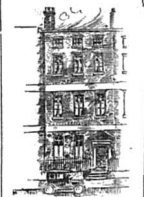

Darnall's House.

(Continued.) It is advisable to carry out this operation on all four brake cylinders if there is the slightest possibility of any remaining in the system after only one has been bled.

The clearance between the brake shoes and the drums is regulated by means of a small adjusted screw for each of the flexible type corners, the screw, similarly, being turned to adjust the shoe to the drum, with the wheels jacked up.

Mr. Arthur Henderson, the Foreign Secretary, stated that the opportunity for the discussion of proceedings pending for the resumption of diplomatic relations with Russia would be given at an early date.

Mr. G. M. Gilliat, Secretary to the Overseas Trade, replied for the President of the Board of Trade and under the reports of the guarantee scheme, at a contract of a total free value of £160,270 had been entered into with exporters in this country in respect of and including coal, machinery and iron.

The programme of work occupied by the Department was 40 per cent.

Mr. Rowena Chaired.

Mr. Philip Snowden, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, who received an ovation from the Government benches when he entered the House, announced that the Premier on his return, would attend the House next Tuesday and would make an early statement on the results of his visit to the United States.

Mr. W. Lams the Under-Secretary for the Colonies preferred to defer any general statement on Palestine pending an enquiry being held into the recent disaster. He said that the Colonial Office was prepared to consider the proposals that a conference be called of representatives of Arab and Jewish leaders with a view to reaching a settlement.

The Minister of Agriculture, Mr. Noel Barkton, announced that grants from the development fund in aid of further improvement of harbours for fishing amounted to £20,720 had recently been sanctioned.

Coast Protection Bill.

The House proceeded with the second reading of the Coast Protection Bill which is designed to place all the harbours under the sole control of the Board of Trade and cooperate in the work of the local authorities in dealing with coast erosion.

Mr. W. Graham, the President of the Board of Trade, introducing the Bill, mentioned that it would facilitate grants by developing Commissioners for works which are at present impracticable and

Locusts in Kenya.

SITUATION WELL UNDER CONTROL.

There have been no reports on locusts hoppers in Kenya during the past week. Flying swarms have been seen in various parts of the country, but little damage was reported. These movements are, however, being carefully watched.

The following is the department report for the week ending October 30:

Flying Swarms.

During the last three months six small swarms of locusts have visited the Bungai and Lower Molo districts, near Molo. Damage has been done to lemons and peaches in certain areas.

On October 24, a small swarm was seen at Peta, Bungai, and continued their flight in a north-easterly direction, whilst another small swarm passed over Nairobi on October 26, proceeding east. No damage reported.

The first swarm of yellow and red locusts that passed over Molo on October 17 and 18 has apparently turned their direction to the north, from north-east to south-east, as they are now reported at Molo, in the Bungai District.

A second swarm is reported to be in the vicinity of Molo, in the Bungai District at Molo.

Reports from the Northern Frontier State that small swarms of pink locusts have been seen in the vicinity of Mandera and Wajir. A large swarm of pink locusts was reported as having passed over Nairobi in Bungai on October 19. The swarm was flying high, in an easterly direction.

"Fungus" reports a small swarm of locusts near Molo. No further information has been received.

Throughout the Colony the situation is well in hand, and the movement of hoppers is being carefully watched by us.

The East African Indian Delegation, before presenting to the Agricultural Land Commission a memorandum on the subject of the common roll, held a mass meeting with the object of obtaining agricultural land. The meeting condemned the Wilson proposals and indicated the demand for a common roll, adding a rider to the effect that nothing short of the common roll would satisfy them.

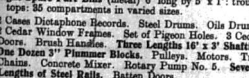

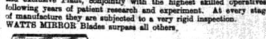
