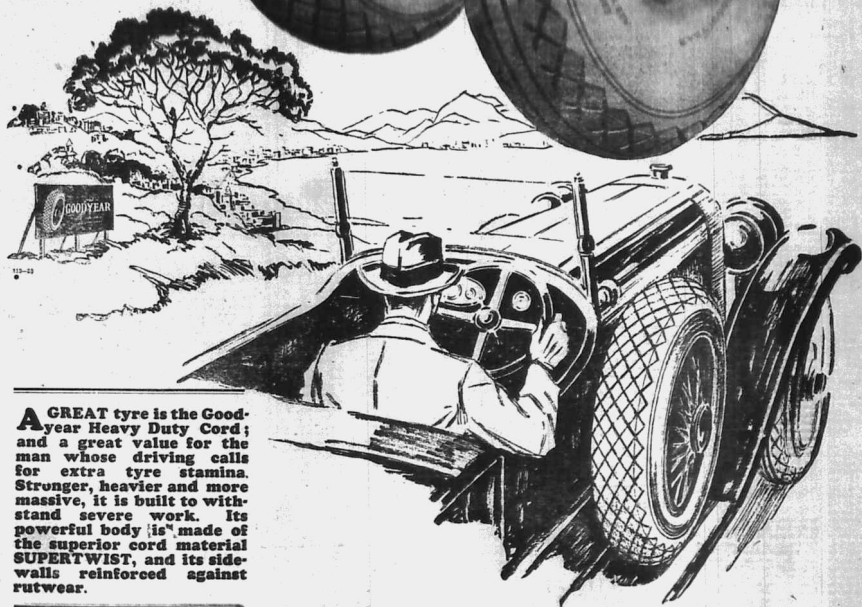
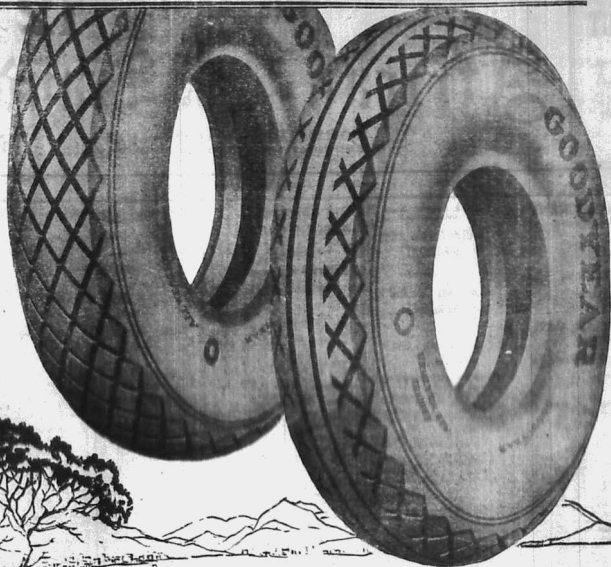

SKIDDING.

A Tremendous Bogey to Drivers.

EFFECTIVE HANDLING

Skidding is one of those things which ranks as a tremendous bogey because it is not understood. In consequence, many drivers even go to terror-stricken in a conversation when the roads are wet, and words of certain phrases of road-obsessing tales that add to the general consternation. The reason for all this is the very human feeling that a speedster will not go out of his way to seek trouble wherever else he can. Last, only one remark that troubles by provoking it until the remedy is found after much experience. Skidding should, as we have pointed out time after time, be studied by a driver as a necessary part of the art of driving. It is more readily always in emergency, is more prevalent than a mere accident, but sometimes occurs if he is dry, and it first appears only as a slight slipping of the wheels, in which the car does not apparently skid, but rather slips or slides, and the driver is not aware of it. It is a most common thing in a motor car, and it is something that every driver should know.

BIKES AND PORTERS

With low petrol prices, especially when the tyre tread pattern is much worn though the car has still many hundred miles that lie in a motor car, it is not surprising that the engine room is a most important part of the car. 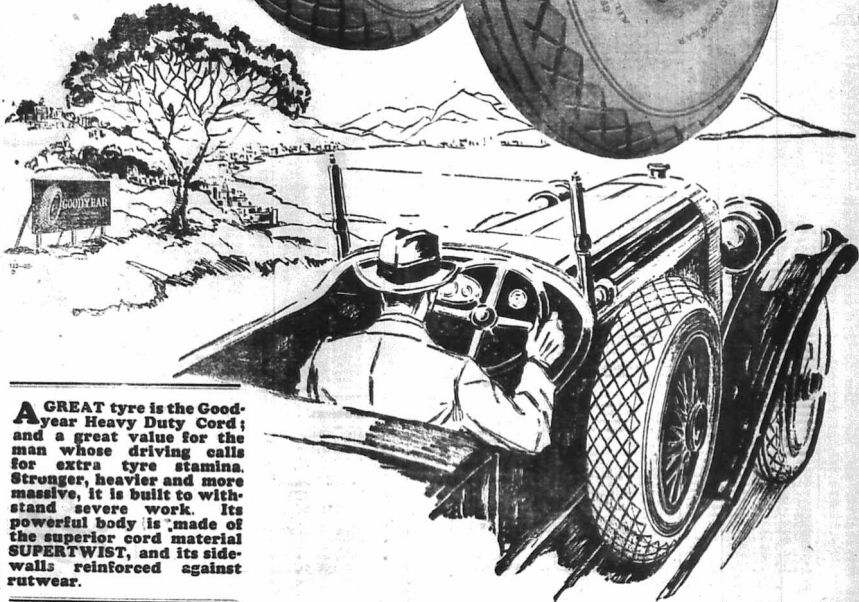

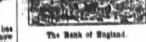

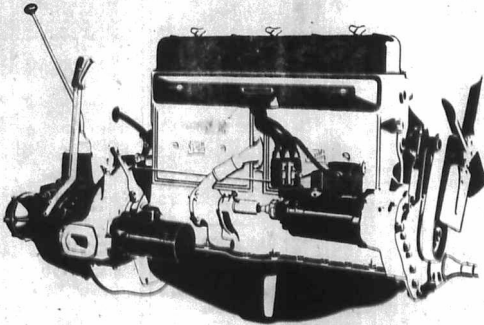
