GROWTH OF THE POST OFFICE IN 1927.

Interesting Items for the Annual Report.

REDUCED RATES: INCREASED REVENUE.

Expansion Which Points to Need for Better Accommodation.

The expansion and development which has taken place in the Post and Telegraph Department of Kenya and Uganda during the past five years is shown in the abridged report of the Department for the year, 1927.

Notwithstanding the substantial reductions in rates during the interval, the cash revenue has increased from £139,777 in 1922 to £209,495 in 1927, the increase being 58 per cent.

In the same period the number of parcels increased from 119,617 to 169,202, telephone installations from 1,108 to 2,181, which is an increase of 109 per cent. The number of telegrams sent during the year, 1927, is shown in the following table:—

Another noteworthy feature which is revealed by the report is that, notwithstanding this expansion in the Department's activities, revenue expenditure during the same period, from 1922 to 1927 only increased from £127,720 to £124,235.

EFFECTS OF UNIFICATION.

The unification of Kenya with the Protectorate of Uganda has now been completed and has resulted in a number of important changes. Revenue and Expenditure.

The total cash revenue in 1927 amounted to £209,495, an increase of 58 per cent on the total cash revenue of £139,777 in 1922. The total cash expenditure in 1927 amounted to £124,235, an increase of 12 per cent on the total cash expenditure of £110,750 in 1922.

Capital Requirements.

The total capital requirements for the year 1927 amounted to £1,235,000, an increase of 10 per cent on the total capital requirements of £1,120,000 in 1922.

Inadequate Premises.

The inadequate premises for the Department of Posts and Telegraphs in Kenya and Uganda are a serious problem. The Department has been unable to obtain suitable premises for its operations in many parts of the territories.

The Customers' Point of View.

The customers of the Department are satisfied with the service rendered. The Department has been able to provide a reliable and efficient service to its customers.

PRACTICAL ADVICE ON CHILD WELFARE.

The First Baby.

I. THE DEPARTURE OF THE MONTHLY NURSE.

The first of a series of weekly articles by an expert on child welfare is given below.

The writer, Miss Helen Graham, O.M.B., Health Visitor was one of the first readers in London under the Fryer King system and was for some years on the staff of the Children's Hospital in Great Ormond Street, London.

The aim of the series is to give practical advice to young mothers on the all-important matter of their children's early care and in the following article the instruction begins from the time the monthly nurse leaves.

A TIME TABLE.

1. Baby was probably here some time in the last week of a young mother's last task in which she was watching the departure of her monthly nurse, and realizes that the time has come for her to take over the care of her new baby herself. Already, perhaps, she has obtained by her visits to hospital the size and weight of her child, and she has seen to face the midwife's return (and it is almost a very real way of measuring her task) how they may be done.

2. Maternal instinct, as well as quoted by experience, is apt at least all over. Natural instincts that have been dulled by ignorance of children need to be re-awakened. Even the most ordinary mother, listening as she often is to a nurse's warning, is in that country, responsive to her advice.

3. There remain books, but even these are up to be rather bewildering when read without previous experience.

Necessary Training.

4. For the reason, in practically every country in the civilized world, Maternal Training and Infant Welfare Centres have now been established—for the benefit of mothers of every class. In England, society women, headed by Dorothy, have been glad to make use of them. That there is no such Centre in this country is a fact which cannot be sufficient to deter the problem of getting white nurses, of all places, where the women are so difficult and where the rough journey to work is between a nursery and medical advice—baby would be absolutely inaccessible.

5. baby, is a public which, I am convinced, is full of her love as the baby has passed.

6. No, baby must have his time-table and keep to it. It should be pressed up to the limit as a rule, but not so much as to make the baby cry. The mother has given in to his demands. And the mother who has learned that, crying whenever either of her parents pass, he will be a little tyrant, when disappointed in later years a result with tears. So stick to the timetable, and he will soon become a regular with you. You will know the time he has his habit.

A Suggested Programme.

7. Here is a timetable that should fit in with most households but here, but even mother should make out her own.

8 a.m. Nurse puts out his bottles, and carry out out of door.

9 a.m. Prepare bath, dry clothes etc.

9.40 a.m. Bath and dress baby.

10 a.m. Nurse puts out and put in trays on veranda.

11 or 12 a.m. (When awake) change him and give morning feed. Return to room.

1 p.m. Change and nurse him. Put him in cot near your window when you are out.

4 p.m. Change baby and play with him—putting him in his high chair while you are in your room.

4.30 p.m. Take him out in his pram—leaving nursery door to prepare bath things for your return.

5.40 p.m. Bath baby (a woman who spends the money you would be paid for a bath in the morning, know to leave a baby in the care of any nurse (man or woman, however, admirable) at present a most unobtainable policy, ending in some cases, to the greatest results, which no accident should be too great to prevent.

Baby's Place.

8. Secondly, baby's place in the household must be decided—and here I think the text-books are often very misleading. For baby's place should not be just an equal third.

MOTOR TOPICS

VALVE GRINDING.

The Successive Steps to Follow.

DISMANTLING THE CAR.

For grinding in the valve it will be necessary, of course, to dismantle the valve gear, which, briefly, involves compressing the springs before you extract the cotter which holds the cotter securing the spring in position. In an overhead-valve unit the spring can be depressed with the spring screwdriver or one of the special tools designed for the purpose, and the cotter easily removed either by the design, if it is necessary, by means of a pair of pliers.

Compressing the Valve Spring

In a side-valve engine it is usually generally so made that one of the special valve spring compressors available, of which, incidentally, there are many types available, it will operate on all probabilities, to grind that the job of compressing the spring with a screw-driver or a lever is rather awkward. The spring can be compressed in an expanding device, average being obtained on the edge of the valve spring chamber. The cotter may take the form of a drum-shaped engaging in the slot cut in the valve stem, or a pin passing through a hole drilled in the stem. In the latter case the valve can then be lifted from its guide. All the cotter which has been deposited on the valve,

both on the top and the underside of the head, should be scraped away very thoroughly and the part cut off as far as possible. The next step is to grind in the valve on the grinding stone. It is found advisable to employ first a coarse grade and then a finer grade of grinding or carborundum paste, which can be employed.

In other cases only a fine grade is needed. This coating should be smoothed across the seating surface and the valve dropped into its guide.

Lift Valve Frequently.

When employing a screw-driver, should be used to lift and the light pressure being exerted upon it, the valve should be lifted from its seating and turned a few times the valve brought down to a fresh grade, and so on. Thoroughly Remove All Parts.

Each valve should be treated in turn, and afterwards all traces of

the abrasive paste must be removed, very carefully. This is essential, as otherwise the particles left may become ground-in on the newly cut faces, and, possibly, if left on the stems, cause air leaks, so spoiling the even running of the engine.

Reassembling the valve gear and the engine is the reverse of the process employed in dismantling. There is an important point, however, which should be remembered, this being in connection with the readjustment of the valve clearance. Do not at first set it to 0.002 in. or 0.003 in. as is recommended for the engine when in its normal condition. First allow a little greater clearance which will automatically take the valve into its setting. After the car has run a short time and the piston and the valve are both worn, adjust the valve up and readjust it to the full amount. This adjustment should be repeated after the engine has run for some time.

The forms of adjustment for engine clearance are shown in the appendix reproduced on the previous page, and show generally the form of a simple screw and lock nut. In some cases, however, you are likely to find the valve clearance is adjusted by means of a compression screw which both valves are closed before any adjustment is made. If the engine be worked slowly, the operator, watching one of the cylinders, will notice that the inlet valve opens and closes full time immediately by a similar action on the part of the inlet valve. This should be followed by turning the engine through about three-quarters of a revolution before the adjustment is made. (The Motor.)

EDUCATION IN UGANDA AS ECONOMIC FACTOR.

The Value of Agricultural Training Stressful.

SKILLED LABOURERS.

Teaching Natives the Practical Uses of Knowledge.

The economic value of education in Uganda was dealt with by the Director of Education in an interesting paper read at the recent annual meeting of the Uganda Farmers' Association.

In the Protectorate whose future prosperity is largely bound up with crop production great stress is placed on the value of agricultural training which enters largely into the school curriculum.

One result of the agricultural bias in the school training, it is believed, will be the absence of reluctance on the part of natives to work as labourers whilst their value in that sphere will be greatly increased.

It is sought also in the schools to give training which will fit certain natives for the responsibilities of chieftainship.

ever, handicapped by lack of funds, though the schools did go a long way towards removing illiteracy, it was not possible either to teach them effectively, or to encourage them to learn in subjects which should be of practical use to the members of the Protectorate in Uganda schools. It was obviously impossible for the Government of Uganda to do more than to provide a few schools and it was therefore necessary to concentrate upon a few schools to start with and bring them up to the desired standard.

It is hoped that in a very few years there will be 200 of these schools throughout the country and that the schools in the Protectorate will be without at least one teacher trained in special instruction in the elementary school who will be able to improve all the others by a system of native visiting teachers, who will have a special training for the work.

It is these selected schools a new system has been devised and has been in use for upwards of two years and teachers for them are being trained in special institutions, all but one of which will be Government grants.

CONTRIBUTION TO CIVILIZATION.

In the stipulation to his paper on Education in Uganda considered as an economic factor, read at the annual meeting of the Farmers' Association, at Kampala, the Hon. Mr. J. H. Hume, the Director of Education said it was an indication of the interest which they all took in the welfare of the natives, that they should find time for a paper on native education. It was an endorsement of the paper put forward by His Excellency the Governor at the last Caledonian Dinner, that they in Uganda were contributing something of real value to civilization by the way in which they were discharging the duties of trustees for the natives.

Turning to be subject, Mr. Hume said he would not dwell on the education which they at Europeans, owed to the natives of Uganda to educate them in schools and in others otherwise to meet the changing social and economic conditions that were brought about by the presence of Europeans in the country. All who realized how disastrous a factor it was in the tribal and social life of primitive people to have in their midst a community whose life and actions were subject to influences of a different order from their own, a community whose activities they were brought into contact with great economic forces—all who realized the mental and moral upheaval that these changes

produced in Africa would see the advantage in their power to help them patiently and sympathetically over a very difficult transition period.

Elementary Education.

"We may take it as axiomatic that Uganda is now and is likely to remain an agricultural country and that if education is to adapt itself to the natural conditions of the people, agriculture must be the chief concern, and secondly that, as agriculture equals work by other forms of national work depends on the maintenance of the stock, not only as to numbers but also as to the health and vitality of the individual, education must concern itself very intimately with the important subject of health.

vision, and gain experience of a variety of crops, and as which they themselves will do the work. It is always said both by our own Agricultural Department and by agricultural experts who visit this country that the main reason why Uganda is so tremendously increased in population is due to the increase of surplus, by better methods of agriculture. I think, however, that the main reason is the fact that the population is increasing so rapidly, that the surplus is being used to support the population. It is generally held that in Uganda agriculture will have to be made to support the population, while Europe and India will be mainly concerned with the disposal of the crop.

On the other hand many European countries are now engaged as producers of their elementary products on the supply of labour. 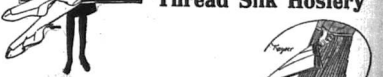

A "MEDICINE MAN'S" TALK ON SOIL MANAGEMENT.

Valuable Advice to Meeting of Uganda Planters.

SCIENCE AND CROPS.

Some of the Essential Factors Governing Plant Life.

"The elements are still beyond our control and farming continues to be a huge gamble, but it is interesting to realize that we can always increase the odds in our favour by skilful soil management," said Dr. W. S. Martin, the Agricultural Chemist, Uganda, in a paper on soil management which he read at the recent Planters' Conference in Kampala.

The importance of green manuring was emphasized and one of Dr. Martin's striking aphorisms was: "Avoid clean weeding like a plague."

IMPORTANCE OF HUMUS.

In the past three years, he said he had been very much struck by the worn-out appearance of a number of the older plantations and in all cases the poor yield had been due to the exhaustion of the soil. The amount of water which has been lost from ten acres in a general average of a ton from two to four acres. This depletion in yield was viewed by the planters who said that it was inevitable after ten years cropping was necessary to restore the soil. Dr. (Dr. Martin) was regarded as the medicine man who was expected to walk over the plantation, take a sample of soil, shake it up with some water in a test-tube and suggest what was necessary to revive the present yields with-out delay. He would mention a few simple facts about the inter-relationship between the soil and the plant in the hope that they might obtain a better idea of what was necessary to secure good healthy trees.

Conserving Water Supplies.

"What are the essential factors for plant life? Your answer would probably be a 'good soil'—meaning perhaps a well-aerated plant food, but facts go further than this," he continued. "The analysis of any crop, molecule is always first determined and its ways present to a greater or less extent by the amount of water used by the plant is not measured entirely by the soil contained in the plant at any given time. Investigations in the field and in culture solutions have shown that

the roots of the plant are constantly absorbing water which then passes to the leaves from and branches. The water which is absorbed into the air spaces through a crop in this manner is enormous, amounting roughly to 200 lbs. for every pound of dry matter produced. The water sets in a relative-ly important plant food, contains the temperature of the plant and is all important in plant processes. In a climate like this where bursts of rain are followed by more or less long dry periods it is particularly important to conserve the water supply. Unfortunately the elements are still beyond our control and farming continues to be a huge gamble, we see that, but it is interesting to realize that we can always increase the odds in our favour by skilful soil management.

"Another important factor is the moisture which is held in the soil. A waterlogged soil is just as unhealthy for most plants as an extremely dry one because it sets up rotting in the roots and eventually kills the plant. Thus the ideal soil is one which is highly retentive of water and yet never water-logged."

Main Food Factors.

"Such a soil must have a high percentage of pore space, that is a granular soil. A porous soil is a low pore space and is very subject to wash and erosion. These two factors, water and air, are just as important as plant food when I am considering leaf diseases it rarely occurs of more

than five per cent. of the crop. The main food factors are nitrogen, Phosphorus and Potash. These are essential to the mineral soils which do not contain these elements. It is not the crop, although there are many instances where there is either of all of these materials. The soil in that in many soils, the nitrogen is the most important element that they are not in a fit state to be taken by the plant roots and the main component of the food and nutrient supply is the remedy in many of these cases is to use lime.

"This naturally brings us to the question of manuring and I can only tell you that the only way to grow a successful crop is to give your soil a new lease of life or not, is to give your soil a new lease of life. "Remember that although in a general way many of the essential plant food atoms in the soil particularly a granular soil, are available as a given time and are not available in the order of dry to wet soil. It can be found near to the surface of the soil."

Uganda Soil.

"We have now considered some soil factors in general crop production and will return to conditions of estates here and their improvement. The majority of the plantations in Uganda have been opened up on a sloping grass land. I have analysed a number of these soils and in many parts of the country and in all cases found a high percentage of good structure. The first few crops taken of this soil are usually good, but failing of gradually. The planter begins to think of the soil as being a little bit of good structure. The case of the older plantations here. I sampled the coffee soil and about

ten yards away sampled virgin Ugandan grass soil. The soil in the first instance was very fine and heavy. It was found that the crumbs and the second manure I found a good black soil. It was heavy, dark and well granulated. It is a comparatively slow soil, but a good soil in respect that had been raised by bad management. The clean weeding and cultivation had allowed the soil to burn out all the humus, which acts as a cement for the particles in the ground. The soil had carried a lot of the soil away, and the wind was doing its worst with what was left. (From the Uganda Planters' Conference.)

"The actual mechanical force breaks up the crumb, every hoeing brings a further supply of humus to the surface to be burnt out until finally all the humus is removed, granules are non-existent, pore space is at its minimum, heavy rain tends to wash much of this soil away, and soil following rain takes the remainder up great part."

Manuring with artificial nutrients will only give the best results if the three main foods are present in adequate quantities in the correct relative proportions. A "MEDICINE MAN'S" TALK ON SOIL MANAGEMENT.

Valuable Advice to Meeting of Uganda Planters.

SCIENCE AND CROPS.

Some of the Essential Factors Governing Plant Life.

"The elements are still beyond our control and farming continues to be a huge gamble, interesting to realize that we can always increase the odds in our favour by skillful soil management," said Dr. W. S. Martin, the Agricultural Chemist, Uganda, in a paper on soil management which he read at the recent Planters' Conference in Kampala.

The importance of green manuring was emphasized and one of Dr. Martin's striking aphorisms was: "Avoid clean weeding like a plague."

IMPORTANCE OF HUMUS.

In the past three years, he said he had been very much struck by the worn-out appearance of a number of the older plantations and in all cases the poor yield had borne out the observation, being less than a ton from ten acres instead of a general average of a ton from two to four acres. This depreciation in yield was viewed very philosophically by some planters who said that it was inevitable after two years cropping and what the soil now wanted was Manure—such a simple word. He (Dr. Martin) was rejoiced as the medicine man who was expected to walk over the plantation, took a sample of soil, dabbed it with some dandruff in a test-tube and suggested a remedy to relieve the present yields without delay. He would mention a few simple facts about the inter-relationship between the plant and the soil in the hope that they might obtain a better idea of what was necessary to secure good healthy trees.

Conserving Water Supplies.

"What are the essential factors for plant life? Your answer would probably be 'a good soil—moisture, plenty of soil rich in humus, and a plentiful supply of water. Soils, but factors that are not always first determined and in many cases are not under our control, but the amount of water used by the crop is not measured entirely by the amount contained in the soil at any given time. Investigations in the field and in culture solutions have shown that

"In a comparatively short time a good soil in excellent condition had been ruined by bad management. (Dr. Martin assumes that there had been no rain for a quarter of the soil in the virgin field). The crop which had only been about 12 inches high and about 2 cwt. per acre took this soil, which was a very rich soil, and was a waste of what I have said and which I will not describe you will think water and air are the most important factors in the soil and will realize the importance of moisture in all respects. You will also realize that we have seen that frequent hoeing has respect that frequent hoeing a good structure to start. "We have now considered some soil factors in general crop production and will return to conditions of estates here and how improve them."

"The majority of the plantations in Uganda have been opened up on uncultivated grass land, or have sampled such land in the virgin state in many parts of the country and in all cases found a deep soil of good structure. The first three crops taken off this soil are invariably good, the falling of grain and only the planter begins to think of the medicine man. To find the reason for this decrease in crops we must study the factors which the plants. When you go back to your estates, have another look at your soil. It is a mixture of good crumbs of varying sizes, or it is fine and dusty." The latter state of affairs is clearly the result of the weeding, necessitating frequent hoeing. This constantly reduces the quantity of pulverized material. The fine dust soil has a minimum of pore space and water holding capacity. The soil which is easily becomes waterlogged in the growth of the crop, owing to lack of air, while early in the morning it is dried out and baked, making the soil suffer the most of plant life. MOTERING TOPICS

GEAR BOX MAINTENANCE.

Dismissing and Reassembling.

THE STUMPER-ANCHOR TYPE.

Many types of Stumper-Anchor gear boxes are in use, ranging from small units suitable for 200 c.c. engines to the heavier pattern used on twin-cylinder machines. In the latter case, the shafts are usually of the same general size as those of the smaller units, and it is therefore possible to fit a gear box of any size on to a gear box of any other size.

Generally, the Stumper-Anchor gear box is a very simple arrangement, having six pinions which are in constant mesh. There are, of course, three pinions on the main shaft and three on the layshaft, which is situated below the former. Gear change is effected by dog clutches formed integrally with the middle gear pinions, which are more rigidly under the strain of a common output shaft.

Two Plain Bearings.

The kick-starter internal mechanism consists of a gear which engages with an internal ratchet in one of the lower gear pinions. The shaft runs on ball bearings. There are two plain bearings in the gear box; the intermediate takes a bearing in the lower sleeve which is fixed to the lower sleeve which is only in action when second or bottom gear is in use.

In top gear the mainshaft and the intermediate gear are locked and revolve as one in the ball bearing. The other plain bearing is at the outside of the sleeve pinion. The kick-starter is fixed to the gear diameter and is bolted to take the end of the layshaft which revolve within it. The low gear pinion on the layshaft also revolve freely in its shaft.

There is a hole in the main shaft bearings as used in the gear box. It is very necessary that an ample supply of lubricant should be kept in this hole, and the hole should be kept open to the top of the gear box. A light grease applied made for gear box purposes, such as Spherolite or Crumaine, or Whiteford Crumaine, will do well. It is always desirable to fill from time to time a little quantity of oil as in Cases 20 and 21. The result oil should be avoided. The oil should be worked through the shaft, or be thrown out. Clutch Adjustment.

On those gear boxes which have constant mounted on the end of the gear box it is desirable to see that the fork shaft is kept

firm: the end at the back must be kept firm to the start. If the fork shaft is allowed to move on its mounting, it will be found that the dog clutches may not always be fully in mesh, but otherwise there is very little to be troubled about in the control position providing the gear is in mesh when the control lever is in the control position. The gear will revolve freely without any noise due to the dog clutches falling to the escape.

Air Regulations.
 Government has just issued a comprehensive list of regulations which are issued to govern all aerial activities in the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya. They are the most severe and similar regulations in force in other parts of the British Empire and are designed with the object of making flying as safe as possible by laying down rules which govern aviation and their machines and which are also intended to guard the general public as far as may be from any accident due to carelessness, foolhardiness or lack of skill on the part of pilots. As such they will be welcomed generally. "Whilst the need for such elaborate regulations—so far as they may seem to the uninitiated—may not be apparent now, it is certain that in the not distant future aerial development in this country, and indeed throughout the continent, will demand a code of law which will provide for every conceivable which may be conceived at the present. The danger of such an incident caused by machines flying too low over towns, unappreciated very recently in Nairobi, should be observed to follow. That of course is only one of many ways in which the regulations will prove of public benefit. We welcome of the establishment of an Air Club although it is doubtful if the present membership is sufficient for the purpose for which it has been created. True, the members are appreciative of the Board people from whom aviation legislation will prove a most indispensable to most who discuss many aspects of aviation with the members of the Colony. The Colonial Secretary will represent His Excellency the Governor in the deliberations, the Attorney General (or a member of his staff) will have to consider the legal aspect of many questions which are to crop up in the future. The Director of Public Works will be concerned so much with the construction of aerodromes. The Postmaster General is bound to be interested in the possible establishment of air mails, and the Officer-Commanding Troops will be consulted on all questions connected with the use of aeroplanes in connection with the military forces. But the section dealing with the constitution of the Board proceeds. "The Air Board will advise the Governor on matters arising out of any Order in Council relating to aviation and any directions issued thereunder." This seems to presuppose an all-round knowledge of aircraft and aviation on the part of some of all the members of the Board, but we do not remember to have heard that any of the gentlemen mentioned here any such qualification. The mystery is solved in the following paragraph which reads: "The Air Board may accept for the purpose of discharging its duties any person or persons who are qualified to advise the Board on any technical aviation matter concerning the directions and may hold joint meetings with any such person, associations or committees." "The Aero Club of East Africa for a period of twelve months from the date of these regulations, appointed a technical advisory body to the Air Board. It is natural therefore that the members of the Air Board will provide for the following paragraph: "The details of aviation will be held without the attendance of such technical advisers. This Board, it is noted, has been more successful in the part of Government to have appointed such a body, and to have so pointed as permanent members of

The Colonial Secretary will represent His Excellency the Governor in the deliberations, the Attorney General (or a member of his staff) will have to consider the legal aspect of many questions which are to crop up in the future. The Director of Public Works will be concerned so much with the construction of aerodromes. The Postmaster General is bound to be interested in the possible establishment of air mails, and the Officer-Commanding Troops will be consulted on all questions connected with the use of aeroplanes in connection with the military forces. But the section dealing with the constitution of the Board proceeds. "The Air Board will advise the Governor on matters arising out of any Order in Council relating to aviation and any directions issued thereunder." This seems to presuppose an all-round knowledge of aircraft and aviation on the part of some of all the members of the Board, but we do not remember to have heard that any of the gentlemen mentioned here any such qualification. In the Tables which appear below the variations in the retail prices of the following articles of local produce have been collected: (a) Bacon, (b) Coffee, (c) Cheese, (d) Flour, (e) Jam, (f) Lard, (g) Beer, (h) Milk, (i) Butter, (k) Meat and Fish.

In Table I will be found the mean index number for each quarter together with the yearly value computed on January 1920 as base in the same manner as for the two previous bulletins for meat and butter.

In Table II the mean yearly value of the price of each article is given. As there is a marked difference in the price of each article as sold by the different districts, the only change as seasonal variation in price, the highest and lowest, value returned during the year is given side by side with the mean value.

In Table III, the actual price of each article in Nairobi for the month of May is compared with corresponding prices in England, New Zealand and South Africa.

In Table IV, the combined index number for all the 111 articles dealt with is shown and the variation in the mean value may be considered to represent the increase in cost to householders for equal quantities of these articles. They have not been weighted according to quantities of the various articles consumed.

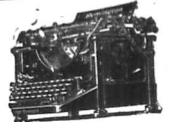

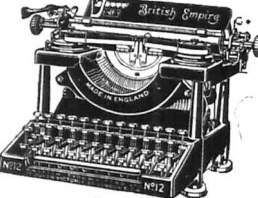

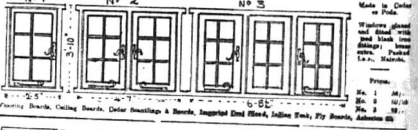
