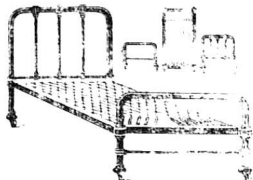

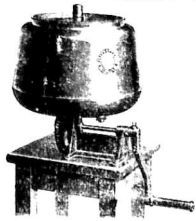

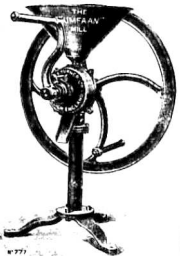

WORLD'S NEWS.

The Message to Japan.

(Hester's Special to "E. A. Standard," London, Aug. 9.)
A message from the King was presented to the Germans acknowledging his address to Japan on the death of their Emperor. In his acknowledgment His Majesty said: "I can never sincerely in the expression of regret at the melancholy tidings of the death of my illustrious friend and ally the Emperor of Japan."

Sugar Convention.

(London, Aug. 2.)
The papers are discussing the withdrawal of Great Britain from the Sugar Convention mainly from a party point of view but they all agree that it will seriously affect the West Indies. The withdrawal takes effect in September of next year.

(Greenock, Aug. 2.)
The sugar industry is described as being filled with consternation at the Government's decision. The editors of sugar papers state it means ruin and that the country will be swamped by bounty-fed sugar. Confectioners generally are complaining against a reduction in price.

Snap Division.

(London, Aug. 2.)
Despite the slight sittings of the Commons the Opposition assembled in force. On the first opportunity for a snap division on the question of procedure the Government's majority was only 26. There was great jubilation on the part of the Opposition and there were shouts of "Saved by the Irish again."

Ulster Anti-Home Rule.

Unionist Demonstrations.
FORCING A CRISIS.
(London, Aug. 1.)
The "Times," referring to the meetings that are being arranged in Ulster for the end of September and culminating in a demonstration in Belfast, says that Mr. Bonar Law's speech at Balmahon at the Unionist demonstration is that plan reveals the significance of these meetings, namely that Ulster will not wait for two years for Home Rule but will endeavour to force a crisis.

Journalist's Appointment.

(Peking, Aug. 1.)
Mr. George Morrison the correspondent to the "Times" at Peking, has accepted the post of political adviser to the President of the Chinese Republic for a period of five years and will begin his duties in October. Mr. Morrison, who was born in Glasgow, has had a venturesome career. He was captured in New Guinea in October 1903 and his year-long war was cut out in Edinburgh in July 1904. He has travelled in Siam, Manchuria and Siberia.

Franco-Russian Conversations.

MODIFYING NAVAL SITUATION.
(Paris, Aug. 2.)
Premier Poincaré will start for Russia on August 4. It is announced in Paris that there have been conversations between the chiefs of the French and Russian staffs with the object of placing on a more precise basis the military convention of 1892 by extending it to the navy with the view of modifying the naval situation.

A Subject for "Pour Parlers."

(London, August 1.)
Sir Edward Grey in reply to Mr. Noel Burton, said that the Italian occupation of the Aggenai islands must occasion considerable discussion when the war is over.

The Message to Japan.

(Reuter's Special to "E. A. Standard.")
London, Aug. 9
A message from the King was presented to the Commons acknowledging the address to Japan on the death of their Emperor. In his acknowledgment His Majesty said: "I join most sincerely in the expression of regret at the melancholy tidings of the death of my illustrious friend and ally the Emperor of Japan."

Sugar Convention.

London, Aug. 9
The papers are discussing the withdrawal of Great Britain from the Sugar Convention mainly from a party point of view but they all agree that it will seriously affect the West Indies. The withdrawal takes effect in September of next year.
Greenock, Aug. 9
The sugar industry is described as being filled with anxiety over the Government's decision. The refiners of sugar say that it means ruin and that the country will be swamped by bounty fed sugar. Confectioners generally are complacent expecting a reduction in price.

Snap Division.

MAJORITY REDUCED TO 26.

London, Aug. 9
Despite the allnight sittings of the Commons the Opposition assembled in force. On the first opportunity for a snap division on the question of procedure the Government's majority was only 26. There was great jubilation on the part of the Opposition and there were shouts of "Saved by the Irish again"

FORGING A CRISIS.

London, Aug. 1

Journalist's Appointment.

Peking, Aug. 1
Mr. George Morrison, the correspondent to the "Times" at Peking, has accepted the post of political adviser to the President of the Chinese Republic for a period of five years and will begin his duties in October. Mr. Morrison who was born in Geelong has had a venturesome career. He was speared in New Guinea in October 1903 and the spear wound was cut out in Edinburgh in July 1904. He has travelled in Siam, Manchuria and Siberia.

Franco-Russian Conversations.

MODIFYING NAVAL SITUATION.

Paris, Aug. 2
Premier Poincare will start for Russia on August 4. It is announced in Paris that there have been conversations between the chiefs of the French and Russian staffs with the object of placing on a more precise basis the military agreement made in October 1903 and the convention of 1892 by extending it to the navy with the view of modifying the naval situation.
