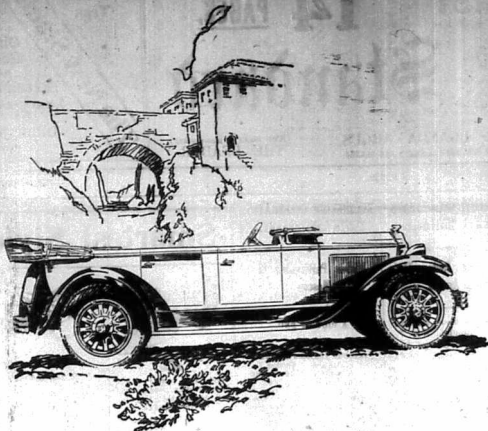

RESULTS OF COMBINATION OF TWO OFFICIAL PRESSES.

Redistribution of the Land Office Staff Under New System.

The second explanatory article of some of the main details of the Budget deals with the combination of the Government Land Office and the Land Office a scheme which will save, according to the Budget, £2,669 on the cost of the separate establishments this year.

ADMINISTRATION STAFF COSTS.

MOToring TOPICS

The Olympic Show. The Perfect Driver. Road Devices.

OUTSTANDING FEATURES OF THE YEAR.

"STANDARD" CORRESPONDENTS
London, October 13.
The twenty-first annual Motor Show, organized by the Society of Motor Manufacturers and Traders, has opened at Olympia, London. Although perhaps the new Continental models are making their first appearance at this Show, which is at present in progress, there are a large number of new cars which are appearing for the first time at Olympia. The total number of stands is 216, of which 120 display cars.

An interesting feature of the year's Exhibitions is that German and American cars are exhibited for the first time since the war. Olympia records that the medium-sized six-cylinder engine is gaining in popularity. The improved up-grade performance of this type of car—compared with a four—makes it very popular with the normal type of driver, who requires his car to be a pleasant means of transport and who does not take any technical interest in such things as gear-changes.

The small-car market is estimated for extremely well. A number of leading makes are producing 7 and 9 h.p. cars which are extremely economical to run, and which have a most satisfactory road performance.

At the other end of the scale is to be noticed an increase in the number of eight-cylinder cars which are being manufactured. Those who have had experience of a good straight eight report that the acceleration and hill-climbing are considerably above the average.

The multiplication of cylinders with the corresponding increase in number of parts does not result in impaired reliability, as the materials employed and the care taken in the manufacture result in each part being only lightly strained, much to the benefit of reliability.

The popularity of the seven-type of body will be further increased by the developments in removable or sliding roofs, whereby most of

REMOVING CAUSES OF FURTHER.

Just as America has more motor vehicles in the service mile than any other country in the world, so the traffic conditions are almost of other countries in road-making, in spite of traffic control and safety devices.

One of the foremost complaints against drivers of motor vehicles is that they will stick too closely to the centre of the road. This tendency has been common in children and other States by a white centre line. This line is continuous round curves and sharp corners and on straight, or comparatively straight, stretches of 20 foot widths of both line are maintained at intervals of 100 yards. This materially lessens the cost of maintaining these lines, which have proved very successful in minimizing the danger arising from the vast masses of traffic using the roads.

Another device for the benefit of motorists is the magnetic metal collector devised by the Washington State College. This is a machine having two four-foot magnets suspended at the rear. This can be lowered or raised at circumstances dictate, and electric current is passed to the magnets by a Ford-engine-driven generator.

"Success" large quantities of metal are picked up by this equipment on an ordinary road. Not only nails, but speedometer cables, small tools and other articles lost from trucks, trailers or wagons are collected. Anything from two to ten tons weight of metal to the mile is picked up.



A FEW MORE TO PARLIAMENTS AFTER

The following road matters dealt with by the Municipal Works Committee were approved by the Town Council on Tuesday afternoon.

The construction of that portion of the improvement of the road between River Road and Whitehouse Road should be commenced forthwith.

The Town Clerk reported that a contract was in existence in accordance with Council's instructions, for the re-surfacing of the whole of VJ Avenue, but that work had been stopped at the D.C.'s office owing to there being no more so available at the time.

The Engineer reported the completion of this contract could now be undertaken without delaying other road works as had passed by the Council. The work is to be continued.

A New Road.

In accordance with the suggestion of the Finance Committee the question of an African road from Parklands Avenue to Kilguro Road was discussed.

It was resolved that it be placed on next year's programme of works in the measure that the suggestion should be sent to the Municipal Planning Authority for their consideration.

The Town Clerk submitted a letter from the Kenya and Uganda Railway in which they stated they were unable to agree to any further reduction in the present rate of 10s. per ton. He also reported that the Engineer and the Municipal Engineer with the Chamber of Commerce and that they were now discussing the matter.

The Municipal Engineer reported that the cost of pulling down the present wall round Jewell's (facade) erecting a low brick wall in accordance with Council's instructions would be approximately Shs. 8,000/-.

It was resolved to recommend, subject to the Finance Committee's approval, that this work should be proceeded with. The Finance Committee agreed.

The Municipal Engineer submitted the report of the Municipal Engineer of the Broken Sprayer in which he stated that in his opinion Council had no claim on the makers in connection with same.

Blocking the Railway.

The Town Clerk submitted a letter from the Kenya and Uganda Railway in which a complaint was made that the post boxes in the Connaught Road area were being used for receiving a large quantity of mail and were thus blocking the road.

It was resolved that all such post boxes be removed with a notice in connection with Municipal Engineers and require to cease using the reserve as a dumping ground in the interim.

The long term suggested tender was accepted for the purpose of a street watering tank to be used only by a contractor.

It was resolved that the matter of securing a tender for the Municipal Engineer's engineer.

The Council decided to add the Council that be and considered the complaint of a person who had prepared a design, showing what might be done on the Jewell's post wire project to building a drainage sewer. He gave notice that s. the next morning, he would move a resolution raising for competitive design for the construction of a market as soon as details were available.

The Mayor suggested that it would be desirable for the motion to be so worded as to provide for a committee which would come within the Council's financial capacity. It would do to maintain a lot of similar work.
