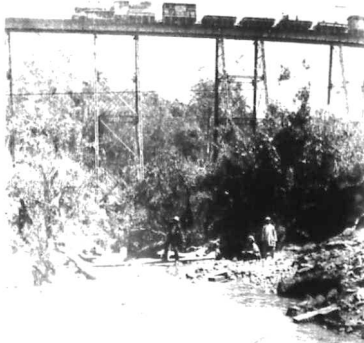

NOTES.

King and Two Bishops End-Game. This is the most difficult of the end games we have yet discussed. There is a constant danger of losing one of your B's and Stalemate is very easy for Black to get. Here mate is only possible to force in a corner square. Black must first be forced against the side corner, and then mated. He will certainly draw unless you know the ending perfectly.

The two B's are to drive the unpassable line, the K restrain the enemy against the side, between this line and the corner of the board. Then one bishop "rolls over" the other and mates in the corner square or the one cast to it. Check very seldom until mate and also the K will cross the B's line and cut into the open again. Mate is usual under 35 moves from any position.
