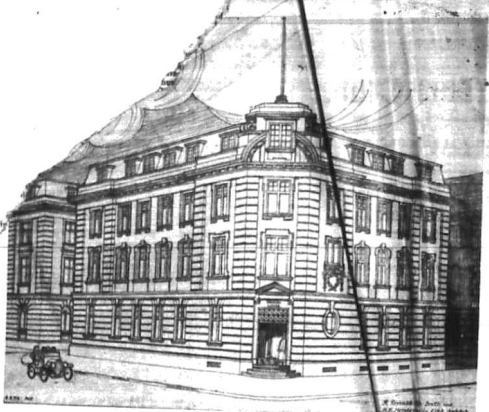

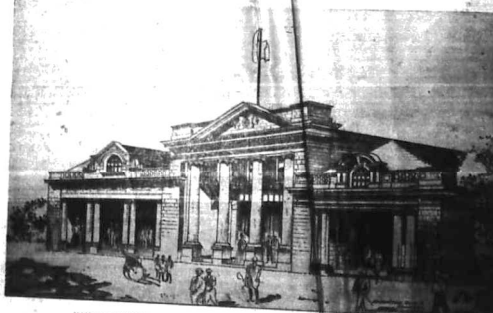

REGRETTABLE INCIDENT.

To the Editor of the "E. A. Standard." Sir,—In your paper of the 29th June, you report "A Regrettable Incident" which occurred between Mr. Finch Hatton and two privates of the King's African Rifles. It seemed desirable that the correspondents you refer to in this matter (for names that have come to my personal notice, my sympathy is entirely with Mr. Finch Hatton.)

It seems most extraordinary that native officials who are in authority over most of our troops should be so very different beings when away on their own and not in uniform. It is curious that a native will always do a grievous thing to those who have immediate authority over him and do not seem in a position to punish him and yet the same native will be most arrogant male when treated with least authority and away from direct control. It is hardly possible to believe that the two privates who were the subjects of two natives (in their own quarters) who in their own country only a few years back had had the decency to clothe themselves, when opposed to that of a gentleman, never overtook them in the streets of London. Of course not having been at the scene of the incident the only suggestion one can arrive at from your report is that the two soldiers remain unmentioned thereby Mr. Finch Hatton placed in the wrong.

The only train relation that must exist between a native and a white man must be that of a private soldier to his superior officer, whether he be in uniform or not. I refer to the respect that is due to a white man and not necessarily to taking orders. One would expect that those in authority over natives would impress on them that under no circumstances does the wearing of the King's uniform entitle them to behave in a manner that is not in accordance with that of every time a white man was struck by a native lowered the prestige of their own race.

From one wearing the King's uniform one may expect a certain respect and from the inflated side that the uniform gives a measure of respect in their own quarters. It is a disgrace to the King's uniform by a white soldier in an offence in itself. While it is possible for a white soldier to disgrace the King's uniform by hawking and the same offence be perpetrated in a native's quarters?

It has always been my experience that a native will show any submission or power that may be yielded in him when given the opportunity. For this reason, I am always opposed to the system of vesting power in the present time. I consider it taking a step backward in the tide of native evolution. I have never known a native who will not be in conflict with his own personal code. Education of our own white officials into the ways of the native enables them to make more fair allowances for native customs, but do not allow them to be passive for true justice, our aim must be to raise the native up to the level of our own civilization and not step down to that of the convenience.

The Late Mr. Currie.
Official intimation of the death of the Hon. Mr. H. A. F. Currie, C.M.A., (General Manager of the Uganda Railway, was received by the Secretary of the Station, Kampala, Thursday by telegram from His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies in the following terms:
'I have with great regret to inform you of the death of Mr. Currie, General Manager of the Uganda Railway, on July 2nd. I am deeply sensible of the loss which your Government has sustained of an official who has rendered such valuable assistance in promoting the prosperity of the two Protectorates, East Africa and Uganda.'

Mr. Currie's varied experience prior to his arrival in this country was of a kind which made him valuable to the work which found him in the capacity of General Manager of the Uganda Railway. He was a Fellow of Cooper's Hall and at the early age of twenty five entered the Indian Public Works Department and later the Public Works of India. Having thus acquired his wide experience in the Public Works service, he was chosen and sent by the Government of India to the Public Works Department of the Government of China where he remained for four years or more.

By his death the Government lose a most efficient and capable servant, and the railway a manager who through a stern discipline was noted always for his absolute fidelity. It can be truly said that the staff feel they have lost a friend.

We join with his many friends in extending to Mrs. Currie our most heartfelt sympathy in her sad bereavement.

It will be remembered that the Uganda Railway in Uganda was incorporated during the period of management and the low cost of this undertaking reflects great credit on the administration.

As a man perhaps one of his most striking characteristics was his marvellous attention to detail in all his business. He went into everything with a thoroughness which is seldom met with and which in combination with his clear intellectual power marked him out for success.

At the following year he took over the management of the Uganda Railway at a time when the country had barely begun to show any signs of its coming prosperity and when it was necessary that a policy of economy should be rigidly carried out. Mr. Currie carried out this policy and reduced the working expenses of the

AT ELECTRIC POWER HOUSE.

Very meagre details are to hand concerning the accident which occurred at the Electric Power Station to which reference was made in Thursday's issue. 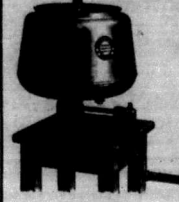

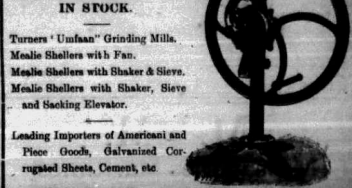

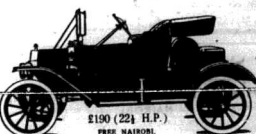
