FOOD BOARD CEASES FUNCTIONS TO-DAY.

Supplies No Longer Demand Control.

EXPORT EMBARGO RAISED.

Fixed Prices of Maize and Meal to Go.

The Food Control Board ceased to exercise its functions to-day. Except for clearing up accounts, it will go out of business.

The Board, which was appointed on March 1 last, and decided several members of the commercial and producing communities, dealt with the serious situation arising from three years' indifferent rains and two years of locust infestation. It was established with the authority of the Legislature which voted £200,000 for famine relief throughout the Colony. The district most chiefly affected were the northern areas of Kitui, Mku, Turkana, Ukiama and Coast.

During its lifetime the Board fixed maximum prices for maize and maize meal, and imported 30,000 bags of South African maize. It is now announced that the embargo on the exportation of maize and maize meal is lifted and that control prices will cease to operate.

OFFICIAL ANNOUNCEMENT.

The Food Control Board, having regard to the improved position, has decided that control measures are no longer necessary. The embargo on exports is being removed and fixed prices will appear. The decision takes effect to-day.

The announcement is contained in the following statement issued to the "Standard" yesterday by Mr. A. C. Hunter, Secretary of the Board:

"The Food Control Board has decided that the position now existing in the Colony and Provinces as regards supplies of maize and sugar warrants the termination of food control measures. They have therefore decided that the embargo placed upon the export of maize should be removed."

Lowering Production Costs.

Though there was some slithering throughout the year in motor engineering, it was mainly economical, being mainly concerned with two important issues—namely, cheapening production of cars as a whole and the development of more efficient high-speed vehicles for public service and transport. The first of these aims centred in means of cheapening production to fit in with competing prices from without and to provide the cost of the still interesting list of inclusive possibilities without increase of price to the public. It dealt with the aspect which experienced makers have related to the present writer: that only large outputs can show a profit at popular prices, and that the labor cost of production was recently said by one in authority to be less than half the cost of setting the product.

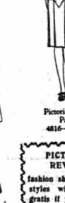

Food Control—And After.

The Food Control Board, set up by legislation in the emergency conditions which existed six and a half months ago, seem its functions today. An official announcement issued yesterday states that the embargo on the export of maize and meal is being raised and that control prices will disappear. The board edition of "Dera" has died a natural death with the improvement in general conditions. We gather that while the Board has spent only about £40,000, it has saved the Government about £200,000 net profit in the first five months, the returns from the African people who were sent on the understanding that repayment should be made, will reduce the total amount of money lent to the Colony to within the region of £10,000. That by no means an extravagant price to pay for the security brought about by the operation of the Food Control Board. But this is the first occasion on which emergency measures were introduced to deal with an unprecedented situation and the Colony has every right to be satisfied with the result. That information will not be repeated, in the main, in any other part of the Board has discharged a heavy task with credit to the Colony. The work of Kenya has in the minds of those who appreciate the fact that but for the practical operation of a certified government and people to a very real profit. African life might have been sacrificed to the national leadership exhibited in consequence. The terrible story of the British Empire is still fresh in the memory. But the six months would justify Government in recommending similar action. They would like to know the nature and extent of the actual interference in the ordinary economic life, the difficulties met, and the possibilities, if any, of assistance on more national lines in future—should the regrettable emergency arise. The lessons of Food Control are too valuable to be lost and we suggest to Government the importance of preparing for future public information a complete statement of the Board's work, the experiences and conclusions of its members and a full account of financial transactions, including purchase and price paid, both internally and externally. If those details are provided, the country will have a better opportunity of examining the experiment in all its phases. We believe that the Government has realized the need to do a closer and more adequate business. The distinction of food supplies in the country. There are districts which always have to rely very near the edge of famine and a sudden multiplication of them brings about a critical situation often unknown to the outside world and too complexly to present the sphere of action of administrative officers. It is possible that better machinery would prevent so far as humanly possible, such possibilities and lead to a better state of affairs. It is possible with a consequent maintaining of unimpaired stability and with a helpful reaction upon the life of the Colony. That aspect leads to another—no action necessary to prevent so far as humanly possible, the recurrence of the conditions which called for the Board. The factors affecting production and food stuffs in specific areas are perhaps the most important. It is the duty of those who are in a position that they were six months ago. They will be interested to know a body of the Agricultural Commission in its consideration of the problem of increasing production in the future. It is important to be able to see that the Government has not neglected important opportunities to help. The Board, which have represented a cleaning process by the rigorous of the Board, has quality means has been secured and the opportunity is offered for a fresh start on a sounder foundation. The chance has also been given to the Adminis-

In the stem and silent vault there are very few wild flowers. You will go for miles and see only Gladioli and Anemones—you know that bunch of wild lilies with red spots.

But at and over 7,000 feet there are beautiful patches—not everywhere, but most of the flowers seem to grow together for half a mile or so. I don't want to know their names. There is a tall

shrub with a crimson pop-pom as a top. A tall plant has the same leaves and flowers as the one in my garden with white trails to the stems. Also a large Dischidium which flowers a goodly number of times lighted from within.

There are others, but you will notice the above even when passing in a motor-car. It is a delicate light the morning step by step up to nine thousand feet say on the Nakuru-Rumuruti Road and there down again to all thousands with Kenya's peak and Aberdeens, through Cedar forests, and Ham-bone, and Olives and many others.

Kenya Parks.

If I sit a garden, let us say on our Park. Could we get a new name for each one? The name of the main road, Rumuruti, Ogilvi, Nairobi and many others when we become a National. In them we have big game, and you can by chance see Buffalo and Elephants, and back of many sorts, and the rivers are thick with trout.

BRITAIN'S POPULATION BEING TRANSFORMED.

More Elderly People Than Children.

LATEST STATISTICS.

(STATISTICAL DEPARTMENT.) London, Aug. 20.
Great Britain's population is rapidly changing. Her composition transformed. According to the re-

port of the George Newman, Chief Medical Officer of the Board of Health for last year, "the composition of the population is undergoing great changes which will probably modify the death rates, owing to the declining birth rate, and the death rate, the proportion of children has been decreasing, and of persons past the prime of life increasing." In other words, children are outnumbered by their elders.

In 1901, 11.4 per cent of the population were children under 5 years of age and 10.9 per cent were persons over 55. Now, in 1906, with the war intervening, while the distribution of adult males and still greater fall in the birth rate, the figures were 8.1 per

cent of children under 5 and 5 per cent as much as 15.8 per cent of persons over 50.

The Future.

The report states that various methods of calculation suggest that by 1913 7.2 per cent of the population will be children and more than 19 per cent persons over 55; and that instead of, as at the beginning of the century, children outnumbering those at late middle and old age, the latter will be much more than twice as numerous as the former by the middle of the century.

It is asserted that we are almost in sight of a stationary population, for the number of births over deaths has fallen from 11.6

per 1000 in 1901 to 5 per 1000 last year. The death rate last year was 11.7 per 1000, which is much lower than that of any other recorded year since 1871 and 1902 when it was 11.6 per 1000, while the birth rate was 15.7 per thousand—almost the lowest recorded, though it is 1.1 increase on 1907. The infant mortality rate was the lowest yet recorded, but the maternal death rate for 1905, per 1000 births, is the highest recorded since 1871.

The chief causes of death in 1905 were, in order of importance, diseases of the heart and circulation; bronchitis, pneumonia and other respiratory diseases; cancer; diabetes of the pancreas system; and all forms of tuberculosis.

The Exhibition will be open to the public between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. upon payment of One Shilling—Children, half price. Members of the Society will be admitted free upon production of their Membership cards for the current year.

Exhibitors will be divided into the following sections: "A" Arts, "B" Crafts, "C" Photographic, "D" Loans.

All subjects in sections "A," "B" and "C" must be original and the work of the Exhibitor. But Section "D" will be divided into two classes—A, for exhibits entirely the work of the Exhibitor and B, for exhibits the original work of the Exhibitor completed with the aid of a trade photographer or other person. No photographs depicting wounded men will be accepted.

There will be no entry fee in respect of exhibits sent in by members of the Society, but a fee of Shs. 2/- per exhibit will be charged in non-members.

A set of articles, such as a dressing table set, pair of lamp shades or needle sticks, will be accepted as one exhibit, if catalogued as a set.

If offered for sale separately, each article will be considered as one exhibit.

The Society is desirous of including a Loan Section in the Exhibition and for this purpose they will accept any objects of artistic interest which have not been shown before. No entry fee

is payable for the Loan Section exhibits.

Conditions. Every object sent in for display must be passed by the Selection Committee of the Society.

Price for exhibit, if for sale. All photographs, water and oil paintings must be framed or mounted and rimped ready for hanging. Any exhibit sent in in conformity with this rule will be liable to rejection.

Exhibits must be sent with the entry form or separately as detailed, but must be in the hands of the Hon. Secretary not later than noon on Tuesday the 12th November.

Exhibits will be accepted at the Memorial Hall, Sixty Avenue, Nairobi, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon on Tuesday the 12th November. Parcels sent by post or rail should be addressed to the Hon. Secretary, Kenya Arts and Crafts Society, P.O. Box 292, Nairobi.

What members of the public are apt to overlook is that only the "retail" cars are called upon to cover the full liberty legs, and in handicapping certain cars are used which are not for this, and two laps too much on the Ulster circuit than in rubbing between 18 1/2 mile start and a 27 1/2 mile finish, and a 27 1/2 mile start and 41 miles. If the results of the I.T.T. races held in Ulster have proved the system to be fair to all classes, obviously it is just equally correct. The results of 18 1/2 miles, almost exclusively correct. The results of a handicap, using the 170 c.c. cars, will seem to confirm this assumption, since two of the 170 c.c. cars, with one lap's start, were placed third and fourth, the average speed of the 7,100 c.c. winner and of the third one differing only to the extent of 18.22 m.p.h., due to the nature of the course which called for other factors than their speed.

This was proved by the fact that although the winner's maximum speed was about 110 m.p.h., a difference of 37 m.p.h. between his maximum speed and average speed, the difference between the two maximum and average speeds of the 700 c.c. finish car was not much more than 10 m.p.h.

So, the R.A.C. Committee has hit its mark when deciding on the rough-and-ready handicapping system of lap miles, and assuming that the lap speeds of cars of 3,000 to 5,000 c.c. would be about

equal irrespective of their maximum speed. For all cars over 3,000 c.c. a factor displacement was on the scratch mark. Over these cars, 2,700 c.c. smaller than two winners, was placed seventh, although it averaged 60.01 m.p.h. or only 8.23 m.p.h. less than the winner, Carrasco, on the big circuit.

However, such a large handicapping start of 12 1/2 miles lap is certainly not ideal. A shorter circuit would give greater scope in handicapping, but would point of view, and since the race start should be retained for the sake of expediency, the original idea of the Ulster I.T.T. race as a twenty-four-hour event should be remembered. Thus the one-lap unit could be used to bring response, since the small world have no restrictions on the value of the value in percentage in a race of any hours.

production. The standardization of clove wood and the wages paid of clove growers are the first subjects which were tackled. The opportunity to be undertaken will be co-operative machinery. A certain amount of difficulty may be encountered in this respect as the Arab growers are individuals and do not look with favour upon co-operative efforts. It is quite possible that this year, when there will be a large crop, probably a reduced price, may make many smaller co-operative efforts with fewer favour than has been the case heretofore.

The major portion of the Cinnamon duties of this Presidency is derived from the annual duty on cloves. Prior to last year there was a 20 per cent duty on cloves exported, but during last year this was altered to 10 per cent on the cash value. Instead of fixing the duty every few weeks, according to the fluctuation in price, the Government has proclaimed that the duty from 1st January 1926 to 31st March, 1926, will be 10 per cent.

World Markets.

Over a period of 50 seasons the average clove crop of Zanzibar has been about 8,000 tons. Of this about 50 per cent is sent to the Far East (including Bombay, Singapore and Java), 30 per cent to the United States of America and the remainder to European Turkey, Greece and the Indies.

Of that sent to the United States of America, a greater proportion is distilled for obtaining the essential oil. This oil is used by the manufacturers of vanilla oil. Very few people who eat vanilla flavoured chocolate realize that much of that flavoured chocolate has probably come from the cloves of Zanzibar.

There is at present being manufactured elsewhere in the world a synthetic product which is competing with the cloves of Zanzibar. Last year, owing to the shortage in the crop the price rose considerably and as a result the sale of the synthetic product was year for year were estimated to be an advantage but it is now receding by popular opinion.

that it may have been very harmful on account of the "boom" given to the synthetic product. But even should the synthetic product be extensively used in the measure of the essential oil, it would only afford a co-operative effort of the total export.

Madagascar Threat.

Another danger which faces the industry is present in the form of competition. It is a curious fact that there are very few planters in the world whose crops will grow normally but during the last few years another one has been found. This is Madagascar. A distinct threat is recognized from this source, although it is not for a moment thought that there is any fear of the industry being invaded. These possibilities of being a certain amount of trade through competition from other sources are a certain element of anxiety in Zanzibar to-day, although there is no feeling of dependence.

Cocoa.

The only other export of any importance on the Island is cocoa. This position of being a greater than that under clove, the reason being that such exacting conditions are not required from the soil. It is worthy of note that although the clove areas cannot expand, having been fully planted up for a number of years, the area under cocoa is being planted up for a number of years. The crop reported does not represent anything like the total amount produced as that reported is only the quantity of the crop marketed. However, the average export amounts to something in the neighbourhood of 10,000 tons per annum.

The cocoa industry on Zanzibar originated from a few clumps of cocoa plants planted near the house of Arab. Subsequent plantings were not laid out on any set plan and therefore the plantations are all very irregular. The quality of the cocoa produced is poor on account of impurities in the preparation, but the oil content is good in comparison with other cocoa.

That in the future an export clove which is at present in force in regard to clove may be subject to a suspension and no clove may be exported if the crop is found to contain more than 10 per cent of water.

All cloves exported are brought to an inspection and are found to contain more than 10 per cent of water. Some similar application of the same principle is being put very much as a later date towards improving the quality of the clove export.

The only other crops grown on the Island are rubber, tobacco, sugar, and various other crops. 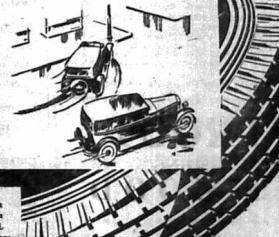

ensuring it, the Committee recommends that each head of department should prepare a tentative schedule and be required to render returns showing which officers have taken the leave and which officers have not and the reasons why. 

any who have earned in respect of past periods of absence should be reduced by one half, as it is to be fairly service—returning an officer in receipt from that service or is not returning to the service of the Kenya Government.

The Committee further agree that permission to travel for leave purposes as well as to maintain leave should be granted not only to include all periods of annual leave but also to include any leave taken at the discretion of the Government.

As the leave proposals also offer to the officers greater discretion in regard to the periods of leave, the system of extending the period of leave on the voyage should not be assumed as part of the leave. This, however, should be considered in remaining periods of duty and absence therefrom.

Stations Classified.

The Committee has also had to take into consideration the absence in present stations as divided into present stations as divided into "healthy" and "unhealthy" stations, and the Committee has come to the conclusion that there should be three categories. These should be determined by the Chief Native Commissioner and the Director of Medical Services but should not form part of the leave and passage regulations.

The second class of stations is "Moderately Healthy." The Committee considers that periods of duty at such stations should be additional leave and that such additional leave should be granted when it is first required, that it should be at the time when the officer's health is most affected. The Committee recommends that the amount of leave in the "healthy" and "moderately healthy" stations should be arrived by service at the latter station. The minimum periods of leave which are respectively annually being extended accordingly.

"Unhealthy" Stations.

The Committee considered certain stations "unhealthy" where officers would not be kept on duty if possible for any period of a year as a rule—principally lying in the interior of the country, the Northern Frontier and Districts where long service might in some cases prove detrimental to health. In these stations, particularly in the interior, the station would earn five days "overseas leave" in each month and four days "critical leave" of which thirty days each year.

NORTH INVESTED BY HOPPER LOCUSTS.

Damage Reported in Subakia.

THIS WEEK'S REPORT.

Very heavy infestation of locusts in the hopper stage is reported from certain parts of the north, more particularly Turkana, Subakia and Subukia. Damage to crops is said to be taking place in the latter area.

The latest departmental report, dated September 18, reads: "The large swarms reported last week as being in Subakia moved off in the direction of Thumani's Falls, and has since been reported from some 14 days from north. Another swarm has entered Subakia Valley, and is reported as doing damage to crops in the area."

There is a swarm on the Soli Escarpment, and several small ones in Kiunga and in Kimbu. On 15.9.29 a large

swarm of grasshopper and locusts was observed from Havelle to the north in the district of East Africa. It is possible that this is the same swarm now reported from Subakia.

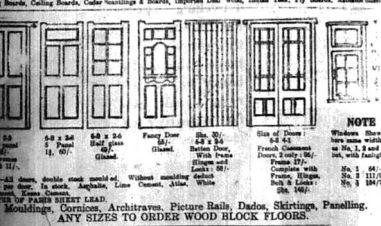
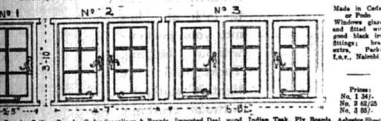
