In Tanganyika for three reasons. As I have said to give the natives a place in the body politic, a place founded on the own natural rights, laws and customs, and principally in order to make use of him in the administration of the country; and in the second place to limit the only authority and discipline which the natives know, himself. Our third reason is to make the natives the complement of the European in the development of the country.

Being convinced that it is neither sound nor just to deny partially to the natives of the Territory any part in the government of the country, the Government of the Territory has adopted a policy which aims at the elimination of race friction by the provision within the limits of their own native administration the same for the political interests and aspirations of Africans both educated and uneducated, so making it possible for them to receive, in accordance with their traditions and their most deeply rooted instincts, as an organized and disciplined community within the State, with a place in it which, by reason of the widely divergent degrees of civilization and wealth of its component elements, does not retard the political evolution analogous to that of homogeneous nations in Europe and elsewhere in the world. Not only is this policy not limited to the interests of Africa, it is a state-creating policy, and is based on a solid foundation upon which stands the existence in the Territory can be built for its sake upon the side of law, order and good government.

It is a policy which recognizes the elements in native society, and it aims at preserving that society intact.

To the Editor, - E. A. Stender, Sir - I utterly disagree with the proposal of the Commission on the Daylight Saving Scheme, and agree with the letter signed 'J. O. Kibler' in your issue of the 22nd instant, and I feel sure that all my countrymen who must necessarily be early risers, will agree with me.

How one vainly asks, on these early mornings of daylight, in a country where every minute of daylight is already being made use of? One can only think that the Daylight Saving authorities are people who sleep until past 7 o'clock and have no idea of the value of daylight.

At present my boys enter the house before 6 a.m. to close the window, make the fire, and bring in at 6.30, put the water hot for baths at 7 a.m., and breakfast ready by 7.40 or 7.45, and are out for their hour or five minutes it has been found to keep them practical, and until lately, it has been found that they are not so tired as they were.

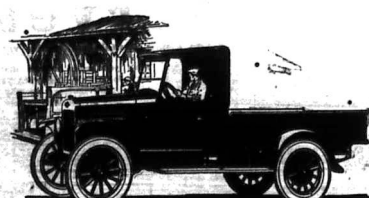
Now, according to our Daylight Saving scheme, the boys would be in to make the fire, and to bring in the water, at 5.30 or 6.00, and to be in bed by 6.30 or 7.00. I am sure that if I were to give to them, I feel to be sure they would do more during the night than I do at present. Instead of saving half an hour as it is, they would be wasting extra light, and they may have to be in bed when first they come in. It is difficult to think how they will affect other children at school I do not feel at all prepared to say, but for other young children I know what will be the result, and I know what will be the result at 8.00 and return at 8.00 for breakfast.

Under the Daylight Saving scheme, they would walk at 5.30 (re-called) having gone to bed the previous night at 6.30 (re-called) 7. Instead of 7. Doing that for half the year very well, they would waste 6 (re-called 6.30) before they are dressed and off to school at 6.30 (re-called 7). To keep in line with the above and to conform to the proposals, they must be back by 6.30 (re-called 6.30) for breakfast, and have an hour for the first morning air, and then they have to be in bed before 6.30. It will be too late for them to go to bed again. I respect the Daylight Saving Committee to think that they are not so tired as they were. The breakfast has to be made, and the children must be kept, dressed, washed and dressed, and sent to school.

To prevent the children going to school at 4 o'clock and return at 6.30, they must be in bed at 6.30 (re-called 6.30) and get up at 6.30 (re-called 6.30) as it will be too late at 8.00 (re-called 8.00). business in the east that the Colony should not participate in the Chamberlain's scheme. It is our opinion that all the advantages of the loan have been recommended to us in that we should secure a separate Kenya loan, part of which will be devoted to pay off our existing liabilities as far back as and including the three and a half million Treasury loan. The remainder would be issued at a later date in a second issue to meet the cover of prospective expenditures on railway, port and colonial requirements.

There are various points in this connection requiring close consideration, such as the date of issue of the first instalment which would affect the railway requirements to be included in the second instalment. The Government are the provision for a Land and Colonies Department which I am glad to inform you has been approved in principle by the Secretary of State for the Thompson's Falls branch line, which requires legislation guaranteeing the railway against loss to the extent of interest on the loan before it can be begun, and certain urgent municipal expenditure.

I will not enter on the subject today, except to say that the financial position both of the Railway and of the Colony as revealed in this year's returns fully justify the advice that the Colony should go into the market on its own account. The General Manager of Railways will make a full statement on the Railway Finance Committee in a fortnight's time, and you will hear from Members of the Council to advise the introduction of those estimates which are at an early date for reasons which I fear will appear self-evident. I will only say now that the figures for this year's working are most satisfactory.

**Healthy Finances.**

The returns of the Colony at the end of December 31, 1927, the estimated surplus account was £262,201. The highest for the current year, the estimated surplus for December 31, 1927, was £218,191. The figures recently received from the Department show that the estimated surplus for the year ending December 31, 1927, will be £282,566, bringing the total to £444,857, plus at the end of 1927 to £441,874.

The Treasury is compelled by the lines being in the course of the Department's receipts, savings on voted expenditures, but an increase to some extent from the experience of past years that the figures given by Deane's notes are on the conservative side, and that the surplus of 1927 will be larger than the estimate.

I would like to contrast the figure with the situation five years ago. At the beginning of 1922, the Colony's balance sheet showed a surplus of £490,691, but it included several items the real value of which were less by £112,720 than those shown, resulting in the actual surplus to be £377,971. The outstanding liabilities to the extent of £205,389, which would be liquidated in the immediate future. It must not be overlooked that in the Port Estimates this year, and included in the Port loss, there will be a debit of £18,962 for contribution to a sinking fund for redemption of loans, and £10,000 providing for depreciation, so that the Railway is in effect not only providing for the Port working loss, but for the depreciation and redemption of loans.

**Local Government.**

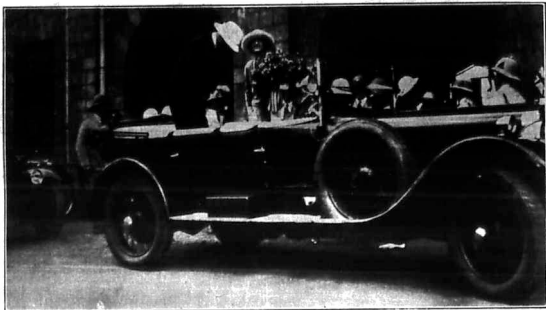

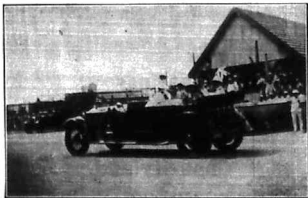
