"GORILLA SERMONS."

Heated Controversy in the Church of England.

THE PRIMATE INTERVENS.

The Moderator teaching of the Bishop of Birmingham who declared some years ago that a faith which is tied to bad science has no driving force, has led to a controversy in the Church of England.

The Archbishop of Canterbury in reply to an open letter by the Bishop believes that the latter overrates the adherence of thoughtful people to the dogmas of the Book of Faith, but with his reference to the Sacrament had given real offence to a great body of Church people.

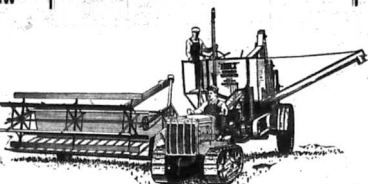

THE STOCK INDUSTRY.

Methods of Control of East Coast Fever.

DIPPING, FENCING AND INOCULATION.

The problems of the cattle industry were discussed in considerable detail by the Convention of Associations on Tuesday last week with the assistance of the Acting Director of Agriculture, the Chief Veterinary Officer and the Veterinary Research Officer.

An important step forward was taken by a resolution which asked Government to introduce legislation permitting districts by the system of local option to abolish squatter-owned cattle.

The officers of the Veterinary Department gave a review of the work which is being done to In a more detailed check on the ravages of East Coast Fever. They maintained that the best method of control was by compulsory dipping, compulsory fencing and inoculation.

It was stated that a Cattle Cleansing Bill and a Fencing Bill were under consideration by Government.

NEW LEGISLATION BEING CONSIDERED.

Mr. Ooster (Lalipia) on behalf of his association introduced the following motion:

That this Convention do please the fact that Government had not seen fit to implement the resolutions passed at the Stockowners Conference in January last, with respect to the reference to resolution No. 29 which reads:

This Conference is of opinion that Government should be urged to take immediate steps for the prohibition of native-owned cattle in settled areas as one such step is a necessary one for their retention.

He said that the resolutions of the Stock Owners Conference regarding cattle had been accepted and their own Veterinary Officer in Lalipia, Major Mellor, had taken a position to inform them that they were not going to have any more farms. He was directly approachable to the Government. He stated that he had written to the Government to give their support to the motion in the way of the Government, suggested, the needs of other industries. They could not contend with the position unless they got rid of squatter cattle and understood that. Everybody should have an absolute right to do what they liked so long as he did not interfere with his neighbors but his own neighbors were making squatter cattle which were a danger to him then there was no such legislation to regulate the position.

The resolution was amended: Mr. J. G. Gillet proposed the resolution on behalf of his association. The resolution was amended to the principle of local option (free land).

He also said that made quite clear. At a meeting of the district they had a vote to see how many people would vote for squatter cattle. They would not see any assistance from Government. He was very much pleased that they all agreed to do it themselves. One member who objected was the manager of a large cattle farm. He was ready to give his lands and his point was that his laborers did not take their sheep into the area. In cattle were there had their cattle on the farm running with the other.

Unanimously Requested.

Mr. R. Hall supported the amendment and asked for a unanimous vote. The district asking for it was one comprising the following: Thionon, Fala, Oligi and Nanyuki—and no other part of the country was affected in the least.

Chief Officer (Mumt) said the Chief Veterinary Officer's proposal regarding dipping of sheep had gone. The resolution rather left open the question of whether for every cattle disease he could secure a sheep as a source of infection.

Colonel Griffith said there was a motion in the Convention that would support the resolution of the Convention. It was that the Government of the words "all other stock" and if it was not wanted to include sheep and goats in the abolition of squatter cattle they could do so.

Mr. Ooster did not think his association would accept that and Mr. Anderson who withdrew his motion said that he was not inclined to have squatters without both sheep and cattle.

The Chairman said that the motion proposed by Mr. Ooster (Lalipia) was not in order.

Mr. R. E. Gillet (Nanyuki) said he could not understand the motion proposed by the Executive Committee speaker as the motion was not in order. 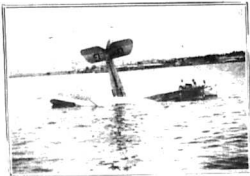

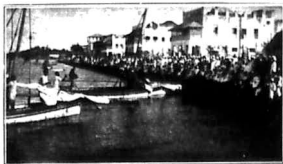

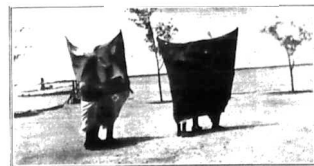

Conversion School for Farm School System.

Mr. Boshua (Northern Plains Farmers Association) introduced Resolution No. 11 to the Convention...

That this Convention calls for support Farm Schools on a much wider extent...

Mr. P. J. O'Connell (Lakshia) supported the original motion. He stated that in Lakshia there were about 30 children growing up who were receiving no education at all...

At present, he continued, a large amount of money was being spent on a central school at Eldoret. That was all right for so far as went, but the position of the Dutch people was that they always had large families—often as many as 15 children—and they were being educated in all their children to expensive boarding schools. He therefore asked for the support of members for this motion which would assist very greatly in getting the children educated.

Taught to be Farmers. In Mr. Lush's opinion white children should be taught to be farmers and agricultural education taken as a compulsory subject in Labour was included on the farms and in the schools. It was to be taught. They had been farmers who had been brought to the colony 20 years ago and he appealed to members to agree to the supporting vote to the Government to put such schools in a far greater extent than was done at present.

Mr. J. L. Lush (Nairobi) seconded the motion. He said that he had considerable knowledge of the question and he knew that it was quite impossible for many of these children to be sent to boarding schools.
