### Loneliness?

Recently we have published letters from those young women who have come out to employment in Kenya. Two of them complain of the lack of friendliness on the part of people of their own in this country and especially in Nairobi; whilst the third writer has been surprised to find the opposite view and speaks of the kindness also has experienced from strangers in the Capital of the Colony. Certainly it is a bit undulating for any girl to leave home and friends and embark on a career in a country where conditions are so very different from those obtaining in Britain and where the strangers in highland by the fact that she has no known friends in the Colony. We do not believe, however, that the impression of two of our correspondents has been general, since if that were so, much more would have been heard of this loneliness by far now. In the last few years many girls have come to Kenya and on the whole have been well content with their reception. The records of the Society for the Outlets of Overseas Women are abundant evidence that this is so and that the excellent organization provided by the Society and more particularly the splendid work done by Mrs. Orr, the Nairobi representative of the Colony have been appreciated very fully. All girls coming out to the Colony under the Society's auspices are met at Mombasa, and English, Scottish and everything in

organization embracing all the various of settlements in the two countries which would make it possible for maintenance of the highest standard to be kept at least one year. The maintenance of two or three country people who with commendable public spirit practice the necessary law and express is largely responsible for the presence of the two articles who have just concluded what on the whole has been an extremely satisfactory career. The potential financial status of respectable—who while the population of the two countries is little more than what the Albert Hill holds—but fortunately for many years in this part of the world, Kenya and Uganda, in every act, irrespective of cost, in this determination and resolution to recruit new eggs to supply an increasing number, while it is necessary that a sufficient number of suitable candidates should be forwarded to the various provinces of the continent. The serious promise of graduates would be very much increased, would be extremely little likely to be ever being called on. We commend the idea to all "emigrant" prospective in this country and in Uganda.

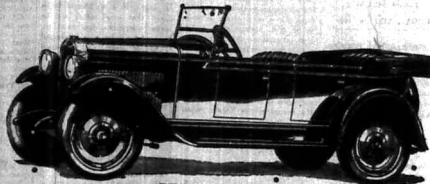

### PRINCE STUDYING EAST AFRICA.

In Preparation for His Tour.

THE LONDON OFFICE.

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT, London, July 20]

I understand that the East African Information Office, at the request of the Caidine, has been supplying the Prince of Wales with a good deal of literature about East Africa, and he is studying it carefully before he starts. It shows the systematic plan by which he plans his holidays, and he is not likely to make many mistakes on the various countries and capabilities of the different countries he visits. I understand also that Sir Geoffrey Thomas intends to pay another tour to the Information Office just before the Prince of Wales leaves, and I think that he will be very keen to clear up any outstanding points, and I think that he will be always the one in connection with visits of this nature, and the most pronounced of the different places in East Africa.

There is some hope that the Prince will still be in before he leaves and pay a visit to the Office. The visit would be very pleasant if he would do so, because when he was at Mombasa he called on, more than one occasion, on the East African Standard, and expressed his great pleasure at witnessing the progress of the various Colonies. The Prince by the way has taken a pipe.

Commercial interest.

Colonel Franklin has been touring the country for the last few weeks, starting with the Fynal show at Nottingham, and visiting Bradford, Leeds, Sheffield, Manchester, Liverpool, and several other centres of population. He tells me he finds a very great interest in the capabilities. He says that undoubtedly there is a great deal of quiet investment of money going on in different parts of the country, and as a specific instance, it would appear that business men are taking up big steel interests in Southern Transvaal. His proposals, however, the steel market is a little uncertain, but, of course, this is only a temporary condition. Colonel Franklin, at all

events, was very pleased with the growth of public knowledge of East Africa, and the undoubted general belief in its economic possibilities. After a strenuous month he is himself looking forward to a fortnight's holiday with his family, since, as things are now, he only sees them for about twelve weeks in two years. Of course, he will not return to East Africa until November.

Asiatic Society.

A LECTURE ON THE SUDAN ARABS

["STANDARD" CORRESPONDENT, London, July 20]

The Royal Asiatic Society held a meeting this week, and the Burton memorial lecture was delivered by Mr. H. A. MacMichael, President, and the President of the Society presented Mr. MacMichael's address, was entitled "The Coming of the Arabs to the Horn of Africa." He said that although repeated changes had taken place, and the normal tribes in the Sudan had been displaced, but still the normal Arab, as a whole, and particularly these women folk, were hardly distinguishable from the Arabs of Western Arabia in appearance or ways.

However, the policy of the Sudan administration was to meet every form of unnecessary interference with the tribal life, to support the authority of the Arabs, as long as it was not abused, and to encourage in them the spirit of responsibility and self-reliance which provided the best guarantee of justice and security to the individual. The Arabs had now enjoyed this advantage for 30 years, their stocks and herds had increased enormously, and while they still preserved the few traditions and independence of spirit and the traditions of courtesy which still drew them from the pride of their race they were being transformed into a more modern, more responsible, and more united people, and the prospect of a better and more united people which still distinguished their nomadic existence in Arabia. Mr. MacMichael was presented with a mace in recognition of his pioneer work, at the conclusion of the address.


