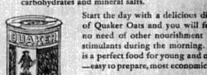

### SCIENCE DEFIES THE LIGHTNING.

**New Attack on a Baffling Problem.**

#### IMPORTANT REMARKS.

One of the major battles of modern science is that waged against lightning. It is about to start in earnest on a mountain top in Tennessee.

Electrical engineers will locate every available device obtainable, will record each bolt and each of every thunderstorm that plays about the crest of Chimborazo mountain.

Since the site where the apparatus is to be located (Coda Tennessee), has an average of twenty thunderstorms each month during the summer, the engineers will have an active time.

The heavy outfitting of the young engineers, who will spend at least six months, or six years, if necessary on this work, will consist of: barometer, centrifugal pump, hydrograph, compass, and other apparatus, not only to record but also to diagnose the effect of each lightning flash. This apparatus will cover a five-mile stretch of wet terrain.

**Orthography.**

Of supreme interest to scientists will be the installation of the barometer orthograph. These instruments are so superior to existing types of ortho- ray orthographs as the modern telegraph to those of San Franklin's time. They will reveal, according to engineers, characteristics of lightning which scientists have thought to discover for centuries.

The installation of equipment will be made on either side of the highest peak of Chimborazo mountain.

The orthograph operates much like the hidden submarine camera by which suitable areas are made to take their own pictures. Installed on the green line, it keeps watch for hours without attention. Any sort of lightning from the smallest spark 100 million volts has a half-mile long, leaves an "ortho- ray" record on the orthograph instrument.

No mechanical device could be made to set so quickly as the moving parts consist of a beam of outside rays, which are bent there and there by electric attraction to leave their marks on a photographic device. The ortho- ray apparatus is a vacuum.

The hydrograph will record

the maximum shock received by the transmission line and thus register the orthograph records. Orders will function as a part of the apparatus to tell the operators how far distant from the crest of the mountain lightning bolts will strike.

All the devices are automatic. For example, oncoming thunderstorms will automatically give warning of their approach by ringing a bell.

#### Valuable Data.

With the installation and with a crew of engineers on duty twenty-four hours each day during the indefinite period, it is expected that valuable results and a mass of lightning on high-voltage transmission lines will be obtained. Such data that the development of lightning-rod apparatus will be greatly facilitated.

Reports to come will form the characteristics of lightning or its effects on high-voltage transmission lines. There is, for example, a difference in opinion as to whether a ratio of 1,000 to 1 of what present-day apparatus indicates, but "old" "cost" of a lightning bolt.

#### A Dog Racing Senation.

#### REMOVAL OF REWARDS OF GREYHOUND CLUB.

(STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.) London, Aug. 29.

A sensation was caused in greyhound racing circles last night when it was announced that all three awards of the National Greyhound Racing Club had resigned. The Club was formed in 1924 and has acted as the "Jockey Club" of dog racing. The awards are Capt. A. E. V. Bradley, Major B. D. Corbett and General Sir B. Balmace.

Captain Bradley, who is a noted master of foxhounds, said last night: "I have nothing to say on the subject; I can neither confirm nor deny it." It is understood that the resignation have arisen over the question of a show season during the winter. The National Greyhound Racing Society, which looks after the financial side of the sport, recently recommended that there should be a general increase of ten per cent. but the question is still a contentious one, and does not appear to be finally settled. The resignation handed by the club, but will be discussed shortly.

### RUBBED BY HER FATHER'S GIFT.

£16,781 Call on Girl's Shares.

#### NO AGENTS.

How a £17,000 gift by a father caused the failure of his daughter was described in the London Daily Express.

Miss Florence May Clifford, of Colchester square, S.W., said that in 1916 her father gave her £7,000 shares of £1 each of which £2 was paid up, in the Consolidated Assurance Company Ltd.

The company went into liquidation in October 1926, after her father's death and the liquidator obtained judgment against her for £16,781 in respect of unpaid calls and interest, and filed the petition against her.

That was her only liability, and she had no assets.

#### INCIDENT IN MIMOR COUNTRIES MATCH.

(STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.) London, Aug. 29.

### ILL-FATED PILGRIMS TO MECCA.

**2,500 Reported to Have Perished.**  
A PROTEST.

A telegram from Amsterdam regarding a number of cases reported from Batavia states that 2,500 Dutch East Indian Mohammedan pilgrims on their way to Mecca perished either on the journey or in the neighbourhood of Mecca. Some are believed to have died from exhaustion. The pilgrimage consisted of 26,000, of whom only 21,000 returned to the Dutch East Indies.

The Dutch Government has made investigations into, and has prohibited a number of cases of pilgrims, the conditions under which pilgrims visit Mecca. It is said that they often travel without sufficient money, and many are the victims of disease, on the way to the great city on the sea board. Complaints are made regularly every year. There are sometimes no fewer than 100,000 pilgrims clustering round the Kaaba, an oblong building containing the sacred black stone, towards which all Mohammedans turn when worshiping. Thousands of pilgrims have been known to remain at Mecca, unable to leave, as they are without resources "well" supplied by the Government.

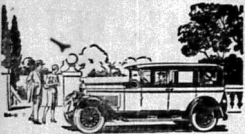

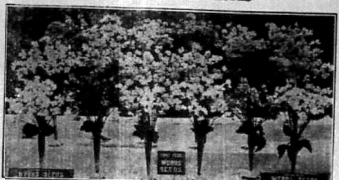

The total mileage of roads maintained by this Department amounts to 3,777 miles. The expenditures under the Road Maintenance Works in the various divisions was as follows:—

A considerable amount of important work during the spring season was carried out effectively under the supervision of the Administration.

The gradual replacement of old timber bridges by new permanent structures was carried out as far as the funds were available. It is hoped that larger grants will be available in the future so that this important work and that interrupted in the past will become less frequent.

### Water Supply.

The Water Supply system at Dar-es-Salaam was satisfactorily maintained and the distribution system extended. The need for an improvement of the whole system is pressing, as considerable parts of the town are not adequately supplied. An increase in the supply will also increase in storage and extensions to make it essential.

With a view to increasing the supply, trial wells were put down in General Creek with excellent results, a copious supply of pure water being found. Further the provision of adequate funds for the maintenance of the temporary works and tanks have been installed with a Turbo pump capable of delivering 1,000 gallons per hour into the existing tanks. It is intended to put down further bore wells, collecting main to a central reservoir and thus increase the supply from this source to 20,000 gallons a day.

The present average daily consumption amounts to 120,000 gallons. The total expenditure and the revenue received for 1920 and 1919 are as follows:—

The revenue is exclusive of the amount supplied from the Government. Hospital, etc., to the approximate value of £120.

As regards the department of the old wells, a considerable amount of supply water of water to be obtained. Trial bore wells were put down and a scheme got out for developing a deep well with a distribution scheme in connection with this supply has been arranged for.

It is to be regretted that funds were not available for installing sedimentation tanks and filters. It has not been possible to give the attention which they demand due to the water supply and drainage work being properly undertaken. Lack of trained staff has prevented schemes being properly investigated and estimates put out while funds were not available for the adequate expansion of existing water supply.

Stores were made and plans prepared for a water supply to Kilimanjaro, Tanga, Dodoma and Tanga, in addition to a scheme for increasing the supply and storage and extending the distribution of water to the district of the Kilimanjaro.

Various Works have been carried out for various water divisions. It is to be regretted that a sewerage scheme for Dar-es-Salaam should be undertaken in the near future. The work is growing rapidly and the lack of a proper sewerage scheme is becoming very serious matter.

## COMING OF CICATERIANS TO BRITAIN.

Celebration of Eighth Century.

### FARMER MOVES.

At Waverley Abbey, near Farnham there was commemorated recently the eighth centenary of the coming of the monks of the Cistercian Order to England.

The "Daily Mail" thus describes the occasion: "Eight hundred years ago the first Cistercian monks came to this island from Normandy and walked from their landing place on the coast to Waverley. For the abbey founded there the order adopted all over England, and numbered among its lodges the renowned monasteries of Fontenay and Tintern. Like these great seats of the quiet, Waverley is now a ruin, but in even greater ruin still. The few remains of its walls are, however, well tended."

This little shrine of the past Major Anderson welcomed the members of the Cistercian Order in England, and in the presence of Cardinal Bourne a service was celebrated by the Vice-Chancellor of the Cistercian Order throughout the world, the Abbot of West Malle, in Flanders.

A more touching and beautiful scene could hardly have been conceived. The altar had been erected on the site of the ancient high altar, and of fine structure of wood and carved shifedness of those participating. A choir of the same light materials, with lines hanging from which were his arms and palms, covered a carved oak which acted as a throne for the Cardinal-Archbishop. But for the rest the church was made of the stone and the high-stone, and the grass underfoot, and into this scene from the narrow-belt beyond the stream a line of monks came.

Abbot of West Malle.

Among them were the members of many orders and congregations. Most noted, of course, were the Cistercian monks, themselves, in white woolen cowls and the black capuchon which fall in straight lines from the shoulder.

You could scarcely call it by other than as the procession moved the altar-place, with at its head the first Cistercian to step for centuries on the spot, but without anomaly, the way had reached the words: "To give and to keep for us. O Lord, the fruits of the earth, we beseech Thee to bear us."

hear us." For the Cistercians were the greatest farmers in medieval England, to whose fostering care the development and growth of husbandry was in largest part due. Out of their wood-planting, by the machinery of special suit, the wood trade of the country was born.

And, indeed, the Order still presides the same art, still fills the land, and among the monks present was a monk of the great Abbey of Mount Melroy in Ireland, whose name is still said to be made by his name into the same sort of stockings which were worn in the 13th century.

Two Thousand Singers. During the singing of the Credo the congregation itself must have been about 2,000 people present—look up the Latin words, terribly at first, and the choir with such fervor that the choir of priests and novices stopped and listened the responses, the alternate verses, to come from the people rather than from the numerous monks.

But before that, Cardinal Bourne had mounted into an improvised tribune, and from there, the great length of his robe streaming over the wide length of the altar, addressed those present in words which linked up the gap of his century with the past. Faith, and discipline we stand where for new ritual, new forms of prayer. . . . we take up the ritual, the vestments, and the prayers they just, and were they to return among us from these grave labor they would find nothing strange.

KEY SIGNS

New York City now has 20,880 electric signs to add to its numerical billboards. These figures were obtained from an intensive survey carried out by the New York Edison Company, in connection with the sixth annual Electric Sign show. The signs represent an aggregate of 1,800,000 lamp-hours per annum in certain localities as shown by the purchase of an hour in the Times Square, to be used for electrical advertising only.

The ground floor is occupied by stores, and the first floor—too low to be valuable, for signs space-by-space, and the rest of the building on two sides is covered with lighted billboards, and all there is room on the roof for a large electric sign. The rental of this space is said to bring in a larger income than could possibly be obtained by letting the rooms.

### A NEW SCIENTIFIC MISSION TO AFRICA.

War or Two Deadly Diseases.

CONGO SCOURGE

Two young scientists left London in last week on a mission which, if successful, may save thousands of lives and be equal in importance to the discovery of penicillin (writes a special correspondent of the "Sunday Times").

They were Dr. Clement C. Chesterman, of the Baptist Missionary Society, and Dr. W. G. Thomas, research pharmacologist at the University of Worcester.

They left on a six-weeks' journey to the Belgian Congo, carrying with them compounds and vaccines to combat sleeping sickness and yaws fever.

Years of experiment have been necessary to arrive at this compound which Dr. Chesterman and Dr. Thomas will use in their fight against sleeping sickness. Their beats is seasonal and the virus has never been known before under the direction of Dr. A. B. Lowenthal, Professor of Bacteriology at the University of Worcester.

Dr. Lowenthal was present when the young scientists left. He described his formula as "the logical development of a series of compounds."

"I say logical," he said. "Because of our continued endeavor to hear in mind the climatic and other conditions absent during the experiments we have made in our research."

"We have had gratifying results on animals and also, in part, on human beings but full experiments on human beings are not possible outside tropical Africa, as the disease, though goodly, is regional."

"Sleeping sickness need not be confined with the steepest slopes constantly found in England and America—and in the most dreadful form of tropical malaria. It kills off the natives in thousands, and devastates all domestic animals in the neighbourhood, so that if the native chooses to resist the epidemic he, his cattle, and therefore his livelihood, are lost." Dr. Chesterman, who had been

working at Takum Hospital, in the Upper Volta district, located at the geographical centre of Africa, since 1921.

Dr. Lowenthal's remarks.

"I said him if he thought the natives would place any obstacle in their way for combating the task."

"On the contrary," he answered me, "we have been able to give relief and prevention from further attacks in other illnesses by inoculation, and the natives have great faith in the needle. They come to us for their ailments, and things, and trust in its simplicity."

In the Native Village.

Dr. Chesterman's hospital will probably be the centre of Dr. Thomas's work, although his letter tells me that he expects to go on to the centre of the disease in the neighbourhood of Kisumu.

It will be impossible to describe in a hospital the number of patients I shall treat," he said.

Dr. Thomas indicated his own part in the undertaking, and added that events should be given to the three institutions which made his work possible—his own university at Worcester, where he did his preliminary work, the John Simon Dugdale Memorial Foundation, under whose auspices Dr. A.B. Lowenthal is being carried out, and Parke, Davis and Co., who have supplied him with the essential compounds.

The three scientists told more of their hopes, and how the new serological compounds have proved superior to the drugs hitherto used. With the light of a high ideal, they explained that their present work has never been able to leave subjects immune against sleeping sickness only for a period as short as three weeks or a month, but the new compounds, they hope, will provide immunity for from three to six months.

The longer the period of immunity, the easier will it be to break the cycle of the disease.

Dr. Lowenthal is to continue his work in the Congo. He aims at a compound that can be taken by the mouth and not injected. This would afford greater facilities for

serum and be continually available. **Yaws Fever.**


Dr. Chesterman, who is the author of the "Handbook for African Dispensary Practice" and in whose district sleeping sickness has been reduced to the almost insensory figure of one patient out of the population—two, he tells me, to eight cases and sometimes just a double mission, for in addition to working in co-operation with Dr. Thomas, and placing his hospital at his disposal for sleeping sickness work, he is to wage war on yaws fever.

Pointing to his suggestions, he said: "I have with me vaccines for the cause of yaws fever, and shall stop at Malindi, the port of the Congo, and the first of the continent, to see the arrangements there."

"Yaws fever is a post-tropical disease, as it is carried by the mosquitoes of the tropics. The vaccine is new, and in the last few months of labour by Dr. Hinds, of the Whitcomb Dispensary of the Rhodesia Hospital, I am proud that I am able to take Dr. Hinds's vaccine for the first time to Africa."

### Death of Banchar.

A description of what is regarded as the largest bunch of bananas ever seen in Zanibar. It was seen from Kilimanjaro, the hills of the Zanibar "Oriental Oasis." The bunch, if it is stated, came from Kilimanjaro. It was five feet six inches in length and the weight, one hundred and fifteen pounds. The bunch consisted of twenty-one fully developed "hands" containing three hundred and twenty-one mature bananas, and eight undeveloped "hands" which were one hundred and ten small fruits. Many of the latter might have reached maturity but for the fact that the tree collapsed beneath the weight of the bunch which therefore had to be cut earlier than would otherwise have been necessary. The cause was the variety known locally as *Mingga Maa*.

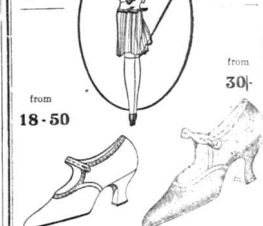

**CINEMA STUDY OF CANCER.**

Everyone will agree that the objects attained by the first international conference on cancer, held together by the British Cancer Campaign, which has just passed its fiftieth anniversary, surpassed all expectations (writes the London Morning Post). U.S. Chairman of the International Cancer Conference, recently made that very statement, and he should be appointed by the Government, as a man so successful if such a commission had done, for the following reasons:

The conference has followed the evidence of the leading experts of all nations in the sphere of a work.

It has laid out the State working.

It has vast amount of valuable material has been studied and will be published within two months.

Generous Britain

The British Empire Cancer Campaign is the policy of supporting and encouraging research on cancer, has taken an important step forward in convening this conference, and thanks to the generosity of Sir Richard Sturges, the funds, which are all too scanty, have not been exhausted on for the expenses.

The delegates of the conference have discussed the cancer problem from two main angles.

Firstly they have examined the cause of the disease, in the hope that the cure, or means of prevention, will be discovered, and, secondly, they have considered the best means of treating the present methods of treating sufferers.

It is generally admitted that in order to discover the cause of cancer it is necessary to go back to the elements of the human body, the cells themselves, and to study the way in which they grow.

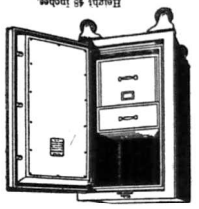

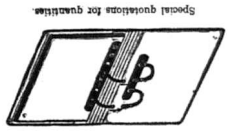

**Topics for Motorists.**  
**Cruelty to Cars.**  
**Warning against Overloading.**

Most of us expect a great deal from our cars, and most of us get it. But there are some things which any extra strain upon the car is an imposition, for there is a limit upon the amount of wear which can be put upon the engine and chassis. The point is not so much that there is a certain maximum load, but that the engine and chassis are not designed to carry a load which would require them to work constantly and efficiently, and that the treatment and handling of the vehicle should be varied in accordance with the load it is carrying.

In the first place, the really high and efficient vehicles depend almost entirely upon the amount of weight to be transported to power developed. I will not weary the reader now with tabulated calculations, but it can easily be shown that while an apparently powerful car is less capable of distribution of performance through the addition of a hundredweight or so of load, more than one-fifth of the horsepower is theoretically made inefficient.

Just as an illustration of what I mean, let us compare two cars, one a nominal seven-horsepower, low-horse-power two-wheeler, and the other a fourteen-horsepower, high-speed touring. The engine of the little one is of a weight of about 100 pounds, and probably develops something like 18 horsepower at its most effective rate of revolution. Probably also the complete car weighs no more than ten hundredweight. The other motor likely weighs a steady 60 horsepower without unduly overstraining the engine. The small car develops one horsepower for every 60 lbs. of its weight, whereas the big one has to drag along 75 lbs. of its weight for every 1 horsepower of its power output. The small car therefore is relatively more efficient—but you must keep its size, while the large car has such a high reserve of power that such a motor master may "load" drive it.

**Matter of Percentage.**  
 But to return to the matter of weight of load, and the reason why overloading is so much more serious than it appears to be. It is a matter of percentage. The big car with its complement of five 5,444 is proportioning them to the average specimen of 10 horsepower. The small one, with its two, is proportioning them to a two-horsepower specimen.

Now, a single passenger will weigh 142½ lbs. The addition of a passenger from the addition of subtraction of one passenger from either of these cars makes a difference of 8.75 per cent. to the load of the small vehicle, and of only 2.50 per cent. to that of the large car. Thus three extra passengers on the latter would throw less of a strain upon the engine than one extra passenger on the small car.

I might remark by the way that the figures given which illustrate calculations are based upon average conditions, and apply as far as I know to any particular motor car. They are designed simply to illustrate the proposition that the more weight you put on a car, the more strain it is put upon. The smaller the engine, the more strain it should be given a treatment of it. The greater the underrunning capacity of the motor, the more strain it can stand. It is almost impossible to avoid overloading a moderately powerful motor car when packing for a tour, because it is an inherent disadvantage of the motor car that the more people it carries, the less space is available for luggage. And, naturally, the more luggage there is to be carried. No amount of ingenuity on the part of designers can ever create some sort of a magical impossibility, as the luggage problem presents such a serious question of compromise on the part of driver and passenger. The passenger must not down the portable belongings to the floor, but he must make allowance in his driving for the fact that the car is probably carrying more weight than for which the springs were designed. Obviously, to coach along at high speed on a rough road with an overloaded car is fatal, but it is obvious, I will say no more about it.

**Luggage Grids.**  
 As a matter of fact, with the general use of rear luggage grids, the concentration of weight on the wrong place is usually a much more serious source of trouble. The fact that the car is carrying an unduly heavy load. A luggage grid should be used for 100 lbs. or more. For 100 lbs. or more, it is usually preferable to use a luggage grid, and the greater the weight carried upon it, the more marked is its effect upon the steering and stability of the car. A load may be completely split so far as the driver's pleasure is concerned by such unscientific distribution of weight, while I have no doubt that many an accident would be traced to a solid overload by the same fault. There is still another aspect of the overloading question to be considered, and it is of equal importance in its effect upon the pleasure to be derived from a motor tour, it directly affects the


comfort of the passengers. To avoid upsetting the stability of the car, you remove a trunk or a suitcase or a box from the rear car and place them in the rear compartment of the other, or another compartment, and other small articles, as well as a lunchbox, etc. The result is that the contents of the trunk, suitcase, etc., are cramped, and restricted in the ability to show their best legs. They quickly become crumpled, and decrease for that purpose of value, in a failure within fifty miles—and the prospect of the future hundreds is a nightmare.

**The Solution.**  
 But what is the solution of all these difficulties? There must be one, because motor touring is indulged in with complete enjoyment by thousands of people. Well, my own contribution to the solution is this: Limit passenger luggage to the equivalent of one suitcase per person, and have such additional equipment as may be required sent on by train to certain definite centres, or to certain dates in the course of the tour.  
 Changes of clothing are easily packed, and killed linen and blankets of home and are change in other portions and underwear—undoubtedly in the car at the same time. Inevitably, it is unnecessary overloading. The strains of wireless music may make a very pleasant background to picnic meals, a round of golf and a night may make a refreshing break in the monotony of continuous travelling—but these transient joys will be unending and over-indulging discomfort which their indulgence must "wear"—(Hon. Mrs. Victor Forster, Cape Argus).

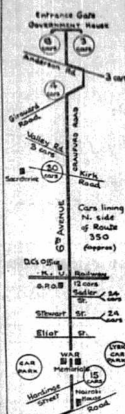

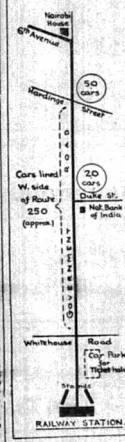

**LOCUSTS IN TRANS KOZIA AND PLATEAU AREA.**

**Official Review of the Position.**

**ADVICE TO FARMERS**

The Deputy Director of Agriculture (Mr. H. Mervin) has written the following report on the locust plague in the Trans-Kozia and Plateau Area.

Farmers in the Trans-Kozia and Plateau areas have to contend with several locust swarms every year. The worst was a general tendency to move East by South, although the new arrivals are generally from Mount Elgon. It has been visited by swarms coming over from the Sudd River area. In each case they have moved to the East.

If it is all feasible, farmers should endeavour to get their crops in the evening and early morning. The locusts are most numerous if they are so situated as they are in young plantations, to give the locusts as much as possible to eat.

The boys should be driven out at about 8.30 a.m. to 8.45 a.m. to make a noise in the thicket. There will not be any locusts for them to collect because they have been driven out of their own area, and the noise will not fail to give warning to the locusts having been killed by locusts.
