Views expressed to Sir Samuel Wilson by a deputation of Kenya Elected Members and representatives of the Convention of Associations, are indicated in a statement which has been issued.

The Deputation stated that the Hillton Young Report had made federation more difficult than before and had made public opinion in Kenya suspicious of the proposal. It is added that the people of the Colony never sought federation and were only prepared to contemplate closer union in Imperial interests.

Kenya's interest in the matter was predominantly economic but before going into any closer union the Colony must be prepared to give change in its present line of policy.

The Deputation informed Sir Samuel Wilson that they were not prepared to put forward any fresh proposals but being fully alive to the necessity of improving the machinery for joint action in East African matters of common interest, would sympathetically consider any proposals he might put forward.

Sir Samuel Wilson appreciated the deputation's attitude and assured them there was no desire on the part of the Secretary of State to impose any scheme not generally acceptable. Until he had visited the other territories he could not formulate any concrete ideas but would give due consideration in England to the views of the deputation.

Alarming Increase in Motor Accidents.

The Solution of the Problem.

(CONTINUED FROM PAGE 1.)

London, April 11.—While most of us realize that there are a great number of motor accidents on the English roads, it is a considerable shock to find that the number during the last year alone totalled 4,118. This means an average 17 people the whole world from their homes each day to meet their death on the highways of Great Britain.

Such are the figures contained in the report just issued by the Home Office, on the subject of Road Accidents. If such a number of people were to be killed all in one day, it would be considered an appalling tragedy. It is, however, three times more terrible than the loss of life in the Titanic disaster, but because the toll is a gradual one and spread over the whole of the country nobody seems to realize just how bad things are. It is the total figure for the year you find before you in a Government Department.

Besides the 4,118 killed there were 154,588 people injured during the year. This is 429 injured every day or 17 killed.

Amazing Figures.

These are amazing figures and give one forcibly to realize that one of the worst features of the increase in the accidents is greater than the increase in the number of motor cars.

the increase in the number of motor registered was only 6.8 per cent. This means that the number of dangerous drivers on the roads is on the increase.

While there is no doubt that the congestion on the roads is a contributory cause of very great accidents, the higher speeds and the large number of new drivers with little road experience has a great deal to do with the enormous number of accidents.

The deaths are 500 more than in 1921, and equal 1,227 in London alone. The grand total of killed and injured was almost double that of 1921.

Driving Tests.

What the solution of the problem is to be no one has yet decided, but there is no unanimous decision. Some recommend a substitute driving test, and others the provision of Government of the roads at points of danger with warning signals to force motorists to slow down.

Margate's Record.

The Chief Constable of Margate, which has done through the year without a single fatal accident, says that the chief cause of the present state of plenty of vehicles is the way the principal difficulty now is that the highway crowd who seem to forget everything in their hurry to get along down by the sea.

Traffic Tests.

It has been suggested from time to time that it would be a very good thing to institute Traffic Police whose sole concern would be the control of pedestrians and motorists in the town, and at dangerous cross-roads. The Police cannot be expected to cope properly with the ever-growing list of motor as well as open carts and perform all the rest of their multitudinous duties.

NAIROBI WAR MEMORIAL HOSPITAL.

Extension Scheme to Cost Over 50000.

NEW ACTIVITIES.

(STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.) NAIROBI, May 11.—The third General Meeting of the Nairobian Hospital was held at the Nairobian Hotel, the following were present: Mr. Thackeray, M.C. (Chairman), Messrs. E. E. Ward, C. J. F. David, P. G. Thomas, C. F. G. MacCall, W. J. Houston, T. W. O'Connell, Dr. Tennant and Mr. T. G. Thomas.

It was stated that, during the past year, the Hospital Board had given a considerable amount of time to the revision of the Hospital insurance scheme and that, in the light of past experience and in the hope of attracting many more subscribers, the insurance benefits had been very generously extended. It was pointed out that the insurance premium had been drastically reduced. Unfortunately, the increase of membership had been disappointingly small, and, if the scheme of the Board was to be justified, it was necessary that the general public should support the scheme more widely than at present. It was considered that, in view of the insurance scheme, it would be observed that, whereas there were a fewer number of claims during the year as compared with 1922, the monetary value of the claims was much greater than previously, and this, despite an average reduction of hospital admission charges, and the income revenue from insurance was however higher during the year than the claims met, and it was accordingly to be expected that the year's working was on the right side.

Extension Scheme.

Another important matter was the extension to the Nairobian Hospital building. The Board had decided that the extension was necessary and had caused plans to be prepared by an architect, Mr. H. P. Grayson, F.R.I.B.A., and these plans had been approved and the necessary approval of the Government had been secured for the extension at the earliest possible moment. It was stated that the estimated cost was some £10,000.

The Chairman speaking for the Board, expressed great appreciation of the manner in which Mr. T. W. O'Connell had carried out his duties as Secretary and that it was felt that it was largely due to his good work that the Hospital was in its present satisfactory financial position.

Mr. David suggested that the insurance scheme would be most widely supported if it were more

liberal and extended that the fact that the additional money was available for outside nursing was not generally known, and that this should be advertised throughout the district.


