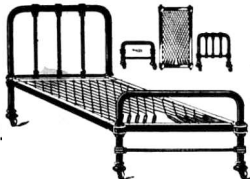

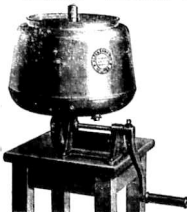

WORLD'S NEWS.
Balkan Hostilities.
Ottoman Armies Advance.
BULGARIA AND SERVIA JOIN.
[Bosnia's Special to "E. A. Standard."] Constantinople, Oct. 25.
Hostilities have begun on the Bulgarian and Serbian frontiers and the Porte has ordered the Ottoman armies to move forward. Balkan Oct. 17.
Bulgaria has retained the Macedonian province of Salonika which had been held by Turkey to convey refugees to Varsovia on the Black Sea. Romania has instructed its army to proceed against the Bulgarians. London, October 17.
Hospital accommodations in Constantinople are terribly defective and it is also a serious problem how to feed the thousands of refugees. It is generally anticipated that a fight between the Turkish and Greek navies for predominance on the sea will be one of the first features of the war. The Greek Minister of Marine announced in the morning that two Greek gunboats had succeeded in reaching Vozitza after running the gauntlet of the Turkish fleet at Preveza in the Gulf of Arta in Albania.
Constantinople, October 17.
Passengers have been barred from the Serbian and Bulgarian Ministers, and the Porte has declared war on Bulgaria and Serbia.
London, Oct. 17.
Bosnia's agent at Athens reported at noon that hostilities had begun.

ROYALTY ON THE FIGHTING LINE.
It is reported from Sofia that King Ferdinand has started for the front.
Bosnia's agent at Belgrade states that King Peter, who had gone to the front at the wish of the Serbian, has defeated the Albanians at Prijepolje, killing two hundred. It is probably owing to this, based with the Montenegrins.
PORT'S REASONS FOR WAR.
The Porte gives its reasons for its declaration of war as being, firstly, the Balkanic note in interfering with Turkey's internal affairs; secondly, mobilization of the Greek troops; and thirdly, the daily humiliations making it impossible for the Sultan to maintain peace any longer without handing her armies over there.
It is considered noteworthy that Greece is included in the declaration of war. Turkey's delay in declaring war upon Greece was due to the uncertainty whether the Greek note was identical with Serbian and Bulgarian notes. The Turkish Minister at Athens having refused to accept it. The Porte has now learned that it was, consequently a declaration of war is declared unconditionally.
Belgrade, Oct. 17.
Serbia declared war with Turkey in the evening, several of people in the streets shouting and cheering.
Constantinople, Oct. 18.
Official telegrams report that an escape of state took place throughout the day of the 18th instant along the Thero-Bulgarian frontier between the respective guards. This desultory firing was resumed on the following day in the vicinity of Plovdiva.
Further Turkish telegrams assert that the Montenegrins have driven back and lost 600 men killed as well as eight guns in a battle near Kratovo.
There has been fighting between the Turkish troops and bands of Bulgarians at the village of Vranja, where the Bulgarians were cutting the wires. Greek bands have been attempting to cross the frontier to Albania but were repulsed.

The Follies.

Fun and Frolic.

Another successful evening with their programme full of fun and frolic, interspersed with real gems of the more serious side of musical art giving variety to the entertainment.

The appearance of Miss Marjorie Linton who sang "T. A. Macnochie in his speaking with "Mamie May" evoked rounds of applause and for a little girl, with her sunny smile and happy and bright face, her first walk on the boards was an unbounded success.

One of the most interesting features of this portion of the performance was the long waits between the four items which, perhaps, to some extent may be excused by the consideration that some time is necessary for the "props" to be changed.

The "pave de resistance" in the third part of the programme was undoubtedly the cleverest of the evening—a humorous sketch which girls they did not want. This was very cleverly executed and well deserved the encore it received.

The remainder of part 3 was made up of one of the "Mamie Montague" sketches, changing the place for which was in Nairobi, Macnochie, Vincent, and T. A. Irwin, in his topical song on B.E.A., the conclusion reaching the climax in F. Eeles' recitation that the best way to get beyond the night was to "Follow the Tradition," his "right" was in the chorus by the whole band of Follies.

Messrs. Vincent, T. A. Irwin, Eeles and Denton, who were the first to be heard, were heartily congratulated for the measure of their "pave de resistance" in their management of the pleasurable evening entertainment.

THE EAST AFRICAN STANDARD.

It is presumed that the origin of the fire was a lighted cigarette and carelessly thrown upon a rug. These cigarettes are a fruitful source of trouble and the smoking public in their own interests, should exercise care in disposing of them.

A native was brought before the Nairobi Town Magistrate on Thursday on a charge of theft. It appears that the native had stolen £100 from a local Indian and with this money he had bought a horse and a cow in the Ngong district and three deposited in the latter's wife, telling her that it was his and she should take care of it. It was not until she had the police called that she was advised that the money was recovered and the native was given one year's imprisonment.

With reference to "Health Pointers" by "Observer" which appears in another column, we might state that Nairobi for some years has had a sanitary inspector and we believe was correct in saying that he has the option of all that the Sanitary Inspector can possibly do to report on filthy or insanitary conditions and that remedial measures are carried out when these are ordered by the Medical Health Department but he cannot act on his own initiative. It would be interesting to see the file of the Sanitary Inspector's reports.

A European was charged before the Nairobi Town Magistrate on Wednesday morning with assaulting an Indian sub-inspector of Police and was fined £20. Mr. R. H. Logan in his finding mentioned that another case of this sort came before him he would be inclined not to give the option of a fine.

We would mention in connection with this case that the Indian policeman was not interfering with the European. The Indian policeman in the present in Nairobi have never taken advantage of their uniform to annoy Europeans.

In another column will be noticed an appeal from the League of Mercy for financial support and a small war. The League is doing most excellent work to our ultimate knowledge. The work is being done quietly, without bustle or ostentation, notwithstanding the fact that those of us who have thought of the problem at all have raised for some time past that we could not evade the poor while problem in E. A. as time went on and we feel confident that many of our readers will slip a few ten rupee notes in an envelope and send it to the League's Honorary Treasurer and thus help the League and have the lasting satisfaction that they have been assisting towards helping their fellow folk in distress.

The statement of accounts of the Post Office Savings Bank it published in the "Observer" of October 13. The balance due to depositors on March 31, 1912, amounted to Rs. 312,208.79 as against Rs. 293,437.16 of the balance for the year April 1, 1911. Deposits during the year totalled Rs. 277,113.19, interest on the deposits amounting to Rs. 5,307.32. Cash paid out during the year totalled Rs. 223,800.00, the balance for the year having been issued but not cashed at date of making up the balance. The reserve and expenditure account shows a loss of Rs. 10,621, but the inclusion of a balance of Rs. 110,623, interest on investments, which was due on March 31, 1912, but was not received until after that date, gives a net profit of Rs. 116,220.

An outgoing letter writes on that largely owing to governmental officials be was for a long time short of labor and his business was gradually paralyzed. For the shortage he had 100 natives, men and women, residing on his farm when they were sent for nearly two years to get registered and it was only by appealing to the highest authority that he has been enabled to fit up his natives again as in former years.

The total value of imports into Zanzibar during three months ending, June, 1912, was £4,053,529. Comparative analysis shows a large increase, having, supplied goods to the value of £1,748,071. The import trade with Great Britain totalled £1,292,100 (Germany Rs. 252,048, Holland £1,241,746, and the United States £1,136,029). British East Africa stands well with Zanzibar, the import trade being £1,341,746.

A motor cyclist narrowly escaped a severe accident the other day. Crossing a hillside towards the Ansonville Bridge on his motor cycle he was compelled to make a quick swerve in order to avoid a rock which lay suddenly into the middle of the road. As his machine had attained a considerable speed the cyclist was unable to recover his equilibrium after the swerve, and he fell head over heels into the ditch alongside.

Fortunately beyond sustaining a few minor bruises and scrapes he was none the worse of his mishap—nor was his cycle which escaped unslung.

In the interest of the Indian Community of Mombasa, whom I represent, consider it necessary and highly imperative to refer to us in so far as it relates to the Indians, the article which appeared in the weekly issue of the "East African Standard" of the 19th instant under the heading "Bangalore Agitation."

The heads of the various Indian Communities have all the time been in full sympathy with the Government in checking the progress of small jobs from the community. If we are to be fair, and they are still doing their best to help the authorities to arrest the spread of the epidemic.

The gathering of the Indians at Messrs. A. M. Joyce and Co's to which the article referred to took part in a deputation to the Acting Provincial Commissioner. The heads of their respective Communities, was quite orderly and there was not a single act of violence in any way present.

The object of the deputation was to clear certain points with regard to the treatment of persons after death and the segregation of the sick and their families.

And there was no question whatever of disregarding the orders of the Health Officer.

The attitude of the leading Indians who took part in the deputation to the Government offices was possibly quite peaceful but the attitude of the large crowd who gathered with them, armed with sticks, etc., and surrounded the Treasury buildings was certainly open to the severest criticisms.

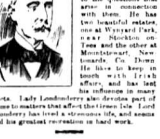

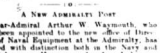

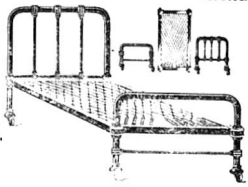

ANOTHER BIG HRAUL.

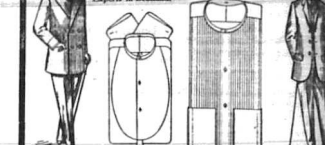
Mombasa, Oct. 29. Following on the demonstration in the Segregation Camp last Thursday, the women continued their more virulent attacks on the prospect of being compelled to enter an extended period of segregation. This morning a number of the women, who were dressed in their best, and accompanied by a great gathering of Arab and Swahili outside the Training Buildings on Battery Road, where their departure into the Segregation Camp was being awaited. Unlike the men, they were accompanied by their husbands. The gathering of the native class was quite devoid of tranquillity. In fact, there were a thousand people, including about three hundred women took part in the demonstration, the crowd was little more than a mob, other than in numbers, than the ordinary everyday gathering about the Law Courts. The women modestly separated themselves from the masculine rank and sought shelter from the fierce sun overhead under the shade of a tree by the trees and garden paths. The men formed groups about the road and under the trees in front of the Treasury, while others made themselves comfortable on the verandah and in the corridors of the building. In a sense the crowd appeared to quite understand the ideas that they had been previously subjected to, but some were dissatisfied at the outcome that they had reached.
