**Land Surveys. "Sally"**

**GOVERNMENT CONTROL IN TANZANIA. A SUCCESSFUL DEBATE.**

A Bill with the twofold object of expediting and protecting the practice of land surveying and of the protecting the interests of the natives who may be themselves as well as the Government. The Bill is intended to be introduced to the Legislative Council of Tanganyika Territory to be read in three sittings and reasons it is explained that this is all ground which has been surveyed and the only relevant Ordinances in force at the time of the Bill, which give power to such officers to enter upon lands. The Bill, which does not apply to surveys made by Government officers for payment to the Government, does not prohibit licensed persons from making or causing to be made surveys for the purpose of ascertaining the boundaries. It further provides that a survey shall not be accepted for the purpose of the preparation of title to land unless it is made by a licensed surveyor. A license will be issued by the Board of Control after examination, or upon certain other evidence of his qualifications. A Register of persons licensed will be kept in the Gazette in order that the public may be informed who are entitled to practice under this Ordinance. Control over the professional conduct of surveyors will be exercised by the Board and a surveyor's license may be suspended or cancelled in any of the events mentioned in the Bill.

**Native Foodstuffs.**

**RESTRICTIONS IN DUGO AND KILIFI AREAS.**

Intention is given in the Kenya Official Gazette of a resolution of the Native Foodstuffs Ordinance, in connection with native foodstuffs. 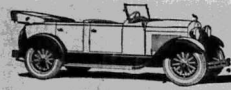

Land Alienation Must be Accompanied by Fuller Protection to the Tribe.

Dr. Col. J. M. Lewellyn, ex-Officer Commanding Troops in Kenya and within recent years in charge of the Northern Frontier Province, recently sent to the "East African Standard" an article on the Samburu arising out of the discussions on "The Protected Land" which took place among settlers in the Convention and outside at the end of 1927.

Dr. Lewellyn, whose article was written before the recently announced decision of the Secretary of State to cede 880,000 acres of the area in question for white settlement to the Samburu, some 300,000 acres and grant 600,000 acres in suspense, says the present position of the Samburu is:

They have no more land than they need to graze their herds in a bad season and no more land can be taken from them unless Government can find them land to the north with adequate protection.

How this position can be met he also explains.

most of national schools for instance. In regard to native education, responsibility will be discharged through the payment of grants to all missionary societies which there was not an absence of technical education. There were national schools with a bias for technical education. There was no definite plan as to the lines of technical education and it fell to the young Director to make a selection of the lines. The move was made in a certain measure, although it is a case that even in the years of peace the one for education came very near the end of the list in the financial department.

By continued representation of progressive policy the Director of Education called the Director of Education to a Commission in 1917 which sat for two years and finally produced a report shortly after the arrival of the Governor in 1919. This report approved and developed the proposals of the Education Department. It was decided that when funds had been raised a central school should be established at Kabete, to which boys from Nakuru, Eldoret and other districts were to be sent. This building, although this report was issued in 1919, the school at Kabete is only now in its construction. Another recommendation was that by the Commission led it down concerning African schools that it should be conducted largely like the form of vocational training of the Government. The training of teachers in the hands of the Government was left there should be no Government school for Africans. Owing to the War a central school proposed for Nakuru had been the only institution left standing at the time of the report that that at Mbatia.

**Native Training.**

Another relative deal with the education for native training. It concerned the preparation of schools and technical education. The structures were drawn up with regard to the education to be given by mission schools. The idea of the Director was the establishment of model Government schools on each district necessitating the work of the mission schools. 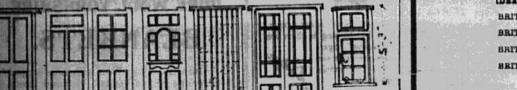

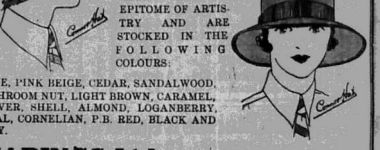

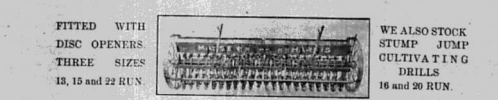

HE ADDRESSES THE KIKABURRI FARMERS.

FROM A CORRESPONDENT.

On May 2, His Excellency the Governor, the Hon. Lord Lugard paid a visit to the Kikaburri District. They were met at Turbo by Mr. H. C. Kiburri, Chairman of the Kikaburri Farmers' Association, and Mr. E. A. Johnson, who guided them, by way of Mt. Kikaburri, where they enjoyed the morning tea, by Mr. O'Brien's farm where they inspected the coffee.

They then spent some time at Sotiro. Hill from which a good view of the upper Kikaburri Valley was obtained. Subsequently they were entertained at lunch at the house of the Rev. E. W. Hastings by the Kikaburri Farmers' Association. A representative gathering of about thirty or more was present.

All the places mentioned. Mr. Patten made a short speech on behalf of the Governor, and His Excellency in reply expressed himself much pleased with the look of the district and the fact that he had seen, especially concerning its most cultivated appearance. He stated further that depending upon the aspect of the Government, he will take steps to see that the district is placed for those with large estates, but that such with little or no capital could succeed here. # MOTING TOPICS



**OVERTAKING.**  
**THE THROTTLE.**  
**Concerning Hand and Foot Control.**

**A DANGEROUS PRACTICE.**  
**PROS AND CONS.**

Up-hill, a power shift is a error almost, and yet it is the cause of the most serious accidents. A sudden lurch, as the low level, is an approved error, and the hand and foot control down the engine of the car.  
 The alternative presented to the driver of the motor car is that of them placing (points out "The Motor") his foot on the accelerator pedal which will proceed at full throttle in an endeavor to get in front of the two-wheeler, or allowing the coming car to cut in front of him. The latter is the more polite and safer course of making heavily and getting behind the two-wheeler.

Mistake such as these often occur through ignorance of road conditions and the speed of the car. The motor does not realize that the overtake is not only as much as the difference in the speed of two vehicles, but also the amount of passing, which takes considerably longer than is anticipated. Again, the car is not slow for the fact that the car is in a rush drive in a dry-uphill that in the case on the level or on a downward slope.

A proper application of relative speeds would also save many drivers from the mistake of passing in a narrow lane, or on a steeply ascending vehicle causing a collision. The driver of the motor car should approach one another in the same way, that is, depending on the estimate of the road, which is to estimate the rate at which a vehicle is moving when it is overtaken.

Lack of imagination also plays a part, some drivers being apparently incapable of recognizing the fact that the hand up ahead, be it a hand, arm, neck, or hump-backed bridge, must be regarded as something on coming car right up to the moment at which a clear view can be obtained.

Lately, there is a mad dog, the man who, knowing the danger, disregards it in an endeavor to save a few seconds. As he will find his hand up ahead, he will find his car in the neighborhood of one-

fifth of a second, and cannot, to consider a serious. Furthermore, no one would wish to drive with one foot constantly on the accelerator pedal, so that, in any case, since we will be needed to move forward from the footboard. It therefore seems hardly surprising that the driver to change over to the hand throttle as a safety measure.

However, the hand pedal should not continue to be regarded, as it can be made very useful on occasions. For example, when travelling on an extremely rough stretch of road, a sudden jolt, foot control is often advisable, and it is a good plan to use the hand control, and remove the foot entirely from the accelerator pedal. As a long means of run the hand control, the driver to save himself fatigue.

When driving in traffic it is often necessary to slow down or when running up behind another vehicle, and this involves using the brake pedal, while the driver may wish to, at the same time, to take down to a lower gear. Here it will be found that the hand throttle is a very useful device for the hand-throttling process, the hand foot working the clutch and the right foot applying the brake.

Then, again, when starting up a steep hill, it will usually be found that a smoother gear change is accomplished by holding the car with the brake pedal and moving the engine by hand rather than by the accelerator pedal. It may seem surprising that this is not a more common practice, but it is interesting to note that drivers at the best of times seldom are taught to start cars in this way.

If it is agreed that in general running a foot control for the throttle is the best method, then it is a strong case for establishing the position of the accelerator pedal. The movement of the right foot from the hand throttle to the accelerator pedal is a likely to be very awkward, and when changing over to a car with a right-hand pedal, the hand foot working the clutch and the right foot driving the car.

THE NATIVE POLICIES OF EASTERN AFRICA.

No. 1.

THE TANGANYIKA MODEL.

Supporting the Power of the Hereditary Chiefs under Supervision.

This is the first of a series of articles on native policies of Eastern Africa. The articles are specially written in a manner which it is hoped will be informative rather than critical. No comparison between the policies of each territory will be attempted and the intention is simply to set out, as briefly but clearly as possible, the fundamental principles and aims of the separate Governments.

Tanganyika has been selected for the first articles of the series because in that Territory the Government has recently introduced a very complete policy, related closely to the hereditary principles of the Uganda people, whereas that ruling chiefs are given full support to control their own people with little or no indirect control and advice from the Central Government, in other words the best of western civilizing influences may be grafted on sound native stock.

AN ALTERNATIVE TO AN ARMY OF OFFICIALS.

When Sir Evelyn Baring arrived in Tanganyika Territory only in 1916, the Government had recently introduced a very complete policy, related closely to the hereditary principles of the Uganda people, whereas that ruling chiefs are given full support to control their own people with little or no indirect control and advice from the Central Government, in other words the best of western civilizing influences may be grafted on sound native stock.

A Key Example. In a recently-published annual report of the East African Commission of Enquiry, there will be found evidence of that tendency.

"Signs are apparent," he writes, "especially among the agriculturists, that the younger generations and even some of the older people are beginning to feel that life and the customary obligations of the past are passing away. Youngsters with a smattering of the English language and their unfortunate experience of a modern life are beginning to demand for their elders and an education which will enable them to take general superintendence of the work of the Government. They are considered by such to be not only the best, but the only, persons to whom the Government should be entrusted, especially where they are in a position to receive a salary or a pension in kind or in return for which no material evaluation exists. This is a natural evolution among people who are in close contact with modern civilization which is proved by laws that are based on individual liberty and which necessarily require a general or specific service in return for any 'supernatural' payment."

The Kenya Government among the Kikuyu, intention at the present time of refusal to make the payments which are demanded such as the portion of an acre or a field and a number of native labor for the right to cultivate land, the customary practice of head and beer when the social group are engaged in a ceremonial feast or the gift which young men used to pay to the elders on taking over tribal authority. Another manifestation is of course the development of institutions of modern ideas of political administration imposed by the constituted tribal authority.

**A PLEA FOR TRANQUILITY.**

**Hon. L. F. Moore Says Pooling of Troubles  
Would Do No Good.**

The Hon. L. F. Moore, in a speech in the Legislative  
Council of Northern Rhodesia, has asserted that no case  
has been made out for amalgamation, that the present  
situation is doing much harm, and that people who  
advocated the change as suggested and could not give  
courage.

What Northern Rhodesia wanted, he said, was a  
period of tranquility.

is being discussed. It has been thought that  
pending the report of the Hilton

Mr. L. F. Moore, leader of the  
opposition, has however  
thought otherwise and in the  
course of a motion—while he

Rhodesia. This apparently

indicated that progress is being made.

Referring to what he called the
