MOTORING TOPICS

Motor Car Bodies.

CAREFUL OFFICIAL TESTS OF WOOD.

Common sense is sometimes very deceptive. For many years it has been widely accepted, as true that motor car bodies made of wood do not offer a protection equal to that of steel. And it has been commonly believed that steel bodies provide just as much comfort as bodies with wooden frames.

Although the United States Standards Bureau of the United States recently made careful tests to determine just how the two kinds of bodies compare, with amazing results. Weight for weight it was discovered that in hardwood commonly used in motor car frames not only has greater strength than steel, but greater rigidity also. The protection offered by wooden bodies is far greater than is commonly believed. But the comfort they provide has very distinct advantages over steel. Closed car bodies framed with wood shod off from the occupants over 90 per cent. of the noise originating in the motor and transmission, and also the noise caused by contact of the car with the road and transmitted by the steel frame. Cars with steel frame work for more than 100 times as much noise through to the occupants.

Presently all bodies on General Motors cars are produced by the Fisher Body Company and the frames are made of specially selected hard wood with steel end-sheathing. In addition to the noise absorbing qualities of wood are added other refinements reducing still further the amount of noise received by occupants. All seats and cushions are covered with moiré hair and felt. The rear floor of each car is padded with thick carpet, and the front with heavy rubber mats. Each car interior is almost completely upholstered with velveteen, plush or tapestry. Even the windows are padded. The Motoring World.

OVER 2 MILLIONS IN USE.

There were 2,272,250 automobiles in active service throughout the world on January 1, 1927, an increase of more than 3,000,000 motor cars and trucks over last year, according to the annual world motor census recently completed.

Although the United States still has 80 per cent. of the world's automobiles, relatively more rapid strides are being made in other countries. The census reveals that automobiles used outside of the United States increased by 888,971 vehicles, a gain of 18.3 per cent. in the last year.

Important gains in the use of the automobile occurred in Asia where an increase of 27.6 per cent. is included. Australia, New Zealand and Hawaii, the gain for the year amounted to 22.1 per cent. The Hawaiian Islands, exclusive of the United States, registered a gain for the year of 21.3 per cent. Europe went forward at the rate of 18.3 per cent.

DESIGN OF INTAKE AND EXHAUST MANIFOLD.

Another Enquiry Pending.

In the two previous articles it was shown that Nairobi's water comes from underground springs in the vicinity of the "Ondiri" near Kilbury, that the minimum flow was approximately a million and a quarter gallons a day...

Mr. Maxwell agreed with Mr. Stirling's view that there isn't the slightest chance of the water mysteriously reappearing in the stream running through Nairobi.

Mr. Maxwell's view is that the water has percolated through the volcanic strata, but it would only be found in patches.

With regard to the possible existence of a water table, Mr. Kilbury Mr. Maxwell strikes a note.

Land Rights in Tanganyika.

LABOUR FEELS VIEWS

The following letter from Lord Olivier who was Secretary for India appeared in the Times—

Sir,—The statement of policy on native administration issued by the Government of Tanganyika, to which *The Times* calls attention in the very valuable article from a Correspondent published on the 7th last, read in conjunction with the Governor's recent address at the opening of the Legislative Council of the Territory, of a few sentences interest and importance that I wish to use here to make a few comments.

Perhaps the most important feature in the statement is that for the first time during the last 25 years the Governor of a British African Territory has been in a position to announce a policy simple and obvious in principle in regard to the vested rights of natives in the lands which they occupy by title of tenure.

When the British South Africa Company's charter was granted it stipulated that such customary rights should be respected, but that stipulation was ignored and the Government of the territory took no effectual steps to meet it. From since then, the neglect of such reserves as were set aside very tardily, and in the face of much opposition by European interests, native laws have been regarded as inoperative on the lands of their kind to remain on those subjects up to the constitution of Governments, which might desire to act them to European and on payment of a rent either to the Government or to the European private estate.

IN RHODESIA.

The Aborigines' Protection Society spent about £7,000 in conducting to get the land rights of the natives in Rhodesia, which the Charter had allowed, but which had not been recognized, vindicated before the Judicial Commission of the Privy Council. (The natives were compelled, through taxation, to pay for preparing the case for the white and not vice versa.) In the whole of the lands of Rhodesia were declared to belong to the Crown, and the natives were patently allowed no right or title in them, since then, in Rhodesia, and in East Africa outside of Uganda, it has been the policy of the Government simply to declare the whole of the lands for the property of the Crown, and to deal with them on the principle that the natives have no rights in them, and may be depressed for the convenience of white settlers or compelled to pay rent. Even in the last Conference of East African Governors it was argued that natives ought to be paid for all land.

In the House of Lords last May, in discussing the Report of the Southern Rhodesia Lands Commission, I again stated the case for native land rights which that very report implicitly argued ought to be respected. I do not know what position in regard to this matter has been finally settled between the Colonial Office and the Southern Rhodesia Government. But it is an immense relief that the British Government has been ready to begin to be coming from the indefinite legal position which it has been content to take for years, and consisting largely of the laws which have been passed from time to time on the western side of the continent where the interests of land development, white and black settlers, have not been regarded as paramount.

will now recognize its duty of giving—and, in your Correspondent's suggestion, providing—wherever it has any power or influence, the principle now recommended for Tanganyika—whether or not the Government is to be the Commission of the League of Nations, but it is given to Sir Donald Cameron and to Major de Brou, whose consideration of native land and labour affairs have been refreshingly satisfactory.

In the recent debate on Kenya the Archbishop of Canterbury obtained from Lord Halifax an undertaking that in a future date he would say what the Government are doing to make a proper examination of agricultural and land questions in their territories. Some comments on details of the policy explained by your Correspondent, as responsible in regard to the question of what may be regarded as reasonable and ethical measures to beneficial industry and methods of agricultural improvements, appear to me to be rather far, but they are a great opportunity which a debate on a further question to the Archbishop of Canterbury will, I hope, afford.

Meanwhile, having called attention to the most important element in these recommendations, I should like to be permitted to say that having given close attention to these laws for many years, the documents, which your Correspondent refers to, appear to me to embody the most satisfactory and equitable proposals which we have seen for a permanent and a fair basis for a permanent plan with our territories.

OUTLOOK GENERALLY BECOMING BRIGHTER.

[FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT.]

The fall of the ♠ of Diamonds, from B's hand, marks two only left in his hand, otherwise he would have mentioned an ace to show two or more as there is marked with the remaining six Diamonds. A cannot hold either of the two remaining aces or he would have opened the bidding in Diamonds if supported by an outside ace, otherwise the only other card of value in A's hand would be the Queen. Jack of Hearts and the Queen of Clubs. Z now sees that there is no other hand in the game, and on the other hand a diamond suit of seven cards, down, should A get in after establishing an outside suit by the ace of spades, making two tricks in the Diamond suit, and drops the 10 to the Jack. A can now also place the Diamond suit as Queen of hearts and entry suit by leading three or four hearts, which Z returns to take and Z puts up the Jack. A takes the trick and establishes his suit by leading a small Diamond.

The Famine-Fighting Fleet

MUD

"The desert was just a bog, as it was winter time and nowhere what might be called a road," writes one of the members of the expedition.

WATER

Torrential rains flooded the valleys and rendered even more difficult the early stages of the journey, through Syria and Mesopotamia.

SNOW

In the mountains near Teheran, all the Internationals came through without the slightest mishap. The drivers, all new to the trucks, handled them easily and were most successful.

ANOTHER "Message to Garcia"—the log of the International fleet that trekked across the Mesopotamia wastes at the call of the Persian Government!

When famine threatened Teheran, the capital, last winter, the Persian administration ordered its first ten heavy-duty trucks from the International Harvester organization. Harvester world service placed the fleet at the nearest port on the Mediterranean Sea, Beirut in Syria, ahead of other trucks ordered from Europe.

Then began the test of truck quality, a trip of 1350 miles across trackless desert and over snow-bound mountains. On February 2 the cavalcade set out. The trucks, chauffeured by English, French, Italian, Syrian, Arabian and Druse, were laden with food and fuel and with tons of cement for the British at Bagdad, and they were accompanied by an escort of armored cars of the British Air Forces.

Twenty-six days were consumed between Beirut and Bagdad, every truck axle-deep in mud and sand practically every mile of the way. Bagdad, ancient city of romance, gave the travellers a dinner in their honour and a night of rest, and transferred them from desert to mountain going. Motor fuel for the Persian government, and wheat, took the place of cement for cargo. The cavalcade forged on both night and day, and entered Teheran the seventh day after Bagdad.

The entire fleet was in the pink of condition and every truck of the ten, on the morning of arrival, went out to Kasvin, a hundred miles away, and began bringing back great loads of the precious wheat.

The Persian government, impressed by the stamina of International Trucks, immediately ordered twenty more of them, and these have since duplicated the travel history of the first fleet.

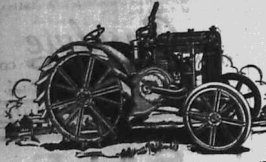

KENYA PROSPECTS.

The Officer-in-Charge of H.M. Commissionariat at Nairobi states in the course of a report on conditions at the coast:—

"Tanganyika." The bonded stock figures as at the end of 1928 provide evidence that there is no overstocking of the market, and, in fact, owing to a comparatively liquid position in the inter-season period Dar-es-Salaam and Tanga have remained for some time now on a healthy basis. During the past year a considerable sum of money was distributed in the Tanga district by representatives of the German Government in payment of their claims. This fact, added to useful increased production in the areas from European estates, has meant that there has been a considerable expansion power among the Native population for some few months past. The granting of long credit in Tanganyika has, for instance, as well as in Zanibar and Mombasa, and though to-day 120 days' credit is being given by certain foreign companies, still the Italian in Tanganyika have not acquired credit as much independent in direct deal that fortunately full advantage has not been taken of the offer of these companies.

"With regard to the German payment in the case, of course, some time for this money to permeate through to the wholesale and, in fact, there is a feeling that some of the speculative dealers may have overbought against expectations of value, but as a very large proportion of this money does ultimately go back into the sheep track trade, gambling in that connection would not altogether affect what is generally the trade trade.
