**THE HOUSING OF CIVIL SERVANTS.**

**NAIROBI SCHEME**

**Legislative Council Agrees to a Principle.**

**Details of Scheme Plan to be Discussed in Committee.**

The following motion was proposed by the Director of Public Works in the Government House on Tuesday:

That this Council approve the adoption of the scheme set forth in the Memorandum entitled "A Scheme to advance money to European Civil Servants to enable them to build their own houses, which has been laid on the table of this Council."

Speaking to the motion the Director of Public Works said that the difficulty of housing Civil Servants first became acute in 1924. The activities of the Government were increasing rapidly at that time, and it was in that year that the suggestion was first made that the pooling might be a feasible scheme for assisting Civil Servants to acquire a few in Mombasa. But to those he believed it would be a great advantage so general married officers had great difficulty in making both ends meet. There were at present about 220 permanent pensionable officers stationed in Nairobi. It was thought by the Civil Servants Association that possibly there might be 50 eligible officers who would be eager and willing to take part in such a scheme. A sub-committee considered the whole question and several alternative schemes were looked into. The scheme had been approved by the Loans and Works Committee.

**An Expensive Alternative.**

There were several points which bore on this question. During the early discussions on this scheme the possibility of the consolidation of salaries had been explored. The consolidation of salaries as suggested in the Budget Report would be more expensive than this scheme. It had been shown however that this scheme could be independent of any consolidation of salaries and need not prejudice it if it was introduced at a later date. The question had

been discussed by the committee in connection with the consolidation of salaries. It was suggested that the Government should be provided to enable them by a suitable arrangement. The Housing Society would advance up to £2,000 in the way of a loan. Mr. Hasden suggested that the remaining 25 1/2 per cent. should be advanced by Government at a very low rate of interest. It was recognized that the Government might be able to build their own houses in the way provided in the report. Government was set to rest.

**Some Advantages.**

He wished to mention some of the advantages which this scheme would bring. Firstly, it was undesirable that the Government should have in its own property of Civil Servants. Secondly, the Government would be able to carry on its other business. Thirdly, there was the point that the officer who did not own the property in which he lived would not take so much interest in it when he knew that he could be evicted at any moment.

In 1925 the housing difficulty increased. There were about a hundred Government quarters available at that time and it was felt that Government had some obligation to provide an allowance in place of Government quarters when a house was not available. Although the allowance which was made was adequate for a bachelor, it was not enough for married officers. Consequently Government needed houses for married officers. In 1926 the Council of the Civil Servants Association urged Government to adopt a scheme to assist Civil Servants in the building of their own houses. With this object in view Government invited Mr. A. S. Hasden to visit Kenya and to advise Mr. Hasden made a Report in October 1926 and that Report was laid on the table of Council towards the end of the year.

# MOTORING TOPICS

## ENGINE OIL

### Deterioration and Its Causes.

#### EFFECTS OF DILUTION.

In the instruction books supplied with new cars, and in the literature which is handed out by oil companies is based on the necessity of diluting the oil from the engine sump and replenishing with fresh lubricant at definite intervals. At first the new motorist follows these instructions blindly, and if he is an owner-driver, he finds the operation involved tedious and dirty, or if rejection of the speed limit is to mean anything to him, he

is told the same by the car manufacturers' advice.

#### Effects of Dilution.

The most obvious difference between unused and used oil is the lower viscosity of the latter which due to the "thinning-out" action of dissolved petrol.

While much of the petrol absorbed by the oil film on the cylinder walls is volatilized, it is supposed to appear to the heat of the burning gases during the combustion period, some of it is added in the oil is conveyed to the crankcase by the excess oil pressure, and is suggested accordingly to impurities contained therein, and to excessive use of the oil, cannot be removed by any system of filtration.

The amount of petrol found in good mechanical condition is usually less than 4 per cent, but the effect of even such a small quantity upon the "body" of the lubricant is astonishing. The viscosity of a typical oil of motor grade 100 is about 85 c.p.s. at 50, and 4 per cent of 100 is considered to be the correct grade to insure efficient lubrication. The continued use of one having two-thirds to one of this viscosity causes great solidification, and will, indeed, give rise to over-heating and excessive wear of bearing surfaces.

With a view to overruling the dilution position of motorists have been employed on many American cars for years past, and so far as found in "General" brand English models. Briefly, the recycler consists of a shell, heated in exhaust gas, through which the oil circulates

and is relieved of its volatile constituents. The petrol gas evolved passes into the induction manifold, and the oil flows back into the sump.

#### Chemical Changes.

If the oily deteriorated substance found in engine oil after use were pure, the presence of an oil recycler combined with an efficient filter, having a very fine porous adhesive solid particles in suspension in the lubricant, detritus from pistons, piston rings and bearings—would render excessive drainage practically unnecessary. Unfortunately, however, harmful substances are produced from the oil itself, which, being non-volatile, cannot be distilled off as petrol gas, and which, on account of their solubility in the oil, cannot be removed by any system of filtration.

The impurities contained in the products of change which the lubricant undergoes due to thin films on pistons and cylinder walls, it comes into contact with the heat of combustion of the petrol-air mixture. In the case of a pure mineral oil, which is the type of lubricant usually employed in normal car engines, the repeated exposure to high temperature results in the formation of small quantities of high molecular substances which materially reduce the lubricating value of the oil.

Indeed, oils, i.e., those containing small proportions of "fat" oils, are much more susceptible to the effects of prolonged heating, oxidation products of a glutinous nature being formed which impair the lubricating properties of the oil, and which, if present in rather than very small quantity, result in the formation of gummy deposits which

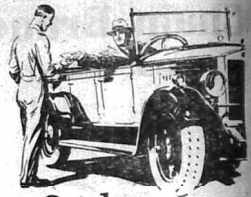
lead to shake valves and filters. It should be stated, in fairness to the manufacturers, of the many excellent blended oils marketed for use in high-pressure engines, that no trouble need be anticipated with these lubricants provided that due attention is paid to prolonged run-time.

In addition to the foreign matter mentioned above, the small quantities of water will be found in the engine oil which has been in use for some time. Its presence is quite normal; it is the condensation of steam formed in the combustion of the petrol-air mixture. If, however, it is allowed to accumulate, which first manifests itself in the oil, producing the familiar sludge which first issues from the sump when it is drained. The accumulation of water in the oil filters with disintegrator pads. A consideration of the points dealt with in these brief notes will show that periodic removal of engine oil is a matter essential if the car is to give long and efficient service. The provision of an oil recycler will render excessive drainage and replace the most necessary of low frequency refills, but it will not eliminate this objectionable task—"B.W.M." in the Field!

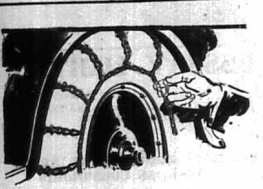

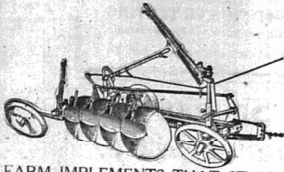

been made by the mover of the motion but he felt that there were certain points which required consideration. The conditions of service were such when many of the senior members of the Civil Service joined up, that it was necessary to offer housing, but in any case it was not necessary to offer accommodation in certain parts of the country.

**Terms of Service.**  
The revision of the terms of service had been delayed for a very long time. A committee had been appointed years ago to take into the problem and to offer the question of the period of service being extended to four years. Since then there had been many discussions and they did not seem to be any nearer to a solution.

This afforded the housing problem. Large sums of money were being spent and we could not get the full benefits of them unless the terms of service were altered.

He considered that the principal aspect of the problem was that there was not sufficient safeguard and he thought that the Board should be strengthened by a representative of the Master Builders' Association. This would be advantageous when it was necessary to decide on the amount of money to be advanced on a building scheme. The scheme only applied to Nairobi on the deconstruction of the Government, would mean that others should share the advantages of the scheme.

erty to see Government advance more than 20 per cent. He was that one clause referred to the value of a house up to £2,000, which he considered to be an unreasonable high figure. He had failed to find any provision in the measure for insurance.

Mr. O'Brien said that he was sorry to criticize and he was very glad the motion had been introduced but he thought that Government should give an assurance that this was not the entire effort on the subject, and he recommended that it should be discussed in Committee.

**Principle Supported.**  
Lord Delamere (Rift Valley) said that he supported the principle of the Bill and the details could be discussed in Committee. He thought Mr. O'Brien had forgotten the fact that Government would be saving £50 a year on every house except those which were drawing a home allowance. An effort should be made to get the housing of all officers on the staff of a housing allowance. He admitted there were details to be considered but he said that those matters were talked about for years and he welcomed the introduction of the motion. He hoped it would not be voted to put the Bill back until the terms of service were changed. This matter could be dealt with in the Council but any alteration of the terms of service would concern the Secretary of State.

He hoped the opportunity would be given to go through the details in Committee, as there must be some legislation which would amend the Statute.

His Excellency on a point of order said that it was not necessary for this question to be introduced in the form of an Ordinance. He thought it would be agreed that it would be a considerable convenience to discuss the matter in Committee.

The Colonial Secretary proposed the addition of the words "and the best consideration of the details of the scheme to a Committee of the whole Council." The Director of Public Works referred to the difficulty of getting an unbiased technical report to serve on the Board, and reminded the Council that the Public Works Department had people qualified amongst their staff. **The Domestic Servants Bill.**

**PROPOSED NEW SYSTEM OF LOCAL RATING.**  
EFFECT OF A BILL.

A Bill is pending for introduction in the Official Gazette with a view to the Local Government Authorities to increase and collect rates. The present Bill is intended to apply to all municipalities and is designed to meet the various defects. **Valuation Roll**  
Provision is made for making a new Valuation Roll once in every five years and the basis of valuation and values, powers of inspection are prescribed while alterations to any valuation may be initiated by persons other than the owners of the property to be valued.

Provision is also made for the partial exemption from rates in the case of land used for agricultural purposes. The claim of agricultural land to some form of relief is recognized in other portions of the bill. The use of large areas of land for agricultural purposes does not create the same need for municipal services and expenditure as is occasioned by the building purposes, and that through the nature of agricultural land does not receive benefits from municipal expenditure in the same proportion to the value of their holdings as those enjoyed by owners of other land in the municipal area.

It is provided therefore that land used exclusively for agricultural purposes need not be less than ten acres in extent to be rated on half the agricultural value. Where, however, such land occupies purposes when owing to its situation and suitability for other purposes added values occur, such land is to be taxed on the full amount of such additional value. The object of this provision is to prevent the relief given to agricultural land from leading to the holding up of land which is required for building development.

An amended form of Valuation Court is introduced, namely, one of not less than three persons appointed by the Council. This form of court has proved satisfactory in the Transvaal and is therefore a right step to a modification of court which decision is made final subject to the right of the magistrate to reserve any or to any part of any township.

### Secret of Success.

#### A SETTLER'S ADVICE TO SETTLERS.

At a recent meeting at Capetown in connection with last settlement, Mr. Greer, who settled in South Africa through the agency of the 1920 Memorial Settlers' Association, and is now a successful poultry farmer in the Western Province, outlined some of his experiences. He had previously done farming in England and Canada. Conditions were so bad in the latter country that he decided to go to South Africa. Because he regarded his calling as a pick and shovel job, he made progress, he declared. Many people who became settlers had an idea that they could get rich quick by drinking coffee on a steep and economically unpaying labour.

"You must like it. If you don't work you lose the respect of your boys. And by playing tennis where you should be building up your farm you are ruining your enterprise."

He paid a tribute to the help he had got from the 1920 Settlers' Association and the Government of South Africa. It was pleasing encouragement. Periodical visits from agents of the various settlement societies were a great boon.

#### Freight Rates.

#### EFFECT OF FLUCTUATIONS OF BIRAL MARKET.

Mr. G. Tyson drew attention at Thursday's meeting of the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce to the effect on the marketing of East African wool of the fluctuating freight rates, pointing out that whereas these rates were reduced last January, an increase was to be made in July on the rates to the United Kingdom ports, and in the case of New York shipments from Mombasa, an immediate increase of Sh. 21. per ton on weight basis. These sudden changes in rates would not help exporters and he thought it was unfortunate that the Conference Lines, before making these increases, had not discussed with the Shipping Committee on this side the effect of these alterations. He thought that before such alterations were made to follow the Conference Lines should be asked to obtain the views of the Shipping Committee, should they now recommend, on this side.

The matter was referred to the half-yearly meeting of the Association of Eastern Chambers of Commerce to be held in Mombasa in July.

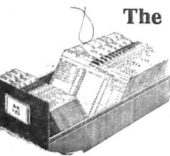
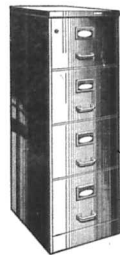

#### CHAMBER DEBATE

#### P.M.G. Replies to a Series of Questions.

#### A Resolution Condemning the Inflation.

The session opened by the General Post Office for advertising on the backs of telegraph forms was from the subject of the petition presented to the Native Chamber of Commerce and the Minister of Commerce and the Minister of Finance. #### AN AMENDING BILL FOR TANGANYIKA

A Bill to amend the Tanganyika (Official Gazette) Ordinance, 1925, and a Bill to amend the Tanganyika (Labour Contracts) Ordinance, 1925.

It is explained that the present system by which one administrative officer may give a permit to another has been found to be unsatisfactory, and the Bill gives the Labour Commissioner more control over revocation by confining to him the issue of permits.

Clause 6, by amending section 33 of the Ordinance of 1925, abolishes the punishment by imprisonment with or without labour, and substitutes a fine or imprisonment for a term not exceeding that of the offence.

Clause 7 defines the monthly fee for specifying the daily rate of a labourer's wages on a labour card given to the servant under Ordinance No. 11 of 1926.

This amendment is proposed in accordance with a resolution of the Legislative Council and for the reason that the monthly rate of wages—sometimes not really divided into specified sums per day and—has often caused many contracts to be broken for payment according to the law provided.

Clause 8-11 provide for the medical examination of natives recruited for periods of service exceeding 12 days. Clause 12 gives the power to employers to make small deductions from the wages of a servant in order to refrain the commission

of acts dangerous to public health. There is provision for appeal against deductions and all sums retained are required to be placed to the credit of a fund to be used generally.

**MOTOR TOPICS**

**GEAR-CHANGING.**

**The Worst Bugbear of the Novice.**

**SIMPLIFIED METHODS.**

Simplification is the cry of the day. But in this particular instance it is almost a pity that the gear-changing of some cars should be so easy as the change-lattices. It is quite impossible to claim the utmost efficiency from a small engine unless the correct method of gear-changing is studied and practiced.

A word of explanation is necessary. Stippled changing may mean, in some cases, on the motor, by care in ordinary running about town, but when a good performance is desired on a hill, it must be performed properly. This means that the change must be made at a much higher road speed and for such a gear-change there is only one method, even on the most simple of cars—the right one.

All this may sound a little foreign to the novice, but it is a skill which he, or she, must acquire; that is, all something, corresponding to the proficiency of a driver's skill to descend. If he does it more than probably correct in imagining such a device of the simplicity of motors.

No Magic in it. The difference between a slipshod and a correct gear change has been given in a fairly recent hill test in which a motorist, by a slipshod change, lost 10 per cent. of his speed. If the car is allowed to coast, it is a waste of time and gas as nearly by the next lower gear as possible, the best method gear as possible will be far better than any other. The result will be inevitable. The result is that the remainder of the hill will be climbed at a snail's pace, while other similar, better-driven cars will pass unobscuredly by.

On the other hand, by changing too fast, a further gear change will be avoided, and the car will force through—passing other less well-driven cars, maybe—and avoid

over the summit at a speed which is not the theoretical point that this is the way a car should be driven. The driver derives a pleasant sense of personal achievement from hill-climbing. Distinct from mere hill-climbing.

Surely a little trouble in the earlier stages of one's novitiate is more than repaid. But what is the magic method of gear-changing? Well, there is nothing magic about it, nor anything difficult, providing the learner understands just what he is doing, and why. It is called "slipshod changing."

Before explaining the method, however, let us put aside the matter of the clutch, as it is a separate matter. When top-gear is engaged the main shaft turns a solid connection between clutch shaft and propeller shaft, and the latter is on the same speed as the crankshaft of the engine so far as the rear end of the motor is concerned. On the clutch is an engraving, on the motor, are various gear wheels, which on changing speed, have to mesh with the other shaft, called the lay shaft.

The Operation. When in top speed, those corresponding pairs of gear wheels, one of each gear, are revolving at different speeds. Before a quiet change down from top gear, it is necessary by some means to increase up the rate of the lay shaft. This is done by the driver, by slipping up the slower, or slowing down the faster of the particular pair.

Now, imagine that the first part of the gear change has been performed. The clutch has been withdrawn, and the gear lever placed in position. If the driver now moves the faster pair wheel would involve a great deal of noise, and the car would slip on the road. The driver must speed up the slower. The main shaft is now disconnected from the engine and clutch shafts; but the lay shaft is still connected to the main shaft through the medium of the constant-meshed gears made in one box. If, therefore, the foot accelerator is kept depressed when the gear lever is in neutral, this lay shaft and all its gear wheels can be speeded up by momentary jolting in the clutch.

If the operation has been correctly brought to an engine speed in relation to the road speed of the

car, the gears will engage cleanly and smoothly when the gear lever is moved to the correct position for second speed, and the clutch may be left in again finally.

**Where Secret Lies.**

All this takes long in the description, but the actual process of changing by double declutching is a matter of an eighth of a second. It is divided into three parts: 1. withdraw right foot gear lever in neutral, 2. keeping foot on accelerator, lift clutch in and out again in a quick dash, and 3. move gear lever to appropriate position for lower gear, and let in clutch.

The whole secret lies in correctly judging the relative piston speeds, and in being so quick on the particular car, but it is well to bear in mind that the faster the car is travelling when the change is made, the more the clutch must be given in what I might call the "slipshod" way, or adequately to speed up the gears on the lay shaft.

Practice, however, always will make perfect; but it will soon be found that one develops an intuitive feel for the knowledge of that critical road speed to engine speed relationship—a knowledge based mainly on the engine at various road speeds on the different gears.

Because we have had to go into detail it must not be imagined that the process is as all difficult to learn, but on the other hand, it must not be supposed that success will come of the first effort.

The most likely result of the beginner's initial trials of double declutching will be a worse noise than usual, for the smoothest engine also has its limitations. Try and try again, and half an hour so spent will probably improve the result with the requirements for a perfectly clean gear change. (Hon. Victor Bruce in an exchange).
