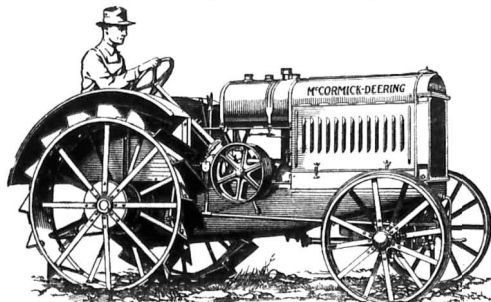

The seventeenth Annual General Meeting of the Lumbwa Co-operative Society of B.E.A. Limited, was held at the Engineers' office, the Company at Lumbwa on the 22nd September, when Mr. H. J. Carlisle, Chairman of the Board of Directors, presided over the representative gathering.

The Balance Sheet and accounts for the year ending 31st Dec. 1926 were presented and passed.

After the report of the Auditor had been read to the meeting, the Secretary, Mr. J. M. M. M., moving the adoption of the report and balance sheet said:

Your annual capital remains unchanged at Sh. 92,500, and although twelve new members have joined the Society during the year no new shares have been issued, the new money qualifying shares having been transferred from other members.

The Debenture issue of Sh. 40,000 was, with the consent of the holders, paid in full with interest in November last and does not therefore appear in this year's balance sheet.

Repairs and Renewals also in total of Sh. 9,000 and a word of explanation is perhaps called for. We have carried out several necessary though rather expensive items of repair, notably on the dam and water tower, the turbine and the concrete plant.

The Profit

The manufacturing profit for 1926 was Sh. 21,222, and of this amount Sh. 20,360 was set aside for the year.

At our last year's meeting our Chairman pointed out that there had been a drop of some 9 per cent, and for the year under review I am sorry to say that there is a further drop of not less than 12 per cent to report in other words the total drop in the quantity of our dairy supplies during the last two years amounts to the alarming figure of no less than 28 per cent.

The comparative figures of the supplies during the last two years are as follows—During 1925-26 we received 170,038 lbs. butterfat in 1925-26, we also received 25,223 gallons of milk during 1925-26 as against 69,734 gallons in the previous year.

The amounts paid out for these supplies, including a bonus of 10 per cent, which was also added to our statement holders, are: For butter fat in 1925-26 Sh. 964,600 as against Sh. 531,566 in 1924-25.

and for milk Sh. 22,831 in 1926-27 against Sh. 66,717 the year before. The total amounts paid to suppliers were, therefore, 1,031,431 in 1926-27 as against 1,031,431 in 1925-26, a gross difference of 84,100. The average price paid for butter fat was Sh. 1.28 per lb. and for milk Sh. 1.20 the year before.

Production Figures

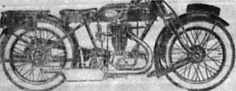

WHEN IS A DRIVER NOT A DRIVER?

A curious legal point was raised before the Curia's Magistrate recently, when a motorist was charged for driving a motor chassis illegally. The facts were thus:—An Italian was driving a motor chassis which was being towed by another car, and when passing a one-way street the prosecution alleged that he reversed and braked one of the riders off his machine. The Curia's Magistrate found that several points were submitted which showed that the motor chassis was not a light motor vehicle within the meaning of the Act, and accordingly, the defendant was not driving the vehicle because the engine was not functioning. It was added that it was not necessary for a man steering a low-alid vehicle to have a driver's licence, therefore he was not functioning as a driver. The Magistrate was unable to pronounce an opinion on the points raised and adjourned the case for consideration.

Expenditure on Road.

AMBITIOUS PROGRAMME IN AMERICA

Every country in the world is banding out on large programmes of expenditure on the making of roads and improved roads. Even Western Britain in the U. S. A. is spending more than 100 million pounds sterling between them in the year. In addition, huge sums are being squandered by the United States and middle west legislatures on road programmes, and in the latter Federal Government is now spending a very large sum of money on the same scheme as the Lincoln Highway and similar interstate roads. An ambitious road-building programme has been laid down in the Japanese Empire. A sum of 50,000,000 pounds sterling is to be spent over a period of five years on roads in that country. Road building is also being carried out on a large scale in India, and it is at this time that period the country is spending more than 100 million pounds on road programmes. Motor bus transportation is already increasing in Japan and the rate of increase is likely to be much accelerated before long. Even in such small States as Finland, Sweden and Norway, there have ever before been spent so much money on road construction as is being waded by road construction and municipalities in the U. S. A. In Brazil the revenue derived from tolls on automobiles, trucks, tractors, chains and road rollers amounts to a large, well-set, sum on roads.

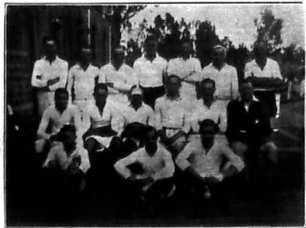

AN IDEALIST. The Retirement of Lord Cecil.

THE STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.
London, September 1.
Lord Cecil has left the Ministry and ceased to represent the country at the League of Nations because his policy is too drastic for the Government, and because he thinks that our progress towards disarmament is too unacceptably rapid.

In the published correspondence Mr. Baldwin mildly reproves him for trying to force his pace.

The Government can indeed claim that it is specially applicable to the League, but it does demand the right of prior negotiation with the Government, unobscured by matters of importance.

They are submitted to Geneva, Lord Cecil's retirement makes very little difference to the political situation and most people think that Mr. Baldwin has a very strong case.

Probably Lord Cecil will not be replaced at present in the Ministry since there is not much work to be done in his position as Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster.

Very few Ministers are in this country at the present time. Mr. Baldwin has gone to Aix after delivering a speech in Scotland, and in favour of settling our problems by mutual understanding rather than by political rearmament.

AMERICANS IN SEARCH OF GRASS.

Mountain Climbing in East Africa.

ARRIVED recently visitors to Kenya were Mr. T. W. Knight and Mr. B. A. Pennington, two distinguished sportsmen from the United States Department of Agriculture.

These two gentlemen who have now been in the country for some time, will be spending the next few days here for another five or six months, in making a study of the forage grasses of East Africa, and particularly of the mountain grasses which are indigenous to high altitudes.

It is hoped that some grasses may be found which will be suitable for introduction into the United States in the same way as Italian grass was introduced some years ago.

On Mountain Tops.

In spite of many difficulties, an expedition from Mount Kenia, which is the first American mission to be completed in this land. The climb was undertaken in connection with the work and during the course of it they succeeded in finding what they believe will prove to be some very valuable grasses. Much good work has been done at Nakuru where they have been assisted by the Agricultural Department.

It is hoped that during the next few months a trip will be made to the mountains of Kenya, and that the results may be of great value to the United States Department of Agriculture.

Already a large number of cases of grasses and seeds have been despatched to America.

SUMMER IN BRITAIN.

Making the Best of a Late Arrival.

London, Sept. 1.
After twenty-five days of it we have apparently turned up at the end of the season. We have had five consecutive fine days, and if we have been so lucky once we may have a good deal more. The weather has been very seriously impaired.

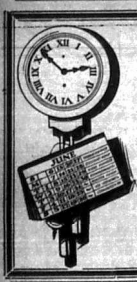

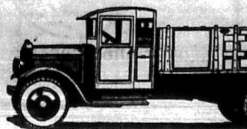

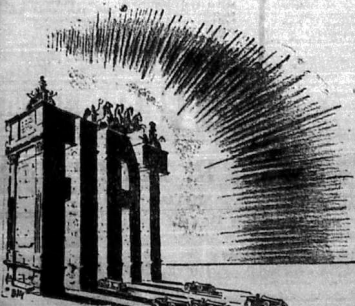

THE WATCH ON THE RHINE.

France Takes Up a Difficult Altitude.

STANDARD CORRESPONDENT, Paris, Oct. 1.—There are all sorts of statements and contradictions about the position with regard to the French situation in the Rhine. One paper states that the French have spoken favourably and another that no agreement is in sight.
 The British Ambassador, Lord Curzon, does not by any means regard the position as settled. France seems to have taken up a new attitude, but reports that the occupation of the Rhine territory by the armies of the Allies for fifteen years from the signing of the Treaty of Versailles was agreed upon primarily in connection with the means of reparation.
 That France should be secure from German invasion or attack is the second main reason for wanting to remain in the zone. The first, however, and will apply only to the zone of French territory, which has made and continues to make, the position an extremely difficult one.
 M. Briand has altered, somewhat the optimistic character of his remarks in regard to it. He has announced that the number of the French troops to be maintained in the zone is no more than as he originally thought.
 It is in this position that the French are now sitting. The fact that when the League was formed the French did not give France adequate security to which she is entitled.
 The Commercial Treaty.
 Meanwhile, the commercial treaty between France and Germany has been signed and sealed. The negotiations were long and tedious and the drawing up of the various clauses was a laborious task. That they have been negotiated by the satisfaction of both parties is at any rate, a relief.
 The agreement covers in fact the last few days of September deals with nearly all matters which each country exports. They will apply what is known as the "favourable" treatment. Wines and such produce as fruit grown in France have been especially favoured, however, and on the other side, the chemical, electrical, and mechanical industries of Germany have received outstanding consideration.

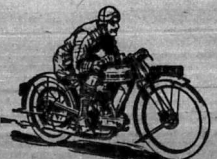
