Shop Hours Act.
CHANGES TO MEET SPECIAL NEEDS.
 The Acting Attorney General proposed the second reading of a Bill to amend the Shop Hours Ordinance, 1925, in the Legislative Council on Wednesday. He said the object of the Bill was to provide for the exemption of certain trades and businesses from the operation of the Shop Hours Ordinance which had been passed in 1925, although it had not been put into operation until September of last year. Since theoretical working had been entered of the Ordinance and certain hardships had been revealed. Application had been made for the alteration of these hardships and the Bill had been introduced for that purpose. The Bill had been prepared after consultation with the Nairobi Municipal Council, and it was proposed in the interests of public convenience, to exempt from the operation of the Ordinance all persons whose maintaining liquor is sold for consumption on the premises and also the trade and business of a restaurant, cafe, eating house, wood fuel, motor fuel, motor oil, and oil, and of a seller of motor cycle and motor cycle supplies and accessories. He thought members would agree that all these trades and businesses should be exempted. (Appropriately had been taken to insert a clause in the Bill empowering the Governor in Council, at the request of a local authority, to declare any other trade or business to be exempt from the operation of the Ordinance, at any time. If the Governor in Council exercised this power it might be of general application or might apply to certain areas only.)

AN ANNUAL REVIEW.

At Thursday's meeting of the Kenya Farmers Association the President, Mr. C. K. Aring, presented his annual report on the year. This was as follows:—

There is no very short report on any one item, but a very short report on the most important, the harvest, but because the year 1925 had a heavy and protracted drought, and the Association's activities are mainly agricultural and political, some somewhat unexpected results were obtained. 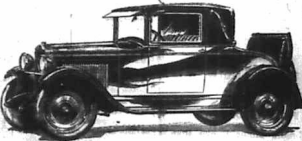

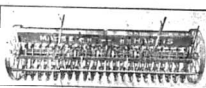

INCREASED SAFEGUARD AGAINST STOCK & PRODUCE THEFTS.

Objects of an Amending Bill Explained in Council.

A SERIOUS PROBLEM.

Proposal Which is Expected to Lead to Discouragement of Thieving.

A Bill which has been the subject of questions in the House of Commons was brought up for second reading before the Kenya Legislative Council on Thursday.

The purpose of the Bill is to amend the Stock and Produce Theft Ordinance, and its object to safeguard farmers from thieving from their crops and stock which is on the increase.

In view of the difficulty of tracing such thefts the amending Bill proposes that the onus of proving full ownership of stock and produce shall under certain circumstances rest with natives as to whom there is reasonable ground for suspicion.

HOUSE OF COMMONS CIRCULAR.

The Acting Secretary of Agriculture has issued the second reading of the Bill which, he stated, had been drafted in order to give effect to some of the recommendations of the Stock and Produce Theft Committee which reported some time ago upon the working of the Stock and Produce Theft Ordinance.

In this Bill it will be found that some are given to arrest and detain people on suspicion of having stolen farm produce on the killing and Production. In addition to this it is proposed that the onus of proving full ownership of stock and produce shall rest with natives as to whom there is reasonable ground for suspicion.

The Bill has been introduced by the Hon. Charles Harvey, (The Minister) and it is expected that it will be passed by the House of Commons in the near future.

MOTURING TOPICS

THE POWER UNIT.

Six and Eight Cylinders Compared.

LEADING CHARACTERISTICS.

The tendency to employ a greater number of cylinders for the design of medium-priced and high-priced cars has been most marked during the past three years, as engine and in America. At the same time the four-cylinder type of power unit held a prominent position in all corresponding countries, but it was seriously challenged by the six-cylinder engine in Europe from 1922 onwards, when the proportion of six-cylinder cars available on the British market was 20 per cent, whereas today it is 42 per cent.

Some Historical Notes.

In America the six-cylinder engine commenced several years earlier and was followed by a steady increase in the number of straight-eight engines, a type which first became prominent at the 30-hp standard rate of 1915 when it was employed on 11 out of the 22 starters. Duesenberg and Miller in America and Napier and Daimler in France were pioneers with straight-eight racing engines, and considerable work in this class was also done by the Fiat and Alvis.

To-day the "straight-eight" has achieved such an important position in America as to be fitted on less than 20 per cent of the 1926 models in that country, while the four-cylinder engine is second only on a few makes selling at very low prices, notably Ford, Chevrolet and the Light Six. In Europe the "straight-eight" was first employed in a touring car for sale to the general public by the

Little-Prattman concern and has proved more popular for high-priced cars in a few instances than the chassis selling at moderate prices. However, interest was made in Great Britain a short time ago by the introduction of the Napier and Rover-Burns chassis, which probably will be the most successful of the new models, and selling at quite moderate prices, while the high-priced model has a two-valve overhead cylinder in the front and a four-valve overhead cylinder in the rear.

From these few historical notes it will be evident that while the four-cylinder engine has probably superseded the six-cylinder for the chassis selling at a really low price, the remainder of the market is likely to become almost entirely divided between modern six-cylinder and eight-cylinder cars, with considerable competition between these two important types.

It is an interesting undertaking to compare them in order to get just what are their respective advantages and disadvantages.

Flexibility and Endurance.

The two really important qualities demanded of an engine for use in flexibility and endurance—that it is to say, to develop its power smoothly over a wide range of speeds as well as to reduce consumption of a minimum and to retain the low fuel consumption and vibration. It is of course in the same respect that the six-cylinder and eight-cylinder types are to be compared. The six-cylinder engine is more flexible in its operation and consuming less fuel, while the arrangement of crank shafts at 120 degrees which is inevitable.

Consequently, a six-cylinder engine can run up to 4,000 r.p.m. of revolution without distress and turns over with marked smoothness at all speeds.

This is an important matter, as at high speeds the inertial forces tend to be increased, that caused by the inertia of the reciprocating parts. It has been calculated that for an engine of 10-hp capacity running four miles a gallon the inertia of a four-cylinder engine will be about 2,100 lb. and 1,000 lb. respectively for a six-cylinder and an eight-cylinder. This shows that the six-cylinder engine has an important advantage in favour of the "4-4" type.

Knowledge is also very largely dependent upon the distribution system, which must be so arranged that the same quantity of strength of mixture is delivered to each cylinder otherwise, the power output will vary and the engine will give an impression of rough running. Furthermore, efficient mixture distribution is essential to an economical performance.

It has already been mentioned that this problem is quite simple for the case of "4-4" type eight-cylinder engine, but the "4-4" type which is now so widely used owing to its better balance, is very much more difficult a problem as regards distribution in the six-cylinder engine.

It may, of course, be argued that this is really no case for a further increase in the number of cylinders, but in fact, except in high-power cars, owing to the advantages of more required, cooling apparatus and mixing possibilities of the latter type, the six-cylinder engine, as the performance of cars improves, is more likely to be distinguished by the fact that the "4-4" type is being replaced by the "4-4" type. Insert great are becoming more common as one of the most difficult and one of the most urgent problems of the British Empire, for the loss levied by them on the world's crops is estimated at about ten per cent. or two shillings in the pound. It is a growing and appalling pest which has been heard to in the past few months of the year from the south here, whilst some districts have been covered very recently by locusts caused by the discovery of a new fly pest to which it is well known to be connected with an evil reputation in other countries—*Stenobothrus* thersites, more familiarly known as the coffee berry borer. This new pest first came to the notice of the coffee growing country and the fact in the new districting is as much as we understand that the insect has been discovered almost simultaneously in widely separated plantations. Happily, for most districts there are curative, and a Government officer was able to lead a meeting of the Burs' Farmers' Association last week of which they are readily obtainable, parasites which are not generally known to the coffee grower. ness. The fact, however, does not diminish the seriousness of the menace and we are glad to observe that Government has taken drastic measures with a view to eradicating the pest. The Government is also giving the importance of having an adequate staff of men trained to wage war against crop disease in the country is apparent from the fact that within the past year the author's strength of the entomological service has been increased by some fifty per cent. It will be recalled that in the early part of last year in response to a general and insistent demand which was endorsed by the Council, Government had agreed to strengthen its staff of entomologists by securing the services of two additional officers. For the purpose of dealing particularly with maize stalk borer and coffee berry borer, however, it is the demand for men trained in the branch of science that it was only possible to obtain one new recruit. From several months ago the first advertisement had appeared in the States, which one officer recruited locally Mr. Kirkpatrick, using valuable work connections with the bug when he was seconded by the Sudan for action with important lead. Since then it has been impossible to continue with the work because of shortage of staff, due to the exigencies of the war and other phases of the locusts campaign. HELPING THE COOK

Roasts and Graves.

The inventor has been busy of late during ways of aiding the cook in the roasting of joints and the preparation of gravies. A new invention has been devised, and is a spoon with a neck fitted in a hole in the neck of a roasting joint. This enables the cook to pour off the fat from all sides, and indolently does away with the necessity of using a separate strainer. One hole is fitted for the fat, so that it can, when there is more, easily be drained off.

Another device for helping in gravy-making is one of aluminum that fastens on to the neck of a pan, leaving room underneath for the gravy to be poured off into the soup. This is the best practical use of the invention.

SWEET OVEN PIE

An American Dish.

The pie is made in a round dish about three inches deep. First put a pound of sweetly dried, uncooked slices, powdered with a little sugar and some fine sugar; then add slices of hard-boiled eggs, sliced, and a little cream and the bit of butter, a large and sweet crust. This makes a light and crisp pie. The filling is made by rubbing the contents of a tin of sweet corn very slowly in a bowl, adding two ounces of butter (some use lard) and washing it into a paste, keeping it rather on the dry side.
