ARLHNE, TEXAS.

"Goo-Goo" Eyes Rained—
Heavy Fines for Masters.

A DEFINITION

Fighting has been made a crime punishable by a fine fine in the city of Arlhone, Texas (states the New York correspondence of the "Sunday Chronicle").

The legislators of Arlhone, in their wisdom have followed almost to the letter the provision of Gilbert's Mishale.

"That all who fight, leered, or winked,

Unless convincingly fined,
Shall forthwith be banished."

This is the wording of the Arlhone law.

It shall be unlawful for any person to die and later on any street, thoroughfare, sidewalk, alley, or in any other place, to fight, move, strike, shove, business house, or in the entrance or doorway of any such place within the corporate limits of the City of Arlhone, Texas, for the purpose of giving the occasion of fighting or fighting.

A "Fight" Defined.

Thus the law with delightful exactness, goes on to define the meaning of "fight" and "winked."

The word "fight" and "winked" are herein used shall be construed as synonymous terms," it says.

No "Shoo-fun" Error.

Consistent with the ordinary acceptance of any person who will, by word, sign, gesture, wink, facial expression or look shall seek to attract the attention of any person of the opposite sex (other than a friend or acquaintance) for the purpose of making a snash, or flirting.

"It shall be unlawful," the law continues, "for any male person in the City of Arlhone, Texas, to stare at or make what is commonly called "goose eyes" at, or in any other manner look at or make remarks to or commencing or attempt to attract the attention of any woman or female person upon or traveling along any sidewalk, street or public ways of the City of Arlhone, Texas, with the intent of or in a manner calculated to annoy such woman or female person."

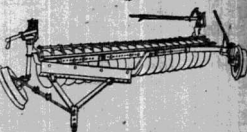

RETAIL COSTS OF FOODSTUFFS.

Nairobi Chamber and
Varying Prices.

THE RACON PORTION

The rates of retail costs of food-
stuffs were discussed at Thurs-
day's meeting of the Nairobi Chamber
of Commerce when the President,
Mr. J. G. Thorneley, said that
the subject had been placed on
the agenda of the meeting and that
members might bring the matter
before the Government Statisticians.
The latter it would be remem-
bered that the Statisticians
referred to in the very great
variation in the retail prices of
staple in the town, and the dis-
crepancy in trade conditions
which this caused. He stated
that from the figures given it
would appear that competition
was apparently inoperative.

Mr. J. Mortimer said he could
understand the variation in cer-
tain commodities such as butter
and eggs, and other similar com-
modities, but he was unable to
understand the variation in the
prices of other commodities. He
stated that the price of butter
had been relatively reduced last
week, and he believed that the im-
porters were not holding on to the

Kenya prices as cheaply as any
other. It could be bought in Uganda
and be sent to Kenya. That
was based on official information
and he had got the price up till
the end of July at several Ken-
ya prices. For some of the best
cuts in England it was neces-
sary to pay Shgs. 2/4, whereas
one firm was selling similar cuts
at other firms were selling at
Shgs. 2/2.

A Reasonable Price.

Bacon was now at a strictly
reasonable price in the country.
Farmers would have to accept
more reasonable terms on more
normal conditions returned. He
thought that on investigation it
would be found that the retailer
was not handling bacon of ex-
ceptional quality.

Mr. E. F. Mayer mentioned the
fact of Kenya Beer, which cost
Shgs. 12/- per dozen being sold
at the Kenya and Uganda Rail-
way at their refreshment rooms
at Shgs. 1/6. He had discovered
the price when visiting
recently.

Mr. L. A. Mowat said he wish-
ed to mention the remarks of the
Government Statisticians regard-
ing the apparent non-operation of
competition. Taking things right
the way through the general level
was the same but one would occa-
sionally find that some particular
article was cheaper at one place
than at another—but some other
article would be correspondingly
dearer. He thought that it was
only those firms which had not
perfected the machinery of price
and business were more or less
able to fool low a margin of profit
and had then had to adjust their
prices. There had been too many
instances recently. In the country,
generally, he found it was far better
to stick to one firm if possible and

distance of being produced.

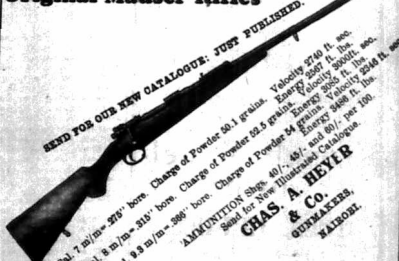
Death Ray

PROGRESS OF AVIATION.

Nineteen years ago the first gas engine in England was used at Blackpool, with such success as A. V. Roe, Farmer and other early pioneers appeared on the programme. After this year Mr. A. V. Roe presented a few weeks ago Blackpool had another pageant. Famed the world over for her shows and spectacles on the grand scale, says 'The Blackpool Gazette and Herald': 'Blackpool's pageant everything it has ever done before in this way, on the second and concluding day of the great air pageant at Queen's Gate.

Kenya and Uganda Trade.

FIGURES OF IMPORTS AND EXPORTS.

The following figures of trade during January to May 1927 and 1928 for Kenya and Uganda have been compiled by H. M. Trade Commissioner from statements submitted by the country of the Commissioner of Customs.
The total value of imports for 1927 was £2,958,000 compared with £2,210,000 for 1928. Of these amounts Great Britain supplied £1,770,000 or 62 per cent. in 1927 and £1,575,000 or 71 per cent. in 1928. In 1927 India supplied £293,000 or 11 per cent. and in 1928, £300,000 or 14 per cent. Holland supplied £143,000 or 5 per cent. in each year. Japan supplied four per cent. in 1927 and six per cent. in 1928. The figures being £218,000 and £177,100. The United States of America supplied 18 per cent. in each year. The 1927 total being £375,000 and 1928, £221,200.
House consumption imports exclude Government goods and specie and also problem of Transylvanian Turkeys (valued at 1927 £100,000 and 1928, £251,000) intended for subsequent re-exportation.

rial alterations in the recommendations of the Royal Table Conference was that it would be open to the question. He believed that it was not necessary because it was ignoring the fact that the findings of that conference had been reported by the very people whom they were now endeavoring to justify. He had represented the Indian Committee on that occasion and had been repudiated by their own representatives. He had a number of Indians had made it public that they could not abide by the decisions of that committee if they would not be satisfied until members were elected by the terms of common franchise.

He also commented upon the deletion of the provision for the representation of the Omani community in the Council. He said that there should be special provision for the Omani community. He said that the Omani were, after all, subjects of a foreign power and he did not think that they had a very strong claim to special representation. He said that, on the other hand, he considered it wrong in principle that they should be entirely deprived of any form of direct or indirect representation. For certain reasons, the Indian representatives have Government. He understood that they would prefer not to have their members elected by common franchise; that they would prefer members that they themselves appointed. He was surprised of any view in the administration of the affairs of the municipalities.

"It is in fact to reduce the number of Indians and at a later stage, I will have to add a word that I believe," he said. "Capt. the Hon. B. M. V. Kennedy (West Kenya) also referred to the fact that the majority of members of the Council were elected to the original report and supplementary report. Their words and views were given. He admitted that the second report, modified in elementary principles with the report before him, and amendments agreed to. A logical mind would draw the conclusion, and the rightful conclusion, that the report now presented is not the opinion of the Council but the opinion of outside interference.

He called to order. The Ex-Chief called the member to order for expressing improper imputations against other members of the House, whereupon Capt. Kennedy retreated a phrase he had used earlier in the debate. "Every honest man is entitled to his opinion and every man is entitled to his honest opinion." He also admitted that the members had not been given sufficient time to digest the report, saying, "We are going to speed very dearly in the future for including in legislation based on report rather than accuracy."

He also objected to the proposed constitution of the Standing Committee, pointing out that the fundamental object to be achieved by the establishment of local authorities was decentralization. If executive powers were given to the Standing Committee they would have continuity of promotion of the Council. Matters would be decided on a business basis. If however the powers were retained by Government these few would cease to operate. He said that the Hon. J. G. Kibuka (East Kenya) who signed the original report and the supplementary report objected to the expression used by Capt. Kennedy and he certainly did not set out to work or deliver his opinion.

Proposed Amendment. Mr. O'Shea announced that the number of European members increased from nine to ten and the number of Indian members reduced from seven to six was then proposed. Mr. O'Shea said the effect of the amendment would be to prevent the Council Chamber being used as a debating ground for discussion on racial lines. He seemed to be satisfied that the affairs of that

body would be argued out on business lines but on racial lines and the only way to assure that would not happen was to have the Council elected by common franchise. There was much more likelihood of having an effective administration if there was a majority of people who were interested in the affairs of the local government and had the right to give up their own opinions and to have the knowledge and ability to make their own decisions. The Hon. J. G. Kibuka (West Kenya) seconded the proposal. The Colonial Secretary and the Hon. J. G. Kibuka (West Kenya) seconded the proposal. 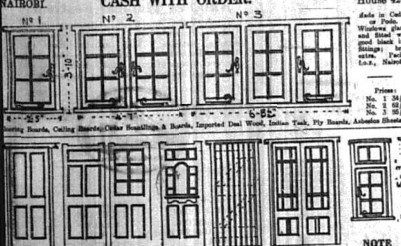

Here and There.

Only one cup of next year's sweeter crop in Palestine has been destroyed by dust storm.

Police statistics show that the town of New Providence has "dried" as it should be, for 13,200 cases of malaria were reported during the last fiscal year, which is the largest number since 1919 and compares with 5,407 in 1927.

A well-attended meeting of the Town Board of the City of Cape Town was held in the Municipal Town Hall City Hall, to support a petition by the City authorities to the administrator for the issue of a proclamation authorizing the extension of the municipal boundaries to incorporate a portion of the area on the summit of Table Mountain in the vicinity of the railway and restaurant area to be enclosed.

One of America's best-known men died recently, and while going through his death one of the sensations of his will found that of Swedish safety matches. The box was found to be 60 years old, dating from 1869. The two men present got out their pipes and to enjoy the emission of lighting up with matches of his venerable age, although they were somewhat doubtful of the truth. Every match, however, caught fire when struck just as readily as if it had come fresh from the factory.

A movement has been set on foot in Bihar, India, for abolishing the time honoured custom of paying several pensions. Bihar people are petitioning the Government for the abolition of this custom as it is a source of several mischiefs.

These things occupying the attention of our government at the present time are, states the "Observer," the search for the true blue rose, the possibility of obtaining thornless roses, and the revival of the old English rose on hybrid roses.

Rose growers always have been, they always are, striving after the true blue rose. Mr. J. Francis, an expert, told a reporter at the summer show of the National Rose Society, which was held recently in the grounds of the Royal Hospital, Chelsea.

"I must confess that I don't think we shall ever get a true blue rose," he says, "as no blue is in the genes. We shall get more as in fact we have done so already in 'Noblesse Blanche' and 'Ruby Pinks.' Two roses which are of value and the diables."

There was an trying to revive the old English scent in roses. Roses with delightful scent are not often beautiful in form and colour. The scented varieties are generally derived from the old-fashioned Danish and French roses and these do not give the hybrid blue roses, which have only too scent. Apparently we cannot have everything. Further we get a wonderful scent but rather a poor bloom or we get magnificent bloom and practically no scent.

As for thornless roses, I cannot say whether we shall ever be able to grow all our roses without thorns. It certainly seems improbable, and we have actually given two roses named 'Zephyrine Drouhin' and 'Rose Blanche' which have no thorns. There is no doubt, however, that it is not so simple as it seems.

Since the Criminal Justice Act, 1925, came into force on June 1, 1925, in Great Britain, there have been 1,140 cases before the courts of moderate charges with being dealt with in charge of cars. A report sent to the Law Commission by the M.P.S., L.B.C.P. WHEAT GROWERS AND A CESS.

An Objection to the Principle Involved.

CONFERENCE DISCUSSION. Government and a Promise by Farmers.

Amongst the subjects which
were discussed by the Maize and
Wheat Conference in colonial
session, was that of the desirability
of introducing legislation to
regulate the sale of fertilizers and
pest remedies.

The Chairman, (Mr. Helms) outlined
the position and stated that the
cost of administering an act
would be considerable, probably
£1,200 to £1,800 per annum. The
value of fertilizers now being
exported annually was about
£20,000 to £30,000 and that the
cost of the administration of an
Ordinance completely was quite
disproportionate to the present
volume of the trade, and he asked
Delegates to consider whether a
middle course such as was sug-
gested by the Coffee Planters'
Union was desirable.

A memorandum by the Agricul-
tural Chemist was then read.
Mr. Bentley's views were as fol-
low:-

He agreed with the Committee of
the Coffee Planters' Union that
an ordinance to regulate the sale
of fertilizers and pest remedies
was desirable, but was of the op-
inion that the cost of fully admin-
istering such an act would be
very considerable.

The Committee of the Coffee
Planters' Union suggested that
the desired protection might be
obtained by prohibiting the import
of fertilizers without a certified
statement of analysis, but he con-
sidered that in most cases this
was being done at present, but
that it was the ultimate purchas-
er and not the importer who
needed the protection.

He suggested that all fertilizers
and pest remedies be registered
and that check analyses be made
from time to time to ensure the
standard of quality being main-
tained. Each requirement would
have to be imported under a cer-
tified statement of analysis to
avoid having to analyze each one.

He thought that action should
be taken which should be cheap or
costless to users.

"Secret" Remedies.

The object of the ordinance was
to prevent the sale of "secret"

remedies at a high price, but it
could only be applied to materials
intended for export or for com-
mercial use.
