"BUY KENYA FLOUR"

Interesting Correspondence from the Districts.

The following letters have been received from country correspondents on the subject of the use of Kenya flour. The matter is also dealt with on page 23 of this issue.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard": Sir—As a home-bread maker of some 20 years in Kenya I cannot join with Mr. T. A. Wood in his denigration on Kenya flour.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard": Sir—Please pardon me for taking up some of your valuable space, but I have allowed that "Patriotic" feeling to overcome my good sense of economy, but I have found the former outweighed the latter and the dear article is, inevitably, cheaper in the end.

Kenya flour would too much be relied upon. When one lives near the loaves naturally one does not buy the large quantity at a time, that shows "buy in the bulk" is an obligation to buy. If it is bad, the best buyer by doing "good" will be a loser.

Kenya flour appears to have no "standard quality"; it is like "this girl" that is "Right down the middle of her."

When she was good, she was good. But when she was nasty, she was horrid!

Watch the baker's bread! This week it may be possible, next week it makes one feel what a lot of long suffering souls—folk I mean—are out there who are anxious to make other people rich by allowing a heavy duty to be imposed upon imported flour. Were that duty removed it would be sold cheaper than the present price of local flour, notwithstanding the fact that some from Bombay with the Kenya's Uganda flour might be added to it. It is some folk had had their eye too long on the prize which would have been imposed upon it.

Kenya's letters do not mention good bread because Kenya millers Kenya farmers do not produce a standard quality of wheat and in my experience I can go into any of those Flour Mills or Mr. T. A. Wood and still not only know I have made my bread but how I have ground my own flour, and there we get to breadmaking.

When that will not produce good brown flour, will be to turn good white flour and every one of good wheat we ground we had several of this, and the other kind.

I do not think people get into raptures over the bread that is baked and sold without the use of white flour. Nairobi. So when Jungu wa Kamau drops the bread that he baked upon your face, when he is explaining that it is not his "Moi Kenya" and you remember that it is his head, he tells you, as the head of the household, not an article in the public eye of dough poisoning!

MAD POLICE BY BULL SHOT

European and Native Charged and Injured.

Nairobi was provided with an exciting episode on Tuesday afternoon when a wild and savage native bull assailed a considerable amount of trouble-making and pertendent of Police, in the role of a firebrand, drew the attention of the crowd.

There was varying opinion as to whether or not bull fights should be allowed in civilized countries but the incident in question is the matter on Tuesday.

Shortly after 3.30 p.m. a bull appeared on the vacant plot of ground adjoining the Fire Station and behind the Court House—one who knows where it came from or to whom it belonged; gradually one by one knew what had been the origin of its appearance. The fact remains that it was in a more temper charging anyone and anything of its kind.

Charged the Crowd.

A large crowd of Europeans, Indians and natives rapidly but slowly collected on Tuesday afternoon to witness a bull fight. The bull made a rush at a section of the crowd which dispersed as quickly as possible. That it is not always easy to get away from an attacking bull and that some people sought refuge under a nearby building and had to be rescued, will suffice to show the attention of the crowd.

European Tamed.

Another native, who could not find a motor car, was tamed and led to be carried away, having had full control in the procedure. A European who was standing watching had his attention attracted by something else and when he remembered the bull again he was just in time to receive a charge in the chest.

In falling, his head struck the wall of the building behind him and caused a nasty wound which required treatment at the dispensary.

Police in Force.

By this time the Police were on the scene in force though there was little that they could do. The bull seeking trouble to conquer, left that site and charging down River Road cleared a passage wider than the fire engine. Passing the Salvation Army Hall, he took up another stand on an open plot behind the Railway Station.

The Counter Attack.

Here another crowd collected—more cars and lorries being used as barricades.

Capt. Rice, the Superintendent of Police, Mr. Forbes Bassett, and the Veterinary Officer for the Nairobi area, arrived on the scene. The car containing the Police drove into the arena, which was about 20 yards in width between the stands—waiting.

A Final Charge.

Two axle from a revolver fired from the car set it through the shoulder blade, and Capt. Rice was then descended from the car and approached the animal whilst native onlookers shouted excited warnings.

Suddenly without previous indication, a wounded bull put his head down and tried to charge again. Capt. Rice fired and brought the animal to his knees. It rose again but two further shots killed it—the crowd cheering in approval by hilarious cheering. Then another bull appeared, not much excited but left it in-embly ended. Many and varied rumors were circulated regarding damage which had been done but no confirmation of any other than that stated above could be obtained.

EXTENSION OF INFLUENCE OF THE E.A.W.I.

New Branch Formed in Kericho Area.

(FROM A CORRESPONDENT.)
ALTHOUGH the East African Women's League has many members in the scattered Districts of Lumbwa, Kericho and Soke, all acknowledged by Mrs. E. W. Kenkel, a Branch of the League has been formed in Kericho, and for this purpose, the President (Mrs. E. W. Kenkel) and Mrs. Turner, went to Kericho last week for the formation of Mrs. E. W. Kenkel as the nucleus in the Kericho District. Those members were adequate for a large gathering, the meeting being held in the premises of the Kericho Club. The members of the League and their friends assembled some after 10 a.m.

Mrs. Turner addressed the meeting, expressing her thanks to Mrs. E. W. Kenkel for all she had done to disseminate interest in the work of the League in so scattered an area.

Value of the League.
Among other reasons why it was worth joining the League was the explanation that by doing so the individual woman in the League is able to get the help of an experienced Committee to advise her on the many subjects of importance to women. Individual women whose ideas were often far ahead and more valuable by reason of their isolation were able, through their District Committees, to give them the benefit of the League, whose aims were discussed and often acted upon.

Another reason for joining was that though a branch might meet only very occasionally, members could still keep in touch with each other and what other branches and the League as a whole. Mrs. Turner's views were going from the Kericho District, and she received a report from Headquarters one month. The President expressed a hope that one day the report would be replaced by a Women's League Magazine. She stated that besides such material reasons, there was the ideal to be held in view, explaining the separations of the League and its attitude to the spirit of service and co-operation.

A Human Zoo.

She said she had heard the Colony district of a "Human Zoo" which was situated in the Zoological Gardens, and the size of a small football pitch. The zoo was said to be built on a site in Kericho and most local interest was taken in the recent trip to Kericho. She thought the League, which had been founded on women and children, would be a place where people of all ages, and of all races, would be brought in contact with the growth of the native Kenya. The Native and International Women's League, numbering three and a half million in the world, and with the knowledge that would minister and ministered to increase in size and numbers was an enormous boon to humanity everywhere. 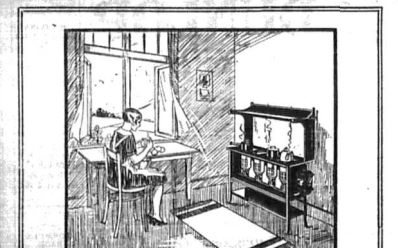

EMPIRE'S LARGEST INDUSTRY.

ation of papers which now appear in numbers often difficult to obtain. At the same time the shortage of the larger number of publications would in a few years provide a wonderful reference library from which Empire contributors should be able to obtain detailed information by means of copies of the original papers, or the one of papers in languages other than English, French or German, translation of the original papers. Another function of the bureau would be to arrange a central facility towards the papers produced each year and to review all of these and issue advance material. One central bureau would be established considerably in advance local and national newspapers, and work with special emphasis on dissemination of value. It is obvious that a central bureau composed of very experienced men would be attempted and of little utility when completed.

To be of the greatest value some degree of experience from the Colonies should first be time work in the central bureau and may ultimately be put on foot. It is suggested that the headquarters of this bureau, the Imperial Bureau of the East India Office should be at Rotterdam-Bureau Institute. Here, the Library already in existence would supply the nucleus around which the Bureau could be built, and the research workers there would produce the critical feature in the annual review of advances made.

Chain of Research Stations.

The Research special sub-committee of the Imperial Conference is referring to the possibility of establishing new Research Stations in suitable centres in the tropical and sub-tropical parts of the Empire, pointed out that the suitable sites in the creation of these research stations should be decided together in common with the Colonial Governments and providing a service fund for loans and the interchange of ideas and men throughout the Empire. The Government of the Empire have agreed to establish a chain of research stations in the Tropics and sub-tropical regions. The new investigations, of Tanganyika, Kenya, Uganda, Zanzibar, Northern Rhodesia and Nyasaland, are providing between them an annual contribution amounting to £20,000 and the Empire Marketing Board is making a grant up to one-third of the total running cost, not exceeding £10,000 and may increase. ENO DAMAGES AGAINST TIMAY NEWSPAPER.

Judgment has been given by the Judge of the Subordinate Court, Nairobi, in the case of Enoch D. Abbot versus Timay Newspaper. The plaintiff, Enoch D. Abbot, was a member of the Kenya Indian Association. The defendant, Timay Newspaper, published an article in its issue of the 10th of October, 1927, which contained a number of statements which were defamatory to the plaintiff. The Judge found in favour of the plaintiff and awarded damages of £1,000.

Work and Objects of the 1926 Memorial Settlers' Memorial Association.

£4,000,000 CAPITAL INTRODUCED.

Something of the work of the 1926 Memorial Settlers' Association to encourage white settlement in South Africa is told in the following interview with the organizing secretary of the Association, now in Kenya to advise Government in connection with Settlement schemes.

In six years this public spirited body of South Africans has introduced 2,900 settlers with £4,000,000 new capital.

HOW THE SETTLER IS ASSISTED.

["E. A. Standard" Special.]

Mr. C. N. Hoy, the Organizing Secretary for the 1926 Memorial Settlers' Association, of South Africa, is at present visiting Kenya today at the invitation of E. R. O. Omer, the Director with the object of consulting with the Advisory Committee regarding Land Settlement.

Mr. Hoy hopes that the experience which has been gained by the Association through Africa will be of use to Kenya. In an interview with the Standard this morning Mr. Hoy told something of the work which has been accomplished by his Association from during the past three years.

The first organized body of British immigrants in South Africa arrived in the country in 1820. The first settlers consisted of those settlers identified with the 'Cape Colony' (dam of the first forebears, Committee was set up to deal with the matter. These took the form of 'Memoranda' of the settlement of the country. It was also done in connection with the land policy on eight points.

During the celebration the idea was conceived of doing something in the most practical way in the country. The reason for this was that there was no Government in this part of the Union of South Africa which will have a definite policy on these points.

It was decided to form a Settlers' Association and Sir Charles Price, K.C.M.G., then in the country was elected Chairman. He has since made considerable progress upon the furtherance of this work, as General Manager of the Association, Land Coll. G. O. Morris, C.M.I. D.S.O., was appointed.

As it is today the Head Office of the organization is in South Africa. In addition to the office in Cape Town there are also offices in Johannesburg, Durban, Johannesburg and in India. These offices perform various duties, such as the registration and the selection of land. The work is divided into six areas, each of which is under the supervision of a full-time official who deals with all the business connected with the settlement of the country. Within these areas local committees are fitted up to deal with the work.

Dealing with the Settler. Prospective settlers are assisted by one of the various offices. The main consideration is the settlement of the settler, education and the work of the settler.
