BRITAIN'S LATEST FOOD SLOGAN

(STANDARD CORRESPONDENT)

London, April 4.
Trade slogans are popular in this country and we are attracted by another. We have already had "Drink more Milk" and "Eat more Fruit" which were very successful. This time it is "Eat more Fish." After an experience London debate in the Commons today about this slogan and the attitude of the busy people who catch it, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the public to benefit the travellers and their own health by eating more fish.

WORLD OF INTEREST IN FERTILISATION.

The Improvement of the Soil.

PLANT FOODS

A considerable amount of attention is being given to the subject of fertilising the soil which may be done in various ways. The following are the main methods which are used to those farmers and gardeners who have an opportunity to improve their soil.

The most common method is the use of manure. This is a natural product of the animal kingdom and contains a large amount of nitrogen, phosphorus and potash. It is the best natural source of these elements in the shape of bones. The use of bones is a very valuable plant food which has been used for centuries. Danish Demands.

With such losses, it is not surprising that there would be a demand for more fertilisers. The Danish Government has made a study of the situation in Denmark and other countries, and has decided to take steps to improve the soil.

The relatively large consumption of fertilisers in Danish farms is well known, and on analysis of the various markets used to give in a report for 1925 published by the Danish Co-operative Fertilising Company.

Artificial fertilisers are used on nearly all Danish farms and based on statistics collected from some 10,000 farms, it is shown that 98 per cent of Danish farms use nitrogen fertilisers, 90 per cent of Danish farms use artificial phosphate fertilisers, and 84 per cent of Danish farms use artificial potash fertilisers. The total consumption was approximately 110,000 tons of superphosphate, 110,000 tons of artificial phosphate, and 17,000 tons of potash fertilisers.

MOTOR TOPICS

AMATEUR FITTING OUT.


Removing Split Pins and Obtaining Nuts.

PRACTICAL HINTS

There are many very simple things that a driver will find it necessary to know in the course of his amateur fitting out. One of the most common is the removal of split pins and the obtaining of nuts. This is a very simple matter, and one which can be done in a few minutes. The first thing to do is to remove the split pin. This can be done by using a pair of pliers to grip the pin at one end and pulling it out. If the pin is stuck, it may be necessary to use a screwdriver to pry it out. Once the pin is removed, the next step is to obtain a nut. This can be done by using a nut driver to turn the nut onto the bolt. If the nut is stuck, it may be necessary to use a screwdriver to pry it out. Once the nut is obtained, it can be used to secure the bolt. The Death Penalty.

EFFECT OF THE AMENDED REGULATIONS.

STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.

The death penalty for soldiers and airmen on active service will be abolished, according to the amended regulations of the Government, which were introduced by the Government Bill introduced by the Secretary for War (Sir L. Worthington-Evans) in a recent Session which will not be longer be punishable with death any soldier leaving a commanding officer to go in search of plunder, forcing a capitulation, forcing or striking a soldier, breaking into any house or other place in search of plunder, when acting as a sentry, sleeping or being drunk on a post, striking or using or offering violence to a superior officer in the execution of his office, disobeying in such a manner as to show a willful defiance of authority, and lawful commands given personally by a superior officer in the execution of his office, allowing or interfering with any act against without authority.

The only military offence now punishable with death will be: Mutiny, treason, cowardice, desertion and leaving a garrison, without orders or, in the case of a sentry, leaving a post with both being regularly recorded.

A War Record.

Most of the offences now proposed to be exempted from the death penalty have actually been in that position for many years and in the British Army were shot, and in nearly every case the offence was cowardice or desertion in the face of the enemy. Only two were shot for "When acting as a sentry sleeping on a post."

The proposal that this offence should no longer be liable to the death penalty is the most reasonable one in the Bill. Only three years ago the Departmental Committee, appointed to investigate the question of the death penalty, reported that they had given special attention to this particular offence and had come to the conclusion that "in view of the grave consequences which the offence might entail, it is necessary to retain the death penalty."

Musical Passages.

NEW DEVICE WITH GREAT POSSIBILITIES.

STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.

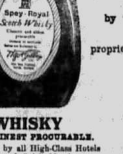

THREE DAYS TIME LIMIT.

Wafd Government Postpones Further Consideration of Public Assemblies Bill.

Britain has presented an ultimatum to Egypt demanding the withdrawal of the provocative Public Assemblies Bill which the Wafd Government has introduced.

In a statement in the House of Commons the British Foreign Secretary explained that the effect of the new Bill if implemented would be to weaken the hands of the Executive and the Police and jeopardise the lives and property of foreigners.

The British Chamberlain recalled the serious but friendly warnings that had been issued by Britain four times in time, despite which the present Egyptian Government had proceeded with the objectionable measure.

In reply to a question as to whether part of the Fleet had been ordered to Egypt the Foreign Secretary said he added to nothing that he had said already.

In the meantime further consideration of the Public Assemblies Bill in the Egyptian Parliament has been postponed until November, but whether or not this meets the demands of the British Government remains to be seen.

There has been an amazing transformation in the health of the British people since the advent of the Quaker Oats cereal, the chief medical officer of the Ministry of Health and the Board of Education.

He declared recently at the British Medical Association House, in Tavistock square, on "The Foundation of National Health": "The health we give to our countrymen. Sir Charles Hastings, founder of the B.M.A., which he started in the board room of the Old Library, Westmore in 1857. Though the population has more than doubled, and the general death-rate for England and Wales has been halved since 1880, the child mortality under five for London is now about one third of what it was; the number of deaths under fifty years of age is now 70 per cent, as compared with 71 per cent in 1880; and the expectation of life at birth has been extended by as much as twelve years for boys and fourteen years for girls."

In other words, the premature death of little children has been enormously reduced, the inflection of sickness of adults has been more halved, and life has been prolonged.

Problem of Health.
"The fundamental problem of health is the way and structure of the body. Now, can we say its pH and isopotential are in what such nature's course? Here is your body with its nature, its heredity, its structure, its organic motions, impulse, and organic functions; that instrument of sense, intellect, and will—a living organism of long biological history. I think we can, but only in general terms, perhaps, define, one term. Nutrition is the answer."
"The elements of nutrition for the body are as in number: Food, fresh air and sunlight, exercise of the body, warmth, cleanliness, and rest."
"Let us consider for a moment the most important of these: food. It is of vital importance. Food, warm, and essential food, is the direct cause of such preventable disease, and more people suffer from eating too much than too little."

"It is common knowledge that a man should be well and healthy; should be sound in quality; should be vigorous in action; should be energetic and appetizing and dignified. It should contain some protein, such as meat, fish, milk, bread, cheese, eggs, peas, beans, lentils, etc., as in its composition, butter must, last, dropping, olive oil, some carbohydrates, as in oat, sugar, bread, potatoes, rice, and starchy foods."

Mineral Salts.

"The body also needs, moreover, salts contained in such, chosen, eggs, green vegetables, the long two-furrowing, a considerable bulk of chlorine, and a small amount in stimulating alimentary material. Lead, then, on fat substance, essential for growth and nutrition as vitamins present in extremely minute quantity in various foods."

Finally, there are some food rules which it is expedient to adopt:

- (1) Strict and persistent moderation in diet leads to longevity, and excess tends to early mortality.
- (2) Nature has provided that if should not be over-eaten, should reach the stomach slow.
- (3) The number of meals (about five) is a matter of individual practice and custom, but for general more than forty years of age they are usually too frequent.
- (4) No food should be taken between such regular meals, because eating, intermittently gives the body no rest.
- (5) A small quantity of beverage with the meal is desirable, but there should be no excess of alcohol—alcohol is not in ordinary circumstances a source of health; there should be as a rule, no alcohol before meals or between meals, and none for children.
- (6) There should be no excessive immediately after a meal.
- (7) Sir George, speaking of the necessity for exercise, said: "Exercise has its advantages, but we must beware of becoming all liver and no legs." To walk, to the station is better than to take an omnibus.

"It may be said, speaking generally, that most people stand in greater need of rest than of movement. Our American custom and opinion of having much too rest for good health, or even mental capacity or balance. There is an excess of noise, chatter, cluttering, and meaningless activities which have no value or virtue in themselves and are directly harmful. Indeed, children require quiet, restfulness, and rest in order to grow and ripen, and then to work in their own way. Men's student inspection, talents, on the walls of her House of Children at Rome."

A Defect Which is Shared by Several Courts!

The condition of housing in one of Nairobi's worst shum districts was discussed in a case in the Resident Magistrate's Court yesterday. A native woman named "Titi" was charged with having failed to comply with a sanitary order which was issued on February 3, and which instructed her to demolish the premises in which she was living on account of the fact that they harbored rats.

Mr. V. V. Hladke, who appeared for the accused said that there were a large number of these cases and he appeared in most of them. The houses in question belonged to Indians and were made of thorn and wattle.

Mr. Dambale said that he considered that the day of wattle and daub flats in the township area had passed, and the fact that some cases about 1915 did not alter this case.

Mr. Hladke Campbell the Municipal Commissioner of Health said that he knew the premises which were made of wattle and daub and had made of soap tins and mud. They were situated in Kaburuti, near to the Nairobi slaughter house. He had seen definite evidence of rat infestation throughout the area.

REMEDIES PROPOSED.

Last year on behalf of the Governments of Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika, Mr. Charles H. B. A. Assistant Naturalist on the staff of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries made a fishing survey of Lake Victoria Nyanza.

Before returning to England last month Mr. Graham compiled a preliminary report which is restricted to comments with occasional surveys of some of the observations which he made during the latter half of the survey to go together with reliable records for future reference.

The expert stresses the danger of overfishing and suggests remedies to meet the danger. His recommendations that the Governments concerned should obtain complete control of the fishing industry in the lakes by establishing a monopoly in the sale of manufactured nets and the prohibition of hand made nets unless they fulfil certain specified conditions.

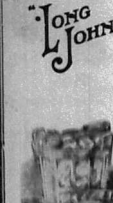
