After standing for many years without a name, the statue of King Charles I. at Charing Cross is to bear a label. The Office of Works has authorized Captain Whistler-Crowe, the President of the Royal-Mercy Society, the offer of the Society to present a tablet, suitably inscribed with the approval of the Board of Works, has been accepted. The famous statue, which has stood without a name for so long a remarkable history. It was cast in the King's likeness by the sculptor, Sir John Gibson, West-Block, the Lord Treasurer of War. At the outbreak of the Civil War it was removed secretly by night by some of the King's loyal friends and hidden in the garden. The Parliamentarians having ordered its destruction. Soon after the Restoration the statue was brought forth again and Charles II. in 1675, had it set up where it now stands. Owing to the increasing traffic round Whitehall another removal of the statue has frequently been suggested. The original inscription of the stone railing that guarded it disappeared long ago.

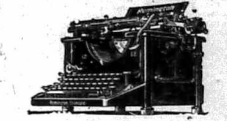

ALTERNATIVE CONSTITUTIONS OF LEGISLATURE.

Nominated Europeans in Addition to the Elected Members.

In accordance with a resolution passed at the last session of the Convention of Associations the Executive has now prepared a memorandum on the constitutional problem as an outline to form a basis for discussion of the question by all affiliated district associations.

The memorandum proceeds from the assumption that Nairobi is the only safe centre for the Federal Capital and suggests that for the time being the High Commissioner should be also Governor of Kenya.

A federal constitution is sketched having as its central feature representation on a "capita" basis of the European population of each state.

This is justified by the assertion that Kenya who has the most to gain by slow union would be the partner in any federation incurring the heaviest financial responsibility in the event of any partner defaulting.

It is emphasized that Kenya must assured of political freedom before entering into any other union and alternative methods are suggested whereby this may be secured through alteration in the constitution of the Legislature.

One method is to elect European majority over all other parties; another includes the introduction of a number of nominated European Members, men of standing in the Colony, who would not be subject to the pull of constituencies.

The principle of representation of native interests by Europeans is accepted by the Memorandum.

The position of the Railway control and administration is also set out in detail.

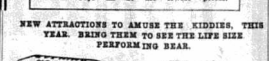

# MOTOR TOPICS

## THE 1927 MOTOR SHOW

### This Year Edges All Previous Years

#### SCHEMATA BY OLYMPIA

#### "STANDARD" CORNERLIGHT

London, October 29. From the point of view of mechanical efficiency and practical utility the Motor Show which this year marks its coming of age was far and away the best of its kind. Even if one had not been so fortunate in watching these were cars on view which would merit attention purely on account of their beauty and grace. That today we have become so used to mechanical motorcars, and that most of the visitors to the Show had sufficient knowledge to take keen interest in the detailed improvements of the 1927 motor car. And the show treated with these and new automotive ideas.

This Show indeed marks another milestone on the road to progress. It was a triumph along which, from the earliest days till now, the industry has travelled with never a halt. From a cart and harness assembly on the 18th of the 19th century to a quarter of a century ago it was still in its infancy. The rapidity of its growth has been amazing. In 1924 there were about 100,000 motor vehicles in the world, nearly ninety per cent. of them built by America. To-day the total has been increased by something like ten million.

#### New Developments.

Among the developments introduced at this year's Show may be mentioned increased engine efficiency, improved suspension and steering, centralized and semi-centralized lubrication, a wider use of safety glass, and motor systems of changing gear. Generaly speaking, the main tendencies of the year are in the direction of simplification and safety, and because that the direct appeal to the public of these qualities the Olympia will once more serve the purpose of

#### making a definite advance to the new day of the motor.



Nothing strikingly novel has been developed during the last few weeks, except the number of apparently anonymous lines that are dotted here and there over some of the newest models.

More interesting and much less fever are the models which, while following the above for slightly longer, fuller skirts, yet manage

to retain a charming air of simple freedom—here the all-over print being applied to the bodice, which is cut almost shirt fashion, the fabric being finely tucked in at the nipped waist. The back is a combined skirt, that you who can't wear a skirt, will like. The fabric of the skirt seemed in little frills and curls, which are very decorative.
