London, May 30.

The papers report Ben Tillet is saying yesterday evening that now he does not intend to call either a national or international strike and the general belief is that the trouble is subsiding.

The "Daily News" understands that the Government will insist on the men renouncing immediately that it will establish a Joint Board of Arbitration to prevent stoppages in the future.

Dockers Strike

CLERKS AS LABOURERS
TROUBLE IN SOUTHAMPTON

(Special to "E. A. Standard.")
London, June 6.

Three thousand two hundred workmen were working at the docks on Saturday. There are for a greater number of men working today. Hundreds of men are waiting for the obvious labourer to the black coat and unemployed clerk assembled in a long queue at Leadenhall Street outside the Port of London Authority buildings which are engaging nine hundred workmen at the unloading of ships. In the Indian and West India docks the crews of the ships are unloading the cargo.

A dock manager has described the men as sleeping loafs, but the Port Authority has already secured thousands of workmen; they have officially announced that they have secured 5,500 men and 2,000 permanently. One Company who wanted to work has not received applications from 1,500.

The masters have not to consider a reply to the conciliation proposal. The Southampton dockers have threatened a general strike on the 10th inst. in case of an increase in wages and their employers have refused it in view of last year's concessions to the men.

REJOICING AT COLLAPSE.

LEADERS OVERTHROW THE MARK
London, June 6.

Several of the papers publish editorials wherein they rejoice at the apparent collapse of the movement. This is the first recent great strike when the strikers have not been able to spend a week.

The strikers in general declare that the leaders have diverted the mark by dragging into the lightness of the general case.

GRAVE-RIDING RUMOUR

(Special to "N. A. Standard.") Paris, June 4.—General Lytton says that a column of 300 men was ordered to march on the night of the 29th of May to the north side of the city. A meeting of the Nairobi Municipal Committee was held in the Town Chambers on Tuesday afternoon, when there were present Messrs. B. Cooper, Engineer U.R., H. D. Dennis, Lauchs-Hampson, Barrister, Auditor R. C. Bayliss, Hon. T. A. Wood, D. B. Eaton, Dr. Ribeiro and Mr. A. Walcott, Town Clerk. The Hon. Mr. Wood presided.

The Chairman called attention to the fact that the new arrangements would clear the road between the railway station and the goods shed. He suggested that a path, not vehicular traffic, should be kept open between the station and goods shed. This was agreed to and the Town Clerk was asked to communicate to the effect with the Traffic Manager.

RICKSHAW STANDS.

ROAD CONSTRUCTION.

A motion was put before the Committee for the resuming of a motion passed at the last meeting regarding the making of Township roads in view of a communication from the Director of Public Works that £1,000 would be used for roads in Nairobi, £400 for new work and £600 for maintenance of old roads.

Mr. Bayliss thought the sum of £400 for new roads was ridiculous.

Mr. Boston suggested the immediate construction of Hardinge street for heavy traffic between Station and Sixth Avenue.

Mr. Cooper stated they had already recommended the pressing necessity of constructing Hardinge street.

It was finally proposed to recommend that the southern end of Hardinge-street from Sixth-avenue to the northern end of the middle line between Hardinge-street and Government-road be constructed.

It was decided not to recommend Motion B of last meeting but to furnish a further recommendation in July of new roads to be constructed.

It was finally decided that the conditions should be a fence or building covering the plot as the option of the occupier, and that the fencing or building should be completed within 18 months or the lease might be forfeited or otherwise a fine might be imposed.

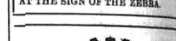

A SUGGESTION.

To the Editor of the "E. A. Standard."

Dear Sir,—I am glad to understand that exclusive of the ordinary staff, your General Post Office here has four distinct bands.

Postmaster General, Assistant Postmaster General, Superintendent of Bands (at large), Deputy Postmaster-General, and Assistant Superintendent of Bands.

I am further glad to understand that the Deputy Postmaster-General is very efficient in carrying out the duties of his office, the other three being away in Europe on leave.

Now, Mr. Editor, do you mind, of course my diabetic faculties may be a trifle) if I work of four men by undertaking and efficiently carried out by one, surely then there are unnecessary, and the Treasury should be relieved of the burden of paying their salaries, which must aggregate at least some £2,000 per annum. It is hard to point out that the public will be greatly benefited if half this amount was retained adding to the staff of the General Post Office, and the balance in the stipending of several Municipal Commissioners, whose chief duties would be to supervise the traffic in Government road, which is rapidly being neglected, but absolutely dangerous.

With so many fungoid spots ready to attack any and almost every plant in our gardens, fungicides with which to combat these attacks have become quite a necessity in a gardener's outfit. Many of these fungicides are both expensive and more or less dangerous to handle, and it is, therefore, not always easy for the poor amateur to get hold of what he really needs in this direction. To such it will be glad news to know that common salt has now been proved to be a fungicide with marked success. The Germans have been employing salt as a fungicide with marked success in the treatment of diseased plants. Fish breeders have long used common salt for destroying the fungus which often attacks young trout, and it is a general practice to give a salt bath to old trout after spawning them, but, so far as we know, this is about the first time it has been used as a fungicide on plants. Glass houses in which diseased plants have been grown are said to be made harmless if a spraying with hot water containing 3½ oz. of salt to every gallon of water. Fungoid germs, it is further asserted, are destroyed on cuttings which have been immersed in a solution of salt to the million of water. If all that is claimed on behalf of salt as a fungicide is correct, this already much-prized chemical will prove a great boon to all those interested in gardening.

Reuter's Special to "E. A. Standard."

London, June 7. A gloomy view of the strike was taken yesterday evening on indications that the employers' answer to the Government's proposals would be unfavourable.

Mr. Gosling issued a message to the Lightermen's Union that if the masters did not reply to-day or if their reply was unfavourable a national strike would be declared immediately. The success of such a movement, however, is considered as being doubtful in view of the attitude of the seamen. It appears that the employers maintain that the federation of their interests is impracticable.

Mr. McKenna yesterday evening in replying to demands why he did not afford protection to workers at Furfess, said it was not the Government's duty to assist employers in acts like the importation of strike breakers which was calculated to provoke disorder.

They say that they cannot be expected to be conciliatory if the Government are taking sides against them.

Cooper representing the Nairobi railway and well known country, when he occupied the post of Assistant Chief Accountant of the Uganda Railway.

REFOUND CLAIMS. The following letter dated May 10, from the Traffic Manager of the Uganda Railway was read:

With reference to your letter of the 14th instant and resolution forwarded therewith, and also the discussion at your meeting of the 14th instant, I have to inform you that it is the universal practice for railway companies to make a refund to the claimant claims for refunds etc., the limit of time varies in different countries. In the following table are given the limits of time in India, C. and P., and in Egypt, 1 month.

I regret I am unable to alter the present practice. Your Committee during the discussion held on the point that although the Railway fixed a time limit within which they would refund, yet they do limit the amount of the refund.

The condition that the conditions should be equal is, I agree, a reasonable one, and in future the Railway will not make any demand for payment at a monthly interval after the expiry of 6 months from the time the traffic was booked.

It is noted that other points that was brought up, i.e., an automatic refund of overcharges, by the Railway authorities, is a rule that we do not now refer any large amount of our defect as an overcharge, but I cannot undertake to make it a rule that we should make these refunds automatically without application in each case from the person concerned.

The general opinion of the meeting was that the letter was a very unsatisfactory answer to the one submitted to the Traffic Manager at the last meeting and they were of the opinion that the matter should not stand as it was.
