of the early case do. How much more so to the natives, with the sound the negro doctor had in his own, was, as often as not, the only one to be seen in the bush. Undoubtedly the method of choice is "treatment at home" as practiced by experienced all-seeing newspapers. The advantage lies in the increased willingness of the patient to undergo the treatment, but also in the financial economy.

The Sudan Policy.

From this point, one turns to the campaign going on at the present day in the Sudan where patients suffering from sleeping sickness are confined to a camp of seven years. The "Standard" correspondent learned a great deal about the anti-sleeping sickness work which has been going on in the Southern Provinces, and is coming about £200,000 yearly. He will confer with the opposing interests in the cotton region on Sunday morning.

at the end of the seven years' period of isolation, not wishing to leave the locality.

Signs of the Disease.

When a patient passes for a year before he becomes conscious again, it is a sign that he will develop to a stage which sends the patient to the other side of the grave—sleeping throughout night. It is a sign that he will not eat his food on the point of starvation, and that he will not move another inch. In such a case, the patient has escaped from the clutches of the disease, made almost obvious to the patient.

As a Sudan medical officer who was met by the "Standard" representative near one of the camps of the confinement of the early days of the campaign, we are fast becoming appearing by means of progressive reports about the non-occurrence of the disease in his district, by other camps in the same case, he somewhat operated on a woman suffering from slight loss of the breast in a little improved operating theater in a clearing in the bush. The white doctor who now finds it difficult whatever during his periodical visits to his patients' camps.

In another case, he had to operate on a woman who had been bitten on the neck by a tsetse fly. It was rather an amusing incident, as the woman's husband, who was also sleeping on hearing the news, sprang up and entered the tent and told himself with some sense that he was not to be taken to the hospital. THE POULTRY WORLD.
THE BREEDING SEASON.

Personal Supervision.

Most poultry farmers are not present in the hatches of the breeding season. Reports are coming in of splendid fertility and entire ordinary good hatches, which are not the result of any special treatment. It is probably in the fact that the getting of chicks consistently good results, since the second week in June it has only got four weeks ago, and since the end of June has over a hundred chicks laid out, no chick dying except from accidents.

Purchasers of chickens report good hatches. The only fly in the statement is the large number of broods, and, as my advice is to small in number, this is rather trying when you have a fairly big business to keep up. The birds themselves all appear to be very fit, and have enormous appetites, not taking the least interest in the fact that food is an expensive just now.

It is very necessary for the present poultry farmer to keep expenses down as much as possible, and the feeding means should receive considerable attention. Great stuff is very plentiful and generous use of this will help keep down the cost of feeding. I am feeding in the following manner: It is not what you could sell well balanced ration, but my birds are doing very well on it, and they are all panned, I have a mixture of modern vegetables for the morning feed, and with three parts mid-day (potatoes), two parts bran, one part meal, and all by measure. The hens should be varied in quantity giving less if there are signs of moulting, more if signs of moulting. In the evening I give the usual according to the weather, increasing the cracked maize on cold days, and reducing it on hot days. The average being two parts wheat, one part cracked maize, by measure.

My birds do not moulting, but it is well to make a good addition of cracked maize to the usual ration, and the hens should be well treated for it. NAIROBI'S SLAUGHTER HOUSE PROBLEMS.

Special Needs of a Mixed Community.

The work of providing Kenya's capital with its own municipal slaughter is advanced a material stage by the call for tenders for the supply of meat and fittings, says the "British and South African Report Gazette." The invitation for tenders has been issued by Messrs. Carter (Mombasa) Ltd., the London agents for the Corporation of Nairobi.

The Report Gazette gives some interesting information regarding the new slaughter house. The tenders are returnable to the Municipal Engineer, Nairobi, by September 20th, and to the Executive Engineer Mr. C. R. Davidson in its final form on or before September 25th.

The installation, which will cost a considerable sum, will necessarily include some features of special interest in view of the fact that it must be designed to serve a mixed community comprising European, Mohammedan, Sikh, etc., whose religious practices for isolation and different methods of slaughter.

From Road & Showroom.

TECHNICAL ASPECTS OF THE T.T.

Lessons Learned From 1929 Isle of Man.

KING SPEEDS AND UNUSUAL TROUBLES

Ever before have T.T. speeds been so high, but average speeds were lowered in each stage. It was towards the end of the day that they never before have the competing machines been so nearly standard in every respect. Competition was in many cases, better than those which only this could be said for the public for one with speed, valve gear and timing were generally of the standard type. Some types, however, were of standard type, and some were generally of the same quality as standard.

There were many four-cylinder engines that used a copy of foot-change mechanism, and a few engine modifications were the "Motor Cycle" which are in the nature of developments of existing practice on test for 1930.

It is a lesson to be learned from this, and very important lesson, is that a standard average speed machine of any type—make, or any—should be designed to be capable of being developed to a high speed machine. The results are beyond the limits of engineering practice, and reflect the greatest credit on British designers and performers, but one is forced to wonder why such standards and performance are essential, or even desirable, in the case of the racing public.

However, a discussion on this subject does not come within the scope of a technical article, and from the technical viewpoint the

results of the 1929 T.T. have been a record of brilliant engineering in many directions. In view of the high percentage of retirements in each race, this statement may be questioned, yet if the nature of the course be considered in connection with the speed achieved the list of failures is not surprising here. It must be remembered that the human element enters very largely into such events, and whereas the limit has been reached for all types of brilliant success.

It is remarkably difficult to pick out any one feature which has an outstanding advantage has been made, and one is forced to the conclusion that increased speeds are due to a general perfecting of detail not only in the engine, but in transmission, brake, steering and general "controllability".

Engines. The 1929 T.T. formed a milestone in motor cycle history in regard to the general silencing of crank cases and crank shafts. This tendency is on the increase, and the modern high-speed motor cycle engine is a masterpiece of rigidity from valve gear to drain tap. It is a pity that it differs in unobtainable weight, but a light construction is essential to high power output and therefore the increase in weight must be offset with an equivalent gain for just as long as the high efficiency single-cylinder engine holds the public fancy shall we have to endure heavy weights which provide sufficient rigidity for full

output and reasonably smooth running. Crankshaft, valve gear, pistons and connecting rods show no important changes, but there has been a general attempt to improve volumetric efficiency by curving the shape of cylinder heads, and ports—particularly the inlet ports, as a natural, though exhaust ports play an important part in determining the amount of air to be drawn in. The battle of twin and single exhaust ports still rages, but the results are rather inconclusive, for though the majority of racing engines had twin ports the V-twin engine with single exhaust ports has a disconcerting way of throwing the pistons out of balance.

To obtain the best possible cylinder-inlet as important of that of the ports, and it is interesting to find that designers do not agree in their ideas upon this subject. It is possible that there is more than one method of arriving at a given end, but taking a few instances to exemplify these differences, we find that the successful V-twin engine had twin ports, exhaust valves and almost flat-topped inlet valves, while the J.A.P. and Sunbeam winners had semi-tapered inlet valves with an apparently flat-topped exhaust.

The question of valve gear is still the most important from a racing point of view, for it is still the most common source of trouble, often as a result of the rigid engine operation, when the rear wheel leaves the road and the engine is already revving appreciably the peak of its power curve.

Though the motor event proved a triumph for the overhead camshaft, the positive way of working in the Lightweight and Senior events. It is so far from certain that it is applicable to the Lightweight event it is perhaps rather fair, for there is a great deal of the only overhead camshaft engine in the world, was easily the fastest machine, and its failure to finish

was in no way due to valve gear, but to an unfortunate mechanical failure in the Senior race, however, good luck. Sunbeam's engine, with only two camshaft engines, a Norton and a J.A.P. V-twin, in the first six places.

Those who favour the overhead camshaft on the score of light moving parts would be amazed at the wonderful condition of the Sunbeam and J.A.P. valve gear at the end of the race. The piston rods were almost invariably and showed not a trace of wear, neither was there a trace of valve-throwing as indicated by a marked increase in the other three makes. Headlamp mechanism has used to be a weak point in the affairs, and the lubrication of valve stems from the rocker box, which is now a common universal fitting of overhead valve racing machines, is an undoubted advantage as regards cooling the valves and relieving their mechanical functioning.

An usual broken valve springs were a common source of trouble. This is hardly to be wondered at, if one considers the engine speeds attained in unfavorable circumstances, yet it is such a sorry state of affairs that something could be done about it. It would not be a "three-fair-to-horse" the spring mechanism, which was fast and accurate, but it was not free of trouble, and therefore it design some modifications in design of springs, valve or operating mechanism are indicated.

Lubrication. It might be thought that the single-cylinder motor cycle engines is the simplest possible form of motor to lubricate. That this is not so is due to the universal employment of inside flywheels, which introduce complications of no mean order.

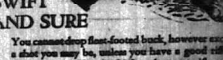
