Record Figure of Ten and a Half Million Pounds.

EMPIRE'S LOWER PERCENTAGE.

Britain Leading in Cotton Textiles but Well Down on Motor Industry List.

The second extract from the 1928 Report upon the trade of Kenya and Uganda deals with import traffic.

The trade imports for 1928 amounted to £8,747,000, the first time in the history of the traffic amounted to over ten millions.

The re-export trade to Tanganyika is now nearly a million pounds.

Uganda's share of the eight and three quarter millions of imports is just under two million pounds, representing 29.9 per cent.

Noteworthy increases in importations include foodstuffs, bags and acids, fuel, oil, motor spirit, motor cars and lorries. There is an actual decrease in cars in number only and an actual increase in value.

Among the imports which have decreased are agricultural machinery, motor tractors, motor cycles and bicycles in specie.

Perhaps the most remarkable increase is that of imported sugar which has increased eight-fold namely from 9,734 cwt. valued at £10,700 in 1927 to 84,344 cwt. valued at £68,900 in 1928.

Britain is still chief supplier of textiles and other textiles which are now increasing in favour among natives but has a very disappointing share in the motor car trade.

The Empire share of the import trade in 1928 was 61.13 per cent, as against 63.1 per cent. in 1927. Japan was the U.S.A. continue to benefit by direct steamship trade.

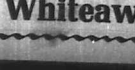
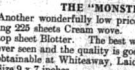

AMATEUR GARDENING VEGETABLES.

"Have you a garden?"
"No. We shall only be here for a few months in the north with little planting anything."

But there are many vegetables which take far less than six months to grow, and even the amateur with no more knowledge of gardening than the information supplied on the seed packets, one, with a little care, obtains quite surprising results.

If possible, the temporary garden should be laid out where it will be irrigated by the furrows which curve off the highway, but the channel should be arranged, that if liquid or any other fluid harmful to plants, it poured down the drain, it can be diverted to a spot where it will do no damage.

Dwarf French beans, dwarf peas, radishes, cucumber, tomato, spring onions and small lettuce are all quick growers, and will supply ready a little trouble. Dwarf beans should be planted about eight inches apart and ears must be taken that in the seedling stage they are not attacked by the worms. If a plant is noticed above all at soil level, a search along the row will often reveal the whereabouts of the culprit, and he should be removed at once or the whole bed will suffer.

Dwarf peas should be planted in well manured trenches about nine to twelve inches wide and six inches deep, in four lines at four inch intervals will serve both well. Allow about eight inches between for a footway between each line. It is better, both with dwarf beans and peas, to plant in rows—about three rows—start with, and move a week or two days later. In this way a continuous supply is obtained instead of too many all at once.

Radishes, lettuce, spring onions, and tomatoes should be planted in especially prepared soil, silted free from stones, and very fine. Put the seeds in a dry bed, and water well afterwards. If the sun is at all strong, these plants require a thick shade, which may be made of rough

stalks with grass laid over the top. Any overripe tomato, too bad to eat, may be used for providing seeds. When the small seeds are about three or four inches high, they should be thinned until they receive from the sun and wind the same amount of light as the larger and first two of three main stems. The remaining soil on left to bear fruit, and as the main stem shows signs of over-growing the strength it should be cut near the ground that the fruit does not rest on the ground.

Cucumber plants should be well manured and allowed to grow on a framework, so that the cucumbers as they hang down, will be clear of the ground. If they lie on the soil they invariably collect insects and do not grow straight or to their full size.

The big white round beans will germinate more quickly if they are sown for a day or two in a mixture of mud and warm water. When they are eight or ten inches high, plant out about two foot apart, in two lines at that distance. A few sticks will serve both lines. They seem to be very hardy plants, but require stout sticks for support, as they grow to a height of ten or twelve feet. They require a more prolific and finer fruit will be obtained by sowing of the side shoots, and, when a good weight is reached, the tip of the main stem. These beans take about four months to bear, but they are so prolific that they are well worth the long wait. Radishes green and cooked with a little mint they taste very green peas, and those which go white in the dried pods are very good and stored for use when other vegetables are scarce.

Manure for the house or at trouble to grow, and if planted eighteen inches apart and two inches deep, a good shade of vegetables makes and pumpkins. The yellow and orange ones are disappointing, but the green variety do very well if properly shaded.

A sprig of mint will take root almost anywhere where there is sufficient moisture, but care must be taken that the ground around

the sprig is kept very wet for the first week after planting. Parsley can be grown from seed, and when once it has taken root requires no further care. Any potatoes too small for use in the house may be cultivated in the garden. Plant in rows about eight inches apart, and when the leaves are well formed, back the potatoes with soil, so that the potatoes will not see the surface soil go green and bitter.

All those vegetables which grow well inside the time limit of a six months, and for a day or eight months, are not so difficult to grow when one has passed the transplanting stage, and obtained the attention of the cultivator. District produce is well staked, will grow well within six months, but it requires a little knowledge of gardening and husbandry to get a crop from a poor soil.

The cost of the seed packets is very small compared with the results, and there is no comparison in price or quality between the vegetables bought from a shop and those freshly patterned from one's own garden.

Editor's Note.

It is very interesting to get the views of an amateur on gardening. It explains the points of difficulty which an amateur has to contend with and which the professional seldom meets.

Our article to-day based on the correspondent's personal experience will interest many, and I hope will encourage those who have taken up temporary quarters to make one of their gardens. It should also appeal in part to those who have not the advantage of an irrigation scheme but have to depend on a comparatively short rain season. It shows how necessary it is to have a good drainage system to ensure that the water which can be saved, and the resulting crop reaped before the soil has become too dry.

Sisal as an All-Round FIRE

Its Value for Marine Purposes.

R.M.B. REPORT.

That increasing supplies of sisal are being landed in the British Empire and that its use for marine purposes is becoming more and more important, is the main point of a report of the Imperial Institute and the Imperial Maritime School, (H.M. Stationery Office, London.)

"In Great Britain," starts the report, "sisal is a familiar fibre, well adapted for the manufacture of high-grade cordage of all kinds. The fibre is white and lustrous, possesses good strength and flexibility, and is well adapted for all the purposes for which cordage fibres are required."

Although there has been a prejudice against the use of sisal for marine cordage, it has been shown, as the result of trials carried out by the Imperial Maritime School, that fibre was found on a par with more highly valued fibres as to performance. Moreover, it was found to be more durable than the other fibres to be distinguished by the action of sea-water. It is implied that sisal cordage has been used on the German fleet should have been equipped with such ropes during the Great War.

Fisheries who have used the fibre for their twines and trawling-lines speak very highly of its durability and also of its power of withstanding corrosive substances.

Manufactures are therefore advised to turn their attention to East African fibre, which they will find superior in every respect to other foreign fibres.

"British fibres, such as hemp and coir, will do double duty as twines for the fishery, but the added reason that by so doing they would assist the local growing industries of British East Africa and other parts of the Empire, and that the development and well-being of the Empire as a whole."

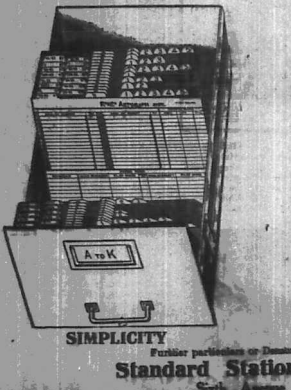

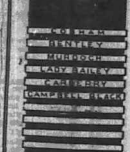

TSETSE FLY RESEARCH WORK

The Effect of Game: A Tribute to the Pioneers.

The following is the conclusion of the lecture delivered recently in Dar-es-Salaam by Mr. Seymour, the Director of Tsetse Flies. In the first instance, which was published last week, Mr. Seymour dealt with the breeding places of the fly, and the methods which had been made by the fly during recent years, and concluded with an outline of the experiments which are being carried out in an endeavour to reduce certain large blocks of land.

Persistence of the Work.

Though it has been given not merely to clearing large areas but to having their clear methods had been used which had destroyed most of the large areas while piling and burning, the method chiefly in use had been deep tsetse mud and soil. The latter, however, was hard to kill and one of the main lines of work at the Imperial Research Station was by burning, ring-barking, felling and poisoning in different methods to reach the best method of killing all kinds of woody growth with a view to permanence of clearing. Mention should be made of the fact that the use of insecticides was not used, and where it became necessary, as part of the work of the class, one correct and native settlement was regarded also as a controlling factor.

The general present position as regards the work of the flies in Shinyanga was that while some pieces of bush were now grazing outside, others further in were still reseeded, partly from tsetse and other insects that were not yet destroyed and partly apparently from larvae. To what extent the operations were done, and to what the operations were done, and to what the flies were responsible was not known, but this whole question was now to be made the subject of intensive study. Much of this in great numbers would be used and the effect of a pasture, three to four miles long, would be kept the fly, out of an experimental block of 100 acres would be watched. It was made of "live" poles at a cost of £175. In a mile, the poles were growing out

well and it was giving a great success as a game-keeper. If the flies could be controlled by such a method it should probably be possible to deal with the tsetse movement to deal with and would have to experiment further in re-forestation of the forest with cleared strips and with thicket.

In regard to this "thicket," one of the greatest discoveries of the reclamation period was that of the great barrier thicket of *Bushia* *Myrsine* which creates the barrier by means of pine and *Myrsine* which are found in all parts of the country. These are the only repellible barrier previous to *Bushia*. The reproduction of thicket barrier, pine and *Myrsine* was part of the programme of the Imperial Research Station, and was in the hands of the capable Forest Officers of the Tsetse team. That an insecticide is not used, especially in light of the fact that the evidence shows that the tsetse flies are not on ground from which they have been excluded. Conditions, in thickets, forming a barrier, must be distinguished from the cleared thicket which forms the fly's breeding place and refuge.

Game.

Limited control measures might be necessary as part of any land control scheme, but while game animals carried out the fly and the blood parasites, it was very unlikely that any approach to an extermination would require the fly and soon drive out without reducing the fairly numerous game. On which question, however, must be the subject of an intensive study, such as it had not yet received. This study, Mr. Seymour said, had been commenced by the Research team and judgment on the subject should be suspended pending the latter's arrival at the findings.

Concentrations of Fly.

Three clear systems and nature and how to deal with them were amongst the main points

being investigated by the Research team. A brief account of the general activities of the Research team was given. Mr. Seymour had been anxious to have those organized on "ecological" basis, in this case, of fly, by the most modern, intensive methods.

In relation to the whole of the arrangements, physical, deal and formal—this could give the some proficiency of knowledge about it which could be hand, precise measure. Mr. Seymour was certain that a very deal of detailed knowledge about the fly would result from the investigation and on some of this it might be possible to base some control measures or greatly improve the old ones. His recommendation was to be carried out.

A lecture was held to the first work of the Rehabilitation Officers, Mr. B. F. Tsem, being referred to, especially, and the aid which had received from the Provincial Commissioners, and District Officers with whom it had been commenced. Messrs. H. C. Bishop and C. McManis, the first to operate in the afternoon, were amongst those specially thanked by His Excellency the Governor and the Territory for the splendid financial backing the work had received from them.

In a trouble coil the magnets of the advance coil is used to advance the contact of the make-break mechanism, but with a plain coil, as used on cars, a make-break contact breaker driven by the engine opens and closes the primary circuit, such rupture of the circuit being timed to occur when the points of the engine is in the correct firing position.

The Primary Condenser.—Owing to the auto-induction of the primary, however, there is, as has been explained, a voltage at the point where the circuit is ruptured. This, of course, would be across the points of the contact breaker, and would result in their rapid deterioration. To overcome this a condenser is placed across the points or more accurately across the ends of the primary windings, so that the condensing can be contained within the coil or on the contact breaker. Its function is to absorb the self-induction current and to locate it back, as it were, into the circuit.

As applied to a car, the system just outlined is modified, for the sake of convenience. Now, in fact, in the case of the whole motor so far as coil ignition is concerned, the efficient running the battery must be kept top to the work, and probably less than many suppose. 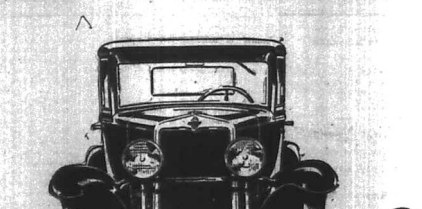

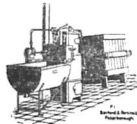

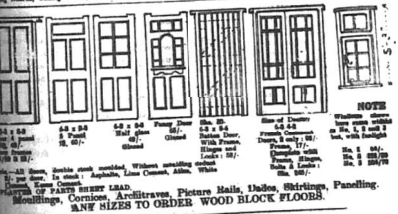

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE CRITICISES FARM MANAGEMENT.

Farmers Who Are Unlikely to Succeed in the Colony.

DEPARTMENTAL REPORT FOR 1928

Development on the Whole Satisfactory Despite Handicaps of Drought and Locusts.

The Department of Agriculture reviews in its 1928 report the position not only of the industry in Kenya but of the Department itself.

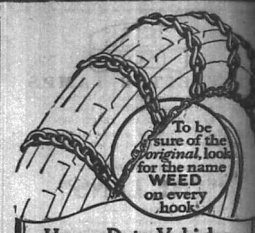

**DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
CRITICISES FARM MANAGEMENT.**

(Continued from page 1).

assistance is needed at Headquarters for the dispatch of local administrative work of a permanent character.

A statement on finance gives the total cost of the Department as £111,144 which was £62,000 of the cost of the settlement. Out of the total, the Veterinary Department accounted for £75,000 which was spent on the administrative expenses of the Department, including the cost of the headquarters staff amounting to £10,000. The expenditure on breeding services, £25,775, and destruction expense, £20,230.

The Agricultural Department is aware of a serious shortage of local staff of the Government and the loss of the Government staff on receipt during 1925 amounting to £25,750. The shortage will be short-lived, it is stated, by the drought in the native areas and the impending staff for veterinary services there.

The Veterinary Department is of the opinion that the contribution to the revenue of the Colony during the year was £27,700 which was exceeded by the amount spent on the agricultural department in 1925, £52,844 in 1925, £60,000 in 1924 and £43,900 in 1923. These figures represent the cost expenditure after subtracting the revenue (excluding about £6,000 which yearly accrues to the agricultural section of the Department). The administrative expenses have grown from £55,191 in 1923 to £111,098 last year.

In the three-year period the cost expenditure on native agriculture has increased by just over £2,000; the cost for the best livestock, which has the highest value in 1926 now stands at £2,970. There has been also a steady increase in the grants made from the Government's side to outside bodies.

So far as the veterinary services are concerned the administrative division which began in 1926 with a total of £60,427 cost last year £60,628. On the research

side there has been an increase of £4 in the veterinary service only, the 1925 figure being £29,696 and the 1926, £29,628. The revenue of this department is equal to one-third of its total cost.

The Report points out that the cost of the settlement is high in comparison with that spent upon all other services.

In the course of a general review of agricultural conditions in 1925 was generally under average, as a consequence crops suffered on the main districts. The yield of coffee was much reduced. The estimate of yield for the season was 7,200 tons at the end of December as compared with an actual production of 12,320 tons in the preceding year. Exporting in the Nyandarua Province, where yields were high, the maize crop was below average, and in parts of the Victoria District it largely failed on account of drought. The wheat and in the higher districts which enjoyed a sufficient rainfall, a yield was greatly reduced by "rust". In several districts a number of farmers suffered some loss in the destruction of maize and wheat crops by locusts. From this small source some damage, though not extensive, was caused to native food crops.

Being to shortage of rain generally a smaller output of crops like flowers, and in some areas a shortage of food existed. Grazing in the pastoral areas was poor, and in low condition of stock generally, and a reduced output of produce and manure for the market.

Farm Management.
Notwithstanding the adverse economic developments on the whole continues at a satisfactory rate. Success in farming is dependent upon many factors, including skill and experience, and while there is evidence of substantial progress in many directions, it is lamentable that there are more and more reports that there is a lack of good management of farms. A considerable number of farmers possessed no previous experience when they settled in Kikuyu and it stands to the credit of many of them that they

have learnt the "art of agriculture" and have achieved success. But there are many others, who apparently do not possess a "know-how" for farming. They are not ill-to-be-versed in the art of agriculture and it is feared that they will all be disappointed. They often the management of the farm in fact in the hands of the manager without the personal aid of the farmer. This is not a satisfactory state of affairs, and it is feared that they will all be disappointed.

Market Parings.
"Again in so far as "mixed farms" are concerned the inclusion of stock in the operations, the impossibility of the low production of the most highly productive areas, and the low production of the whole, are not unimportant as a result, however valuable they may be as "reservoirs" and "improvers" of soil fertility.

The Government is encouraged by the reports of the Government to users of livestock for agricultural purposes. The reports are derived from the officials and experienced farmers and are unfortunately to some extent limited in the present comparatively high cost. In fact, there is a tendency more fully to combine the use of the tractor and the motor vehicle in farming operations. This combination is likely to prove one only of the most economical.

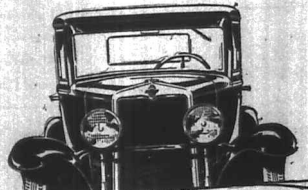

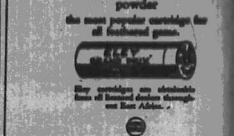
