COURT CHARGE SEQUEL.

**Mission Discipline Applied in Female
Circumcision Issue.**

A strange story was told to the Magistrate at Kiambu on Friday and Saturday in a case against four Kikuyu who were charged with causing a disturbance in a place of worship.

The affair occurred in a mission church in the Thika District during a communion service and the ceremony was suddenly terminated.

The natives maintained that for the first time in the history of that mission the congregation had broken before taking Communion, to move into the aisle if they were willing to renounce all bad native customs including female circumcision.

A large portion of the congregation—all taken by surprise, declined to do so and the four accused became prominent in the disturbance which followed.

On the other hand the missionary in charge, who declared that the church would not countenance female circumcision, maintained that the incident was part of an organized campaign to disturb church services.

The accused, in their statement, say they have not seceded from the Church, as alleged, and have no desire to do so.

The President of the Kikuyu Central Association visited the missionary and expressed regret for the incident.

A Letter From Paris.

It seems that the borbis, which has been much from confusion and evening frocks this season, has now decided to become a top. Sometimes it will be of the same material as the frock, but in the latter happens to be of a different fabric, the cage may be of tulle, net or black tulle.

Chignon does not lend itself very well to the very long line. In any case, however, though quite severe for day wear, see a little less for evening, don't you think?

Gold and Silver Again.

This violet chignon frock had a cape of chiffon printed with delicate but well-defined designs in gold. Cut in circular form, reaching almost to the

wrists, and tied carefully on one shoulder with pink ribbon strings, the delicate thing would wear all the time, even when dancing, admirably. It would slip down, and loosely round the waist, and the skirt would be another panel, or again it could be discarded in the end and made to do for a walk between dances in the cool night air.

Nearly all the materials for evening wear have rich patterns of gold, silver or oxidized threads woven into the design, so much sparkle and glitter may be expected this season.

Bad Two Pieces.

"Two pieces" will really be made in two pieces for the next few months, which means that two entirely different materials will be used for frock and coat, which will be linked together only by careful toning of colour. Last year it was correct to wear a lace frock of purple, ring velvet with an evening cloak of the same material; chiffon frocks had chiffon coats, each of various lace frocks had lace coats. Very likely, perhaps, but a little boring! Now you may have a charming gown of crepe or any bright colour, perfectly cut on princess lines, with almost no trimmings to give them marvellous flare, flaring the hips, and with long panels to give an elegant drape to the back. Over this may be worn a short coat of velvet in exactly the same shade, lined with the same, and having a big collar of fox dyed to match.

A gown of several rich gilded silks, in shades of red and silver, will be covered by a coat of silver coloured satin.

For day wear, it is very smart to have a slim frock of black, and white patterned crepe and a coat of soft black silk moire. The latter is quite straight and loose, with a small stand-up collar and a belt of red, down the side of the front of black shawl lace.

A very useful combination is a frock of crepe de chine and velvet over several tones darker.

Home-Made Macaroon.

Ingredients: 1 lb flour (not self-raising), 2 eggs, salt to taste, a little water.



This very desirable three-piece suit is materialized in grey corduroy. There are no coat and skirt, and in grey and gold rose modicams, to a jumper like the frock. The jumper is particularly attractive with its net lace, and with grey leather belt and bow.

Sieve the flour into a bowl and mix with salt to taste. Make a well in the centre and pour in the beaten eggs. Continue to beat these, adding from the surrounding flour and enough water to make a stiff dough. Knead it very well; then pat it out covered with a cloth for about 1 hour. Break the dough into two portions and roll out (it will not more than 1/16 inch thick. Leave to dry, then, under a sharp light, cut into ribbons about 1/2 to 1 inch wide.

To use, boil the macarons in salt water till soft; drain, mix with melted butter and cream cheese to taste, and serve while moist and creamy. It can also be added to plain and clear soups or made into a substantial pudding.

THE CHAMBER AND NEW LEGISLATION.

Draft Bills Discussed on Thursday.

POLICE FORCE AND CREDIT.

A number of Bills which had been published in the Kenya Official Gazette were mentioned at Thursday's meeting of the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce. After the objects and reasons for the Kenyan Bill (Consolidation of Duty) (Amendment) Bill had been read it was agreed that the Bill should be adopted in the case of the Bill relating to "Trustees." Mr. H. H. Mallick, remarking that the Bill filled a long-continued want, he considered that it should receive the hearty support of the Chamber. A Bill to amend the European Officers' Pension Act, 1927, was also mentioned.

The Police Force.
With regard to the Bill to provide for the Organisation, Discipline, Powers and Duties of the Police Force and the duties of the District Magistrate, Mr. H. H. Mallick drew attention to Clause 40 which he thought might be of interest to the Chamber. This clause read as follows:

No action shall be brought in any court against any member of the Police Force or any subordinate officer in respect of any motor vehicle driven by him or any goods supplied him or any work done on his behalf while such European constable or subordinate officer is acting in the discharge of his duty. Mr. T. A. Wood said that this clause was inserted in the Bill to not to know whether the same would be amended. He would remember years ago in the old colonial days that the Police Force used to enter a town a police constable saying, "Don't give those people credit."

Registration of Titles
The Chairman (Mr R. F. Meyer) said that the Bill to amend the Registration of Titles Ordinance had been transferred to the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce. The Chamber agreed with it on the form published in the "Gazette."

Electric Power Bill

The Electric Power Bill and a Bill to amend the Electric Power Ordinance were also considered. The Chairman said that he would like to see the Bill amended by a reasonable return on the capital expenditure. It was the charge to be made on the case of a person who is not an emergency supply.

Mr G. A. H. Hamilton said that he believed that the Bill as it stood would be passed.

The Chairman said he had no objection to the Bill as it stood, but that one did not wish the charge lowered.

Mr G. A. H. Hamilton explained that according to the Bill any one installing a private generating plant could claim the distribution company was that it applied to electrical plants and that a particular manufacturer of electrical plants could claim a rebate on the basis of a rebate for a standard supply with other charges. That was unfair. The distribution was based on a standard supply with electricity that asked for it. The plant was of particular size which had a relation to the demand likely to be supplied.

The South African Trade Commissioner (Colonel R. H. Turner) said that if a rebate was granted to the manufacturer of electrical plants that the rebate would be charged to the consumer who was installed.

It was agreed that the Bill should be noted.

INTER-TERRITORIAL CUSTOMS.

Nairobi Chamber Asks for Conference.

REVISION OF DUTIES

The question of Customs Classification was discussed by the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce at their meeting on Thursday last and a resolution was passed asking for arrangements to be made for an early conference of Customs Officers.

Mr A. C. Tannahill said that he had a table of Customs as the last meeting of the Chamber and he now wished to withdraw that and substitute another in the place of two new factors had arisen which should be noted in connection with the meeting. These factors were the report of the Hon. Mr. Wilson and the report of the Hon. Mr. Wilson on the opening of the Council for East Africa. Mr. Wilson recommended that the control of the Customs services should be under the High Commissioner who would be advised by a Chief of Customs and Customs Board. In his speech in Parliament, Mr. Wilson had said that the question of the revenue produce rate and protective duties had been referred by the Secretary of State to a Governor's Conference in January next.

Undesirable Goods

The main reason he had brought forward the motion was that there had been a restriction of the goods under the Customs Tariff since 1925. He had been very much interested in such a practice would have a most serious effect on trade. But under the Customs Tariff Table IV read that goods were prohibited and no allowance whatsoever. and, or might even claim relief exemption, the Chief of Customs had no option but to charge 20 per cent until new legislation was enacted. The Chief of Customs and Mr. Gulliver had been good enough to give him interviews on the subject and he thought they were prepared to think that there was a certain, perhaps not great number of articles which could profitably claim a duty less than 20 per cent.

With the permission of the meeting he therefore wished to substitute for the motion, which had been tabled the following—

That in view of the Hon. Mr. Gulliver the Governor of Kenya's announcement that certain Customs questions will be discussed at a Governor's Conference in January next the Chamber, approached with a request that the Government of the Territories be empowered to request that at the said Governor's Conference arrangements should be made for an early Conference of Customs Officers to discuss with them that protective Tariffs require revision particularly in respect to goods not enumerated in the 1925 Tariff which have established a claim to a duty less than 20 per cent on value.

He asked for the assistance of the Press in the matter in order that parties interested in such special laws should early communicate with the Chief of Customs or with the Nairobi Chamber.

The resolution was seconded by Mr. T. A. Wood.

Mr M. H. Mallick supported the resolution which he considered to be of the utmost importance.

Mr Gulliver added that he had nothing to add to what had been said.

The motion on being put by the Chairman (Mr R. F. Meyer) was carried.

It was also agreed that a copy of the resolution should be sent to the Honorable Members of the Executive Council of East Africa and that they should be requested to forward it to the Colonial Secretary of each Territory.

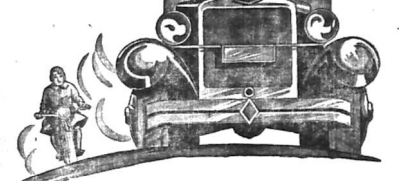

NAIROBI CHAMBER AND AGRICULTURE

Memorandum Presented to Commission.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENT.

Permanent Advisory Board Recommended.

A memorandum which had been prepared by the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce had been sent to the Agricultural Commission, was discussed at a meeting of the Chamber. The memorandum was as follows:

The members of the sub-committee on the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce appointed to express the opinion of the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce on the position of the Agricultural Ministry for Kenya, and to make any suggestions for the improvement of that position, find it to be impossible in the time available to give an exhaustive memorandum which would cover adequately their considered opinion upon the agricultural needs of this country.

After carefully considering the manner in which they could render the Commission the greatest service, the sub-committee are of the opinion that the one memorandum best elaborated in this manner can provide a sufficient safeguard against a recourance of the present situation. It is the opinion of the sub-committee that the Agricultural Commission in the operation of the present Act, they believe at the same time it will ensure the progressive development of the Department of Agriculture in the Department as the rapidly growing needs of Kenya's principal industry may warrant.

The Nairobi Chamber of Commerce, as such does not wish to view any specific complaint against the Department of Agriculture either as regards to the production or the lack of any useful service. To do so would imply an expert knowledge which is not the body, the Chamber cannot be expected to possess.

The Chamber, however, does feel very strongly that in recent years the losses attributable to several different diseases, plant and animal, and the lack of knowledge on the part of many agriculturists as a serious reflection upon the security of farming generally. It is hence considered the conviction that in a country where to possess lands and cultivate upon in fertility and kindness to the loss in the land, there must have been an absence of expert guidance which, had it been present, would have averted the avoidance of the very pitfalls which the losses of agriculturists elsewhere should have taught. We would appeal for financial and technical assistance on the Commission, and as a contrast, point to the prevailing conditions throughout the country.

Strengthening Research Work.

As the Colony is mainly dependent for its livelihood upon production of the soil, the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce is extremely concerned in the losses which at present are reported to occur often even in favourable years, as a result of the expected outbreak of farming in a country where conditions have not yet been completely understood. Taken in the aggregate, grain, grazing, and crops, 90 per cent. of the losses, due to insect infestation, to drought, virus, disease and insect pests, are heavy, and the Nairobi Chamber of Commerce is of the opinion that the Government should take as a matter of great and urgent importance.

For this reason, the Chamber is of the opinion that the Government should greatly strengthen the research work in the Agricultural Department. In this particular although

fully recognizing the value of continuing research throughout the East African territories, the Chamber wishes to stress its opinion that research should be conducted in Kenya by the Government and not exclusively for the needs of the territory. The Chamber believes that although of very great importance, the Government should not be solely of funds which, growing in intensity, are estimated to cost the last few months in the present budget for enquiry into and re-organization of the Department of Agriculture.

Advisory Board.

It is essential that confidence be restored, and that the functions of the Department should be progressively increased so that its influence upon the agricultural development of the Colony should not only be helpful and protective, but should foster and encourage the industry in its every leaving. The Chamber of Commerce is of the opinion that should not concern itself with the actual production in the field, but should attend to the general supervision, marketing, agricultural transactions, and everything else pertaining to the economic development of the industry in its every leaving. Viewed in this light, the Chamber is of the opinion that the Department of Agriculture is in a position to be a permanent official of the Government, or a Confidential Minister should be assisted by a body of experienced and representative agriculturists, and that the established procedure of forming a committee with representative members of the commercial community, the body should act with the head of the Department of Agriculture in the same manner as the Board of Agriculture (as a permanent advisory body) on the lines similar to the Railway Board and the Waterways Board, or the Board of Waterways and Transport.

It is the opinion of the sub-committee that in order to ensure the continuation as not only a permanent body, but one which will be able to render the greatest general advantage to be derived from this identifying more closely in the agricultural and economic conditions of the colonies, the committee must depend upon their local sections.

The Chamber is aware that it will be impossible for the Commission to make an exhaustive examination into the needs of agriculturists in Kenya at the time of its despatch and would suggest that the Commission should make a number of these visits could be undertaken by the Board, after the broad outlines of the task had been laid down by the Commission.

Functions of the Board.

- Among the many functions of the Board, the Chamber, from its particular viewpoint suggests the following:
- The making of research for agricultural products, more particularly when the demand is rapidly increasing.
 - The dissemination of knowledge based upon the results of the experiments in the promotion of the new economic crops suitable for production in the colony itself, and to make it possible for the agriculturist to export.
 - The investigation of industrial conditions for assistance in development and the encouragement of industry.
 - The maintenance of a register of agricultural products, world-wide lists, both as regards to the production of the commodity and the price of same sale.
 - The institution of legislation when necessary for protection against the export of agricultural products.
 - In this connection, the Chamber is of the opinion that the Government should be notified of farmers being of doubtful quality.

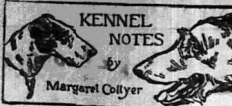

KENNEL NOTES

Margaret Collyer

Miss Collyer, *Gliffi*, to whom all correspondence in connection with "Kennel Notes" should be addressed, does not hold herself responsible for accuracy of statements made by her which are, in the main, based on information supplied by her correspondents.

Following up my story of a snake bite last week, I must state one or two things we should continue to remember. A very important one is the use of "Viper" or "Aster" liniment on an accident wound should be given for a certain period. In cases of Cobra or Manabo bite, hypodermic doses of hot brandy and water will do no harm. The aim should be to prevent the poison from penetrating the nerve centres beyond possibility of recovery. In Viper poison "Mix Vionica" in medicinal doses may be given internally. Injections of strychnine is also of use to temporarily rouse the nervous system. The best nerve stimulant of these times is a fresh strong hot infusion of tea. Give the patient small sips at frequent intervals or strong coffee can be given in the same way. Artificial warmth is necessary. Hot blankets, hot water bottles, hot fomentation over the stomach constantly renewed. If shivering fits continue put the patient into a warm bath five minutes. Then after well hot blankets. Then there are signs of revival, stop strong stimulants. Give them at longer intervals. The use of nuxvomica is necessary if the patient has any vomiting or diarrhoea. Incessant should be very light, milk, infantile food etc. No salt, or meat soup or any food containing fat. The victim of the snake must be hospitalized as little as possible for if the "Viper" bite that of an adder or boombacker these will be more or less fatal if not hemorrhagic. The dead blood will require to be mangled and cast out of the body or else mortification and death will occur. If you must remove him as you had or even opened a swelling caused by the bite of a pit-adder. It once had to open the throat of a dog

that had been bitten three days after he got the bite. It was full of black congealed blood like jelly, and the center vein was rotten and sloughing away.
 Another thing to remember in cases of snake bites is accurate respiration. The principal action of the poison is upon the nerve centres controlling the automatic movements of the lungs and diaphragm. By paralyzing these centres the lungs collapse, breathing ceases, and if nothing is done the patient dies. In nursing a case of Viper bite the patient should be carefully watched in case the breathing begins to grow shallow and hurried. If breathing ceases altogether artificial respiration should be at once resorted to, and kept up without a pause for an hour or more. Ideally the patient begins to breathe again naturally, measure the pulse vigorously. The object of artificial breathing is to keep the body alive long enough for it to receive sufficient of the venom to make recovery possible. It is known that the best in Colera venom possesses qualities to last for a long time after respiration has ceased. Dr. Calmette quotes a case where the heart continued to beat for two hours after respiration had ceased. A note cannot be actually dead if circulation is going on. The most important of prolonged artificial respiration, so long as the heart does not stop, is the means of saving the life of your patient.

If the victim of the bite has been hospitalized you do not see improvement in a short time, put another, and yet another. It does no harm. If the more you get into your patient, the more chance he has of ultimate recovery.

There is all this mind, thought over it and put it away in a cell of your brain by itself, ready to be used like your "Anti-Venice" at a moment's notice. We are told that Anti-Venice are quibbled if injected under the skin of the stomach or inside the thigh. I put two injections behind the ear and saw the venom in the skin of the stomach. I chose on the subject now, but remember what I have written applies to the subject as well as to dogs, and on that day you may be called upon to treat a snake and serpent, or a best friend. Don't lose your nerve and be brought down, or be surprised to see you again your only means of secure support that will stand up to your work calmly and deliberately knowing what you are doing.

I began these "Notes" a few days ago and hoped to be able to continue with publishing them, but so many different people writing me they had had dogs from the bite of snakes and asking from what they could obtain the "Emergency dog box". It looks as though I should have the reason for asking to be out of holes and lying about in the gym. Mrs. Lawrence of Masabombani has just had a very favourite dog that no doubt could have been saved had she had Anti-Venice. I now too get further particulars from Mr. Mandah with regard to the dog that she thought she had saved by giving the snake antitoxin locally. From her description it is a small, spotted, spitting snake, or cobra-like. Some friends say it is not a true cobra, but one which was kept as a pet and used to keep the body alive long enough for it to receive sufficient of the venom to make recovery possible. It is known that the best in Colera venom possesses qualities to last for a long time after respiration has ceased. Dr. Calmette quotes a case where the heart continued to beat for two hours after respiration had ceased. A note cannot be actually dead if circulation is going on. Chaper to Import from Tanganyika.
 The Hon. F. A. Donnan, Member of the Legislative Council for Mombasa, has introduced a Bill from the soap and oil industry at Mombasa. The Hon. Mr. Donnan, the Governor, and soap have also been introduced by the Hon. Mr. Donnan, Member of Council for their information.

It is suggested that the manufacturer of soap and oil should be considered as a home industry, and that 25 to 50 per cent of the chemicals used for the manufacture of soap are being imported from Europe while all the other articles comprising the same are of local production. It is suggested that Government should allow the importation of chemicals for this industry free of import duty as is done in Tanganyika. The Municipality of Mombasa is charging for the country of water consumed on galton rate and it is stated that this should be reduced to a flat rate.

Railway Rates Anomaly.

LOCAL VALUATION ROLLS

Removing a Difficulty at Mombasa.

UNIMPROVED VALUES.

The Local Government (Rating) Amendment Bill passed the second and third readings in the Legislative Council yesterday.

The principal difficulty regarding the valuation roll is the inclusion of unimproved value of land and the improvement of the valuation roll in operation in Mombasa, necessitating a valuation roll improvement law only, and is the object of the amendment. It provides that roll is to allow for the reduction of the value based on the existing valuation roll.

The Bill therefore provides that the Valuation Roll as amended and notified by the President of the Valuation Court shall be deemed to be the Valuation Roll of rateable property in force within the Municipal Council of Mombasa and as soon as may be, cause a valuation of improvements to be made and added to the Roll.

In order to meet the objection that the imposition of rates on the value of the land only is unfair to the landowner and that, had a valuation of improvements instead of the Roll might have imposed a rate on improvements, the Bill provides that no additional rate, on the value of improvements, of more than one per cent. shall be imposed on any person, and that such improvements have been added to the Roll.

THE NAKURU SHOW.

Traders' Cup for Dairy Cow Class.

THE CONDITIONS.

The Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society of Kenya, in announcing that the following are the details of the conditions under which the Traders' Cup for Dairy Cows will be contested for at the Nakuru Show on December 4, and 5.

The Traders' Cup—valued at £250—will be presented to the winner of the best Dairy Cow (pure bred or otherwise) of any breed on the show.

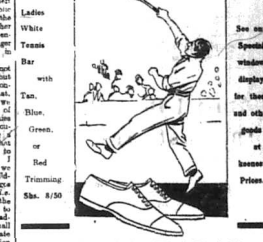
