at present matters in the Far East.

**London, Nov. 9.**—The official report of Col. Bisco regarding Sleeping Sickness shows that it is due to a species of the insect by which all human beings, and is not confined to well defined areas. This appears to require any apprehensions that the disease is spreading throughout Africa would thereby reach the East.

**London, Nov. 9.**—Mr. Hill has issued a statement defending the strict restriction of Panama in accordance with justice and equity as being the only reasonable course, and a view to the fact of the rights to control the isthmian canal, and the Treaty with New Grenada in 1846. 
