For the weakness of the Egyptian fleet the East African coast there are several causes. 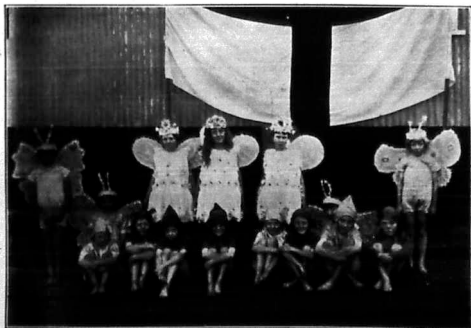

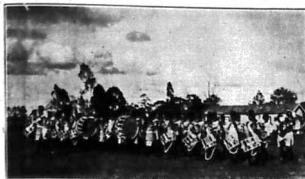

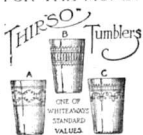

70 ACRES FOR A HOTEL. Government Land Grant at Nyeri.

The plot is 70 acres in extent and the lease restricts its use to an hotel and auxiliary purposes. The reply to the latter portion of the question is in the affirmative, subject to the approval of the powers under Section 6 of the Crown Lands Ordinance, Cap. 140 (Revised Edition).

A NEW DURBAN OF THE EAST COAST.

Private Bridge Scheme for Mombasa and the Mainland.

OPENING UP NYALI ESTATES.

Negotiations are now practically completed for an important development by private enterprise at Mombasa—a bridge between the island and the mainland which, its promoters believe, will be one of the first steps in the development of a new Durban of the East Coast—a pleasure resort with bathing beaches and bungalows and all the attractions of a modern seaside resort. The bridge is intended to open up the Nyali Estates on the mainland and the outlines of the proposed project below.

A SYSTEM OF TOLLS.

If a scheme at present under consideration materializes Kenya is likely to have before many years a seaside resort which will be one of the most desirable on the East Coast. The scheme embodies the construction of a bridge connecting the island with the mainland between English Point and the proposed bridge.

The proposal was first made in long ago in 1923 by Mr. H. B. Brown representing the Nyali Estates Limited who own a large amount of land on the mainland. The idea was originally received by the District Commissioner and indeed by every responsible body in the island. Then when Mr. Brown was in England making arrangements for the laying out of his scheme, for some time the idea has never been quite fully explained the Government officials. No further steps were taken in the matter until last year when the Government was advised and the motor launch that was the result of an objection on the part of Government to the building of the bridge.

The Cost.

The plan has now been drawn up for a position bridge of 1,000 feet in length and the cost of the bridge and the contracts are placed the Nyali Estates and Development Company (as Mr. Brown's company is called) is asking for a definite assurance from Government that Government will be liable for the cost of the bridge.
