TERRIBLE SCENES AT BRITISH RAILWAY DISASTER.

Helpless Passengers Pinned Amidst Wreckage.

FRANTIC RESCUE EFFORTS.

Axes and Saws used to Hack away the Debris.

One of the worst British railway disasters of recent years was that which occurred at Darlington on Wednesday as a result of which 22 people were killed and 47 were injured.

An excursion train, with 500 passengers, travelling at 50 miles an hour came into collision with a shunting engine.

Helpless and terribly mutilated passengers were pinned in the wreckage and the most distressing scenes were witnessed, axes and saws being used to free the trapped people.

COLLISION AT 50 MILES AN HOUR.

Following the Darlington disaster, the terrible spectacle of the dead and injured, including women and children, helplessly pinned in the mangled wreckage was described by one of the passengers in an interview with *Better's*.

He stated that the brakes were applied as the train was leaving Darlington and there followed a violent shock. The lights in the train went out. The engine of the passenger train was flung on its side and the front bogey wheels were buried twenty yards away. Rows of seats were piled up top of each other in the up-top-top coaches with the top seats completely smashed and twisted between them.

Rescue parties made frantic efforts to extricate those trapped axes and saws to hack away the debris.

ROUND AFRICA IN A FLYING BOAT.

Some Lessons of Sir Alan Cobham's Flight.

EAST AFRICA THE KEY.

Commenting on Sir Alan's recent flight across the "Times" writes that it was undertaken as a "rehearsal" to be made later but for a sober and businesslike survey of the route which, it is hoped, may eventually be taken by air. It is possible to commercialise enterprise... It has been one of the most "useful" of flights for utility and... It has occupied Sir Alan Cobham... lead in the age of Navigation and... of the end of May; but this is only because he has taken his own time and unimpeded course... of these resources and imperies which he had to make wherever he stopped... Nevertheless a journey of 20,000 miles in the same craft... (not counting in some 2,000 more in smaller) is in itself no mean achievement, and as a feat... to the world, British air-enthusiasts, which may now be said to have dimly emerged from the obscurity which overtook it after the War.

This particular Short Stagger, the product of a pioneer English firm of aircraft builders, and made for military service, is, as it happens, the only one of its kind in existence, being the one in which Sir Hannal Hares evolved over the Halls last year; but it is the present, or to speak of the civilian Short Cobham's flying-boat which is intended to be worked by Imperial Airways as part of the route from London to India. Of the Short Stagger there can be no question, for it had not left England long on the way out when it stood an extraordinary seven feet in rough water on landing at Malda.

Good Harbour.

In his report to the Maltese Government Sir Alan Cobham remarks the lesson in pointing out that the base at Calcutta is far from suitable for operations, and flying-boats in winter; while in reviewing the general facilities at Malda as a base for trans-Mediterranean air traffic of all kinds he recommended for reaching champagne. Here, on the other hand, where his was the second machine ever seen, he recommended to be an excellent natural harbour. Equally good harbours he found on his

return journey along the western coast of the Great Coast, but this part of his flight from the harbours... which no one has flown before, was... the establishment of a through air-line from Cape Town to the Cape.

Flight, as an art, having reached its present development, the time has come for its conversion into a service of no small work as it can be made to do. It may be that Sir Alan Cobham's trans-African journey has not yet been finally worked out; but Government and commercial interests may be sure that they have in him an adviser pre-eminently well qualified to show his subject, and nothing but an inferior or really incapable, difficulties ought to be allowed to stand in the way of the steady development of the project for which he went out.

Gold Medal for World's Greatest Map-maker.

STANLEY MEMORIES.

Mr. Edward August Reeves, who has been awarded the Victoria Cross for his services with the Royal Geographical Society, has been elected to the post of the world's greatest map-maker... He has prepared maps from the observations made by the expedition, and has found in general surveying the staff of expedition... of Joseph Thompson's expedition to East Africa, the South, Shambaton and Mwanzi expeditions to the interior, and some of his staff of the River Chad.

His "Hills to Travellers" has been long recognized as the volume among the scientific explorer, making, and works on topography, and is well known to all geographers.

17,000 Maps.

"Since I joined the staff of the Royal Geographical Society in June 1878," Mr. Reeves told the "Evening News," "I have seen the collection of maps of my department grow from 20,000 to 177,000."

"One of my first tasks was to prepare maps from the observations made by Sir Stanley's expedition to Central Africa. In those days the map of the world almost lay paper in Africa, Australia, Central Asia, and America, while the Polar regions were unknown lands. Since then of course, these maps have been gradually filled.

"Today, while the main facts known, and routes have been opened up across all continents, there are great areas between those routes that are still very little known about the interior of Africa."

"I do not attach very much importance to Polar flights for survey work. It is impossible to observe from an aeroplane or an aeroplane to obtain any precise measurements of the regions over which they pass."

Bankruptcy Law.

PLANNING COMMON LEGISLATION.

"It is the intention of Government to introduce stricter laws of bankruptcy in Tanganyika on the lines of Kenya."

This question was put by Mr. A. Kilgus during the recent session of the Tanganyika Legislative Council. If the reply was in the affirmative, he asked what steps were being taken in that direction.

The Attorney General replied to the first question in the affirmative. Answering the second question, he stated:—The law officers of Kenya, Tanganyika and Uganda are in correspondence for the purpose of getting the form of supplementary legislation to facilitate procedure in cases where the assets of a bankrupt are situated in more than one Territory. It is expected that a bill on this question will be reached in the near future and thorough co-ordination of legislation will be introduced.

POULTRY NOTES.

The Egg Shortage and Its Causes.

At the present time there is a great shortage of eggs, and poultry farmers are having great difficulty in filling orders. With green food plentiful, in the ordinary way we should be getting plenty of eggs. In any opinion the present difficulty arises with the postponed thought. The birds, even to the last we hear of them, are scarce because in the winter, they were very heavy rain. My yards were absolutely sodden and I expect a good many birds, but even then the ground was very wet. The lowest water level caused by the drought, followed by the excessive wet, upset the birds having records, and so to certain extent their health. The wet ground meant that the birds continually had cold feet which is a great preventative of proper incubation. Any way, they are distinctly suffering. The "cold feet," as far as their duties are concerned, at the present moment, I would recommend a small quantity of one of the concentrated feeds as an addition to the diet, until the birds come proper into lay again.

Cold, Damp, Etc.

There is usually a fair amount of sickness amongst the birds during June and July. The birds you look out most for is the first few eggs, which are usually small and very little trouble, but if they come out, but neglect a cold, and keep well open, the result is that the young stock will be the first to develop colds, and they should be examined carefully each day, as cold will show up in the nostrils.

first, instead of the nostrils being dry and clean looking, they will have mucus showing. Should a bird have a little bit of green adhering to the nostril, it is a sure sign of a cold, and lots of green will stick to the nostrils of a bird if there is no discharge from them.

The nostrils should be carefully cleaned with warm water; then rub a little Eucalyptus oil on the throat, and now the little paper, (previously dipped in Eucalyptus Oil), round the inside of the mouth. Should the eyes look at all watery drop in a small pinch of boracic powder. If taken in time this is usually sufficient to cure a cold.

Repeat remedy each day until completely cured. If a cold is neglected, the bird will probably develop chills, which is a very serious condition. The cold may turn to ruff, and may be so severe that the bird must be isolated as they will be infectious. The chills generally in the eyes must be washed away with warm water and boracic powder into the eyes. Examine the mouth of the bird, any chloasma inside, but do not scrape away and the place pointed with white, if the breathing of the bird is affected it will have to be given inhalations.

These some very hot water in a jar, and then pour it into the jar, not quite to the top. Put into this some From Balsam, or Eucalyptus Oil. Hold the bird's head inside the jar, above the water, and allow it to inhale the fumes. To see sufficient it by holding its head over the jar, but be sure to breathe in sufficiently to remove the breath. Birds in this condition should be kept in a warm open air, and not fed only.

In washing for simple colds, it is so easy to cure, it must be remembered to keep the bird in a very secure spot as it will be very infectious and spread very rapidly. I would recommend that all drinking water during these two months should be chlorinated with permanganate of potash.

THE WAR ON EAST COAST FEVER.

Summary of Research Work Last Year.

EXPERIMENTS.

Research work which has been done since the start of the year in connection with East Coast Fever in the completion of trials with the use of the Department of Agriculture in connection with the following experiments.

The results of experiments in connection with the immunization of animals with the prophylactic inoculation with spleen extract are summarized.

Experimental East Coast Fever inoculation carried out and recorded by investigators, shows that a percentage of inoculated cattle give no apparent reaction and that a larger percentage of cattle which do not react, survive exposure to natural infection in comparison with those which give a reaction to inoculation.

During the period under review a number of susceptible cattle were inoculated with the vaccine which method of inoculation is the greatest percentage of the inoculation. (a) ascertain whether an original inoculation confers a resistance to re-inoculation, and (b) whether a higher resistance to natural infection is conferred by re-inoculation.

The transmissibility of East Coast Fever by inoculation of conditions of infested ticks, *Rhipicephalus appendiculatus* and the immunity conferred in cattle which reacts to inoculation of emulsion of infested ticks was also investigated.

The experimental work was undertaken chiefly with a view to elaborating a method of inoculation which would produce the greatest percentage of reactions. East Coast Fever, and the lowest death rate from inoculation and subsequent exposure to natural infection. Other experimental East Coast Fever work included the following:

The immunization of unweaned calves. Prophylactic inoculation with spleen extract. The following is a summary of the results—

able by various methods of administration of blood, spleen pulp, and glandular tissue of an East Coast Fever infected beast.

None of the methods or combinations employed initially showed East Coast Fever; inoculation of spleen pulp produced a average percentage of reactions in different lots of cattle, all to 87 per cent; and with the exception of glandular tissue, average 11 per cent.

Intravenous inoculation of spleen pulp and simultaneously subcutaneous and intramuscular inoculation of spleen pulp and glandular tissue gave the largest percentage of reactions, viz., 87 per cent, approximately.

Blood alone produced the lowest percentage of death rate from East Coast Fever, viz., 1.6 per cent; spleen pulp or blood mixed with spleen pulp gave varying percentages of mortality in different lots of cattle, all to 16 per cent; average 7.6 per cent.

An original inoculation did not necessarily confer a complete resistance against re-inoculation.

Re-inoculation does not confer a higher resistance to natural infection.

An intravenous inoculation with spleen pulp and simultaneously subcutaneous and intramuscular inoculation of blood mixed with spleen pulp, produced a larger, and more marked, percentage of reactions in comparison with an original and subsequent inoculation by the other methods.

A percentage of susceptible cattle which give no apparent reaction to an original and subsequent inoculation.

isolation are not protected against a reaction and death when exposed to natural infection.

On occasions where losses are occurring from East Coast Fever and no facilities exist for controlling the disease the method of inoculation by the method which produces the highest percentage of reactions and most resistance to natural infection, viz. one intravenous inoculation of spleen pulp and simultaneously subcutaneous and intramuscular, least mixed with spleen pulp, is indicated.

Experiments.

Transmission of East Coast Fever by (1) crepuscular ticks, (2) crepuscular ticks and simultaneously, inoculation of blood of an East Coast Fever beast.

A number of cattle were put in quarantine to determine the transmission of East Coast Fever by inoculation of ticks alone, or emulsion of ticks and simultaneously blood of an East Coast Fever beast.

(1) Emulsion of blood and ticks collected from an East Coast Fever reacting beast, uninfected and inoculated immediately after collection did not produce East Coast Fever, and immunity was not conferred.

(2) East Coast Fever was readily produced by subcutaneous and intravenous inoculation, respectively, of an emulsion of tick and ticks which were not in contact with an East Coast Fever beast and the ticks were not emulsified.

(3) Intermittent inoculation of the same emulsion did not transmit.

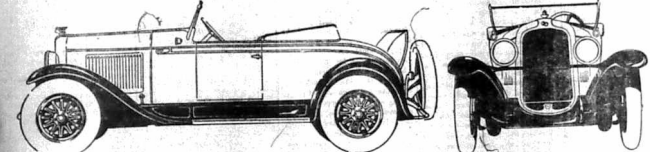

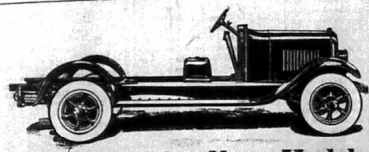

FERTILIZATION OF THE SOIL.

Big Claims for a New Product.

(CONTINUED.)
The question of manuring in the tropics and sub-tropics is gaining in interest and importance. The view that manuring on tropical and sub-tropical soils is useless or even necessary has proved untenable. Numerous experiments have shown that also in these regions the application of artificial fertilizers leads to increased yields and higher products. To be sure, localities will exist where the soil is so rich in natural foodstuffs that manuring is unnecessary. Such soils as a rule have only been utilized for agriculture for a short time, and are consequently used very rapidly, hence exhausted. Except for a few essential volcanic formations, tropical sub-tropical soils in the main are deficient in the three chief plant-food elements, Nitrogen, Phosphoric Acid and Potash.

Manuring with artificial nutrients can only give the soil the salts of the three main foods as present in adequate quantities in the correct relative proportions. They must be brought to the plants in an easily assimilable form at the time when the plants require the greatest quantity for food-stuff absorption.

The treatment rates to be satisfied in the simplest way by application of the right fertilizer are: Nitrogen, 10 to 15 lbs. per acre; Phosphoric Acid, 10 to 15 lbs. per acre; Potash, 10 to 15 lbs. per acre. These are the minimum requirements of the three main foods for normal crops, having no special requirements for any special crops, citrus fruits, rubber, orange mandarin, etc. of the points and places where the soil is deficient in any of the three.

For the Tropics.
Nitrogen 10 to 15 lbs. per acre; Phosphoric Acid, 10 to 15 lbs. per acre; Potash, 10 to 15 lbs. per acre.
