the three territories, for if business men are cordial in their relations with one another, then we have established a foundation of ideas which will help to bring about what might make itself felt by the respective governments and the people.

Young but Vigorous.

"Although Moshi is a young member of the Association, we are not less enthusiastic because and been the means of making good progress in the district, but we would not have been in this position had it not been for the aid with the Associated Chambers of Commerce, and I trust that our young generation and practical help has been given to us by our constituent chambers have to us. It is pleasing to find that neighbouring towns of Arabia has formed its own chamber and that their delegates have been able to be with us on this occasion. It shows that a progressive spirit is an evidence in the Province.

"We have to thank our Executive for its great organizing work, performed with much self sacrifice by the officers, and we appreciate the services of Mr. Kivone, who has acted as our delegate on the Executive. As Moshi is so far distant from Mombasa, it has been possible for Mr. Kivone, the Acting Governor to be with us, but we do appreciate his telegraphic message proving his interest in our deliberations. We are, however, pleased to see his representatives, the Provincial Commissioner, and other officials.

"We are also pleased to welcome our legislative member, and the Presidents of the local Associations all of whom have worked in friendly co-operation with our Chamber."

"We are sorry that Moshi has been able to accommodate its visitors in such a comfortable manner would have been possible had the session been held in a larger town, but we hope that they will bear in mind that we are a young district, though sufficiently progressive that when it will again be our privilege to have another session here, we may be able to do better."

"We rejoice that you have been able to be with us, and we feel that the outcome of this session will be the means of establishing still more cordial relations between our own territory and other portions of Eastern Africa.

"I now ask the members of the Moshi Chamber to rise and drink the health of 'Our Guests, the Delegates of the Constituent Chambers,' and I couple with the toast the name of Mr. R. S. Campbell, our President, who although he has not been well the last few days, nevertheless has placed his own personal comfort on one side and gives us the ben-

efit of his wide experience and organizing powers as Chairman of the session."  
Mr. R. S. Campbell, President of the Association, expressed his appreciation of the very interesting and useful of the evening discussion. He said:

"I rise to thank you for the hearty welcome you have extended to me and for the way you have honoured the Moshi. When your President attended the session held at Mombasa last year he put up with an exceptional journey for the half-yearly session to be held at Moshi, and he has done so and return as required."

"It is very the fact that with one exception all Tanganyika Chambers of Commerce have this session should be held in the territory. S. of the feeling of appreciation and gratitude which we accept a place on the Commission appointed by the Indian Government to proceed to South Africa and discuss the Indian problem which so many had failed to solve. He said that once both sides got down to a basis and equally discuss of finding a solution, with both prepared to adopt a spirit of give and take, they found that the problem was not insoluble."

Gentlemen, I fully believe that the problems affecting the only union of these E.A. territories are not insoluble and that they may be approached in all likelihood of fair play by all interested to find a solution which will make for general economic progress of these territories."

"But I see some delegates are all tired of 'they' and still more of the sound of my voice after two days in session. I will therefore ask visiting delegates and guests to rise and drink the health of our hosts, the President and members of the Moshi Chamber of Commerce."

The Provincial Commissioner on behalf of His Excellency the Acting Governor expressed pleasure that the Association was meeting in Tanganyika for the first time and hoped that its deliberations would be successful.

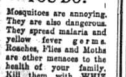

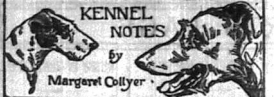

The necessity for the building of a permanent bridge over the Tiro River was stressed at the meeting of the Associated Chambers of Commerce, held at a session regarding the Mombasa-Nairobi road was not forward by the Mombasa Chamber.

Mr. Callaghan proposed the following resolution:—

"That this Chamber instructs its delegates to point out the urgency of keeping up the bridge on the road between Nairobi and Mombasa."

Speaking to the motion he said that he thought it was generally agreed that the road itself was as good as could be expected, but that there had been frequent interruption of road communication on account of the Tiro bridge having been washed away. He thought it was very necessary that Mombasa and Nairobi should be connected by a main road. In view of the new form of weight tax imposed on motorists he thought that the Government should support the resolution. He said that he understood that the R.E.A.A. had not built this bridge.

**Use of Locust Money.**

The President said that the bridge which had been built by the R.E.A.A. had been carried away by heavy floods. The Agricultural Department had agreed to devote some money to the construction of the bridge to assist in the mobility of their officers for the locust campaign. He now hoped however that people using locust money could build this bridge.

Another point regarding the bridge was that Mombasa was becoming a popular resort for holidays and when people got to Mombasa it was necessary for them to have some kind of transport. Therefore some would come down by road if the bridge were in satisfactory condition. He understood that even now the average number of cars which travelled on the road was about 500 a month.

The resolution was carried unanimously.

**Difficulties of Manoeuvring a Car in Confined Space.**

**Useful Hints for the Novice.**

The difficulty of reversing is brought up in the fact that the steering gear does not, during that operation, have the same effect as it does when the car is going forward. The first thing to do when reversing is to assume an easy, natural position so that a slight turn of the steering wheel will not cause the car to swing round in a way that is not intended. It is also possible, and it is a good idea, to have a steering wheel that is not too heavy, and that is not too stiff.

Nearly all problems of reversing relate to driving a car backwards through a narrow space. It is not necessary to imagine that space to be the doorway of a home front door, which is approached by an R-shaped drive as shown in the diagram. **On the Open Road.**

It is rare that there is anything much more complicated than this, and when the driver becomes accustomed to the action of the steering and the feel of the car, he can use the throttle pedal in the normal manner.

As the car goes forward in this manner across the road, it is run the last few yards under its own impulsion, simultaneously putting the gear lever into neutral and raising the hand clutch. From the reverse side it is on the floor. If this is done in the correct manner, it is up to the driver until you have finished turning the car round. Stop the car with the brake just before the front tyre bumps the kerb.

Simultaneously with reversing gear, turn round and see the view of the rear window, as before, let the clutch in and turn the steering wheel about ninety degrees to the opposite lock. Again let the car run for a few yards under its own impulsion, employing that time to move the gear lever into neutral, and to see that the car is in the correct position to be reversed.

This manoeuvre should be repeated until the car is facing in the direction intended. But the number of forward and reverse manoeuvres that are necessary will depend on the way the car is to be reversed two or three times, but whatever happens, always use all the car's power to get the car out of the first turn from an angle the best as it is possible to get every foot of space makes a difference.

The campaign which will precede the Legislative Council election will, we hope, admit the prospective and, in doing so, find again for Nairobi a firm foundation for its political and economic principles. But at the point which we wish to emphasize briefly to day is the belief that the influence of the Legislative Council election in encouraging the wider vision should produce a beneficial reaction upon the succeeding elections for the Municipal Council. If Nairobi public opinion is adjusted and disposed properly upon these matters, the capital ought to occupy in the life of the Colony that realization should be and stimulate the civic spirit in later weeks when candidates for municipal honors seek the franchise of the Nairobi public. The country as a whole cannot engage an interest in and accept responsibility for the development of the Capital leg the initial business in the direction of the proposed extension of the road from the sewerage. Such an extension can only be wise and useful if they are satisfied by an examination of the relationship between Nairobi and the rest of the country. We were directed the attention of Nairobi people today to the fact that they have never been asked to contribute to the cost of the Town Council election purposes has been arranged — widely. Nairobi people are called upon to apply for the right to vote. Their applications must be made on the prescribed forms before 11th March — i.e. within 12 days. The Town Council which will select the members among candidates will be the first to be asked to contribute to the cost of the Town Council election. It is in the Town Council which the reform will be most effective. Any suggestion to be made effective, among active and responsible Town Council, its

members must be carefully selected. But the essential element is that the distinguished public must apply to be put on the poll-books. A very simple and, in our opinion, a sound consideration that it is sufficient for the present authorities merely to give notice that applications for a vote are invited. If the Roll is to be a representative one something more is needed than depends upon action by the public. At the very least the vote application forms should be distributed to every house in the town and collected after a stated interval. Only by such means can the Roll be made reasonably complete and we hope that some such practical and necessary step will be taken at once. Elsewhere that would be done by a Ratepayers' Association or other public body Nairobi has no such organization but it is no reason for the neglect of elementary steps.

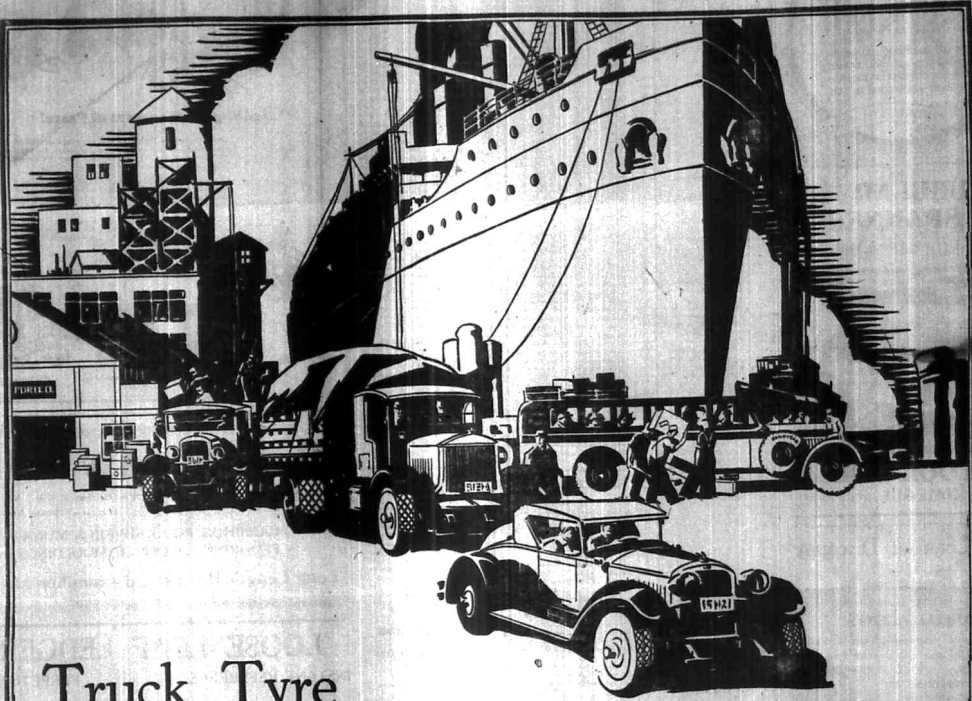

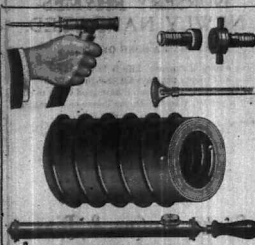
