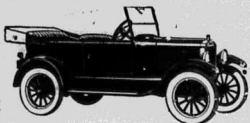

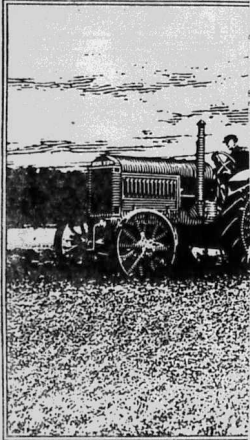

GOVERNMENT'S SHARE OF TOWN TAXES.

A Dispute with the Corporation.

There is a little difference of opinion going on between the Nairobi Town Council and the Government as to the apportionment of the Government's share of the Town Tax. The Government is of the opinion that the Government's share should be calculated on the value of the land in the Town. The letter also stated that where the memorial should be removed or not depended upon the views of the Corporation and that of a memorial would be about £250.

The memorial referred to was erected in Nairobi under the sign of the War Graves Commission as one of a series of similar monuments to African troops to be set up throughout East Africa. Since it was finished it has remained deserted and neglected except for a piece of rotting wooden, and has been in a state of neglect.

Report of Peolosa.

The attention of growers and buyers of potatoes is called to the Rules governing the export of potatoes published in the Official Gazette of April 27. On and after July 1, no potatoes are to be exported from the Colony which do not comply with the regulations as to the quality and packing.

"Peculiar Nairobi."

The Secretary has suggested to the Nairobi Town Council that it should consider the question of the necessity for a trained cleaning superintendent and the necessity for the proper equipment and staffing of the cleaning services in Nairobi. The Town Planning and Public Health Committee however does not agree. It says that "owing to the peculiar conditions of Nairobi the work is an improvement could be done by such an appointment. 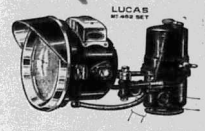
More Road Tax.

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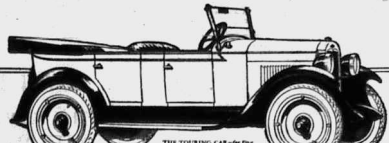

SAFEST METHOD

Experienced motorists who live in hilly districts are well aware that caution is necessary when making a slow steep grade, and have learnt also the need for care in maintaining the brakes in first-class condition. Now, however, or motorists who habitually drive in flat country, are apt to make mistakes in placing their feet on the pedals. They do not reach the rapidly with which a car falls down a steep grade, and the momentary increase in the stopping distance is at times fatal, that which obtains on the level.

Downward gradients can be taken in a variety of ways. The simplest, and also the most prevalent, consists of leaving the clutch and gear lever alone, releasing the accelerator pedal, and in order to supplement the retardation provided by the engine when driven by the car in top gear. This is a very safe method, but it should, of course, be improved upon when the downward gradient is steep. It is, nevertheless, deeper than one might imagine, especially when the road is steep, so increasing the engine speed and also its braking effect.

Next, there are two ways of slowing downward gradients, one of which consists in holding the clutch pedal against the floor-board, while in the gear lever is slipped into neutral. For the inexperienced the best plan is the safer, as by engaging the clutch the driver can control the braking effect of the engine. The practice is to let the clutch pedal rest in its normal position in the long run it results in a considerable wear in the clutch spring bearing.

As regards the practice of taking down the clutch pedal, it is not so unwise proceeding, unless the driver makes the real work done certain that its stoppage does not suddenly occur.

DANGERS OF COASTING.
Furthermore, it is inadvisable that a car is in a neutral, or coasting, when in motion. It should hardly be necessary to mention that no driver should undertake in coasting in neutral unless he is sufficiently practiced to be able to carry out the operation of engaging to put on an instant's notice without hesitation.

It is also wise to practice engaging other gears at various speeds, thus by-revving the engine of the average mechanism.

consideration at the works whether all the future cars produced would be treated likewise. Upon a subsequent trial a very great improvement was noticed in the operation, also in the general behaviour of the brakes. The result is that the action appeared to be more direct both in the operation of the brake and in their return, a symptom which seems to suggest that some part of the compensating mechanism was binding.

Steering is light and accurate, and through the whole range of speed of which the Whippet is capable, even on the very rough roads, the car is very easy to handle. It is a new car and has not been pushed to its limit during our test, but it is estimated that it can run at three overhauls, able on two or three occasions to reach 55 m.p.h. It should be noted that the makers claim to 55 m.p.h., would be easily within the capabilities of the engine when it is properly run in.

We formed the impression that the Overland Whippet was a car very suitable for the country which is limited, somewhat as regards first cost, but which is capable with a good top gear performance, with a very good body, and a very light country, and with a body perfectly free from rattles and squeaks, and with a good distinct appeal to a wide range of motorists.—(The Motor)

H.E. THE ACTING GOVERNOR OPENS THE MAY SESSION.

Defence Force Bill Passes Second Reading.

PORT CONTROL SCHEME DETAILED.

Progress of New Public Works.

The May session of the Kenya Legislative Council opened on Monday, May 14, at 10.30 a.m. in the presence of His Excellency the Acting Governor, Sir Philip Mitchell, who presided over the opening ceremony. At 11.15 a.m. the Council met in the presence of His Excellency the Acting Governor, Sir Philip Mitchell, who presided over the opening ceremony. There was, however, a much smaller attendance of Members than at the opening of the session on previous occasions.

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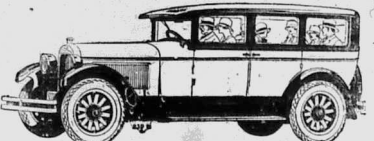

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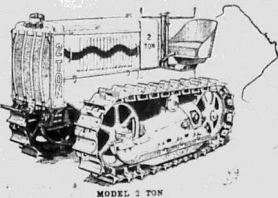
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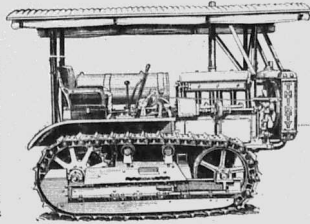
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WORK OF THE COURTS, MONTE CARLO PROFITS, IN KENYA.

Report Made by the Chief Justice.

£1,450,000 Won from the Public.

According to the annual report of the Judicial Department submitted to His Honour the Chief Justice of Kenya and laid before the Legislature in 1926, the total number of cases tried in the various courts of the colony during the year 1926 was 17,700. In three cases the death penalty was pronounced by the Governor of the Colony and in three other cases the Court of Appeal quashed the conviction. Other interesting Supreme Court figures are also contained in the report. The number of civil cases during the year was 114, probate and administration cases 162, insolvency cases 42 (an increase over 1925), 120 criminal cases tried by the Supreme Court (40 criminal appeals and 78 confirmation cases).

Twenty four Europeans were committed for trial during the year and two cases were pending on 1926. There were 16 cases of insanity and 7 acquittals. The Great Court travelled 3,234 miles by road, 412 miles by rail, 1,130 miles by sea.

There was a diminution in the criminal cases heard by the magistracy in Nairobi and Mombasa. In Nairobi civil cases numbered 2,460 and criminal cases 2,438. In Mombasa the respective figures were 1,004 and 1,901.

THE LOWER COURTS.

The report indirectly expresses satisfaction with the work done by subordinate courts in stating that the percentage of convictions obtained by the lower courts without alterations by the Supreme Court was 94.99 per cent. The Justice indicated a decrease of imprisonment in 1926 cases. His Honour the Chief Justice referred to the urgent necessity of placing the administration of law in Kenya on a more efficient basis.

During the year there were 8,000 and 6,000 while 10,000 persons were brought before the criminal courts of the Colony. Of these 18,426 were males and 11,612 were females. The number of cases tried in the subordinate courts and of the 125 tried by the Supreme Court, 10 were appealed. Persons charged with offences against the Public Health Act, 1914, numbered 1,200 and 1,100 were sentenced. 2,100 of these 1,750 were sentenced.

SMALL PROCEEDINGS.

In the Small and Probate Courts 1,000 persons were tried for offences in 1926. The Probate and Small Claims Courts were also busy. In the Probate Court 2,100 were granted probate and 1,150 were granted letters of administration. In the Small Claims Court 1,000 cases were presented. The Small Claims Court had 10 cases and 10 judgments. The Chief Justice described the increase since 1924 in the number of applications for confirmation of judgment as 2,468. In 16 cases a writ of habeas corpus was granted in Supreme Court proceedings.

NATIONALITIES.

The rates of the 19,017 persons tried were as follows—Europeans 1,170, Asiatics 1,175, Africans 16,572. There were 508 women of whom 92 were Europeans, 13 Asiatics and 473 Natives tried for criminal offences.

Business of whippings were imposed by magistrates in 385 cases, the majority being juveniles. This compared with 366 cases in 1925. The Supreme Court passed two sentences of whipping as compared with 12 in 1925. The percentage of whippings sentences to the number of convictions was 0.2 per cent.
