**WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP**

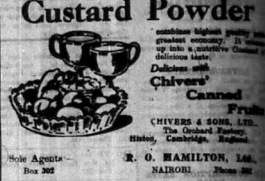

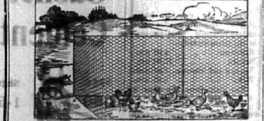

## THE TRANS-NZOLA SHOW.

### A Creditable Effort.

"It's a long way to Tipperary" or rather to Kitale, but it eventually arrived, and, all thanks to the K. and U. Railway, neatly packed in four strong vans, and shored up so as to meet me here at Nairobi. I sat down and my kit and I went packing for some breakfast. On my return I was met by a speck of mud, through which I waded to a moss excellent hotel. Having washed the breakfast container to my complete satisfaction, I set out to find out where the Show was to be held. This was located in the hotel grounds under a large open shed, and there I found my old friend Mr. Powell busy putting up pens. In but some 10 to 20 minutes there were about two hundred entries, and it was a most creditable effort on the part of the new club. I would recommend that as future shows—the Trans-Nzola Poultry Association do as we do, and that as have the pens all erected before the day of the show; all pens numbered to correspond with the entries; and not show any but official's pens in the pens, so it will save confusion. Over the great number of pens it was impossible to get all the exhibitors under the shed and I am afraid some of the birds must have suffered from the rain. I know I did.

The Trans-Nzola poultry farmers have excellent stock but some have a good deal to learn in how to show their birds in best advantage. The exception was the White Leghorn class and these birds were beautifully prepared for show but a bit wet to handle.

There were many Australorps at the show and I saw none of the best-grade ones on the exhibitors that I have met of any previous show in this country and quite a nice lot of birds, the great winners for the most part having tails to show "better" than there were few with the Yokohama tail which is not desirable in show days, and not one of the birds was as broad a back as I like to see, but taken all round a nice lot, perhaps having rather a lot of Kitale seed in their plumage, but that was not to be wondered at.

The Rhode Island classes carried better hens and pullets than cock-

and cockbirds. The outstanding ones were some that I downed afterwards but have recently discarded. These ladies were possessed of feet like the Rhode Island Red, but the legs were not so good as the Rhode Island Red, and the feet were not so good as the Rhode Island Red. The White Leghorn classes were quite good, but I saw some that I would not recommend to my friends, but there were several good ones, and the young ones which should make up into good birds when they grow out. The best of the Leghorns was a young hen with the most wonderful feature visible, they were very lean and fit to the touch and coupled with a goodly set of comb, legs and feet, and good head, were really plumage and good carriage. I believe she belonged to Mr. Stewart.

There was a class for hens with chicks; this was a most difficult class to judge and to my mind rather unsatisfactory. However after a bit of consideration I awarded the prize to a hen of Eight Hens. There was a nice well grown brood of Australorps, but they were feathering rather than they should be, and were at rather an awkward age to judge as a brood of chicks. A nice for the lightest bird on show had no crown. I believe the feathers of tail and primaries were very

### Geese

There was a magnificent pair of Toulouse geese, the finest I have seen in this country, the geese winning the championship as the best bird on the show. In the utility class there was a young Friesian Rooster which handled exceptionally well, the bird took the Cup for the best utility bird on show. There was one thing that attracted my attention, and that was that I had never met so many crooked-breasted and distorted breasted birds in show pens before.

I cannot help thinking that there must be something lacking in the natural foods for the birds round Kitale, and that the bones of the young birds do not harden so fast as they should do. I am no believer in the perching too young theory, as I have often seen crooked breasts in birds which have never perched, and I

put it down to lack of bone hardening material in the food.

### Ducks

I don't like to mention the ducks. There was a nice pair of Anconas which were the first prize, and a pair of Buff Orpingtons which took second place owing to lack of color in the drake's head. The exhibition of eggs was very good, there was no outstanding dozen amongst them and the exhibitors did it as good as the brown and tinted.

### Eggs

When exhibiting eggs, it is necessary to see them even in size and shape as possible; an even plate will always score higher, even if the eggs are a trifle smaller, than a plate where some are large and some are small. The white eggs in many cases had "whisks" at the pointed ends and looked good shell quality. The table birds were not a very good exhibit, but mostly on account of inexperience in dressing for show. The second prize birds were properly put up, but were not such good birds.

There was one bird on the show which I hope I shall meet under more propitious circumstances. This was a magnificent Indian Game hen, I believe belonging to Mr. Stewart, the breadth and short legs of this bird, in fact everything about her marks her as a fancy variety, and she would undoubtedly have been the best hen on show but for one thing, and that was that her eyes were nearly closed with stitching done, instead of the fierce alert look she should have had, she looked as if she had had a late night. I afterwards discovered that the exhibitor had been so busy helping other exhibitors that his own exhibit had suffered. Better luck next time!

The Trans-Nzola Poultry Association has made a fine start and it will be to the benefit of poultry farming in general in Kenya if they keep up their enthusiasm. I would like to recommend that future shows should be open to all poultry farmers as competitors is always good, and I hope the Trans-Nzola people will send some of their birds down to compete at Nakuru, because I am sure many of the birds would be worth the coveted "tablets."

I would like to thank the Association for its kind kindness to me and I hope everybody was satisfied with the results of my visit. A.M.B.

economically secured within the Department of Agriculture itself, subject to other forms of an independent Veterinary Department being established. The Colony for a long time in the opinion of the Government it is time the controversy should be decided.

**De-Commissioning.**  
 When the Commission is proposed in any separation of the services of the Department that there is need for more than the present staff of the members of the Department which are to be retained. Arrangements have been made which will be in contact with the field services and the Veterinary Branch. Again, there are no indications at times without due consideration of the probable advantage of the independent Veterinary Department.

The Commission, however, is a matter of some importance to the Government and it is necessary to make some formal measures to secure the best possible conditions of the Veterinary Department, veterinary administration and research. It is proposed that there should be a quarterly meeting between the branches concerned, at which each should submit a brief progress report, together with such other matters as the Director in the interests of the Department.

So important does the Commission seem to the Government that it would ask the Government to provide a staff to meet the Commission. It offers as given to the Commission, the Government should be set up a Board of Agricultural Officers, each of whom should take part as part of the proceedings of the Commission.

In considering the development of the stock industry in the question at once arises of the Department may most fruitfully work. A Uganda Protest.

There is something revealing to the Kenya public in the report which we published recently of the protest recorded by the three Unionist Members of the Uganda Legislative Council when they walked out of the Chamber at the opening of the debate on the 10th inst. For a year or two there has been apparent in Uganda a growing desire by unofficial opinion to permit to play a larger part in the affairs of the Protectorate and a certain discontent with the present provisions of the Constitution which place the power so completely in the hands of the official body. The conditions in Uganda are so different from those prevailing in other parts of East Africa that it is difficult to see how far the constitutional progress which has been possible in Kenya could be repeated there. The status of the country, based on agreement with the Native powers, is still that of a Protectorate, and conditions are analogous to those which existed in this country before Kenya was raised to the new dignity of a Crown Colony. There is no doubt at all that the application of some of the provisions of the Statute of Westminster to the territory of the Protectorate would be a step towards strengthening the position of Uganda in the Council of East Africa.

The recent controversy in Uganda in connection with the proposed revision of the bye-laws of the Agricultural Department from Kampala to Entebbe, has considerably aggravated the weaknesses of the constitutional position, and the added importance, weight to the case for increased official membership. We have examined the explanation put forward by the Government in support of its proposed action and have compared the same with the present provisions of the constitution, and we have failed to be convinced by the official case. There does not appear to us to be any sound reason for a change in the present position. The Agricultural Department in the one section of the Protectorate which has a special relationship with the Government, we view a much more important relationship than that of any other official institution. But as a constitutional position which is not only in conflict with the principle of serving as the privilege of the Council. When the Supplementary Estimates were before the Council, His Excellency the Governor expressed an assurance that the position would not be prejudicial. The Secretary of State for the Colonies, in the House of Commons, received the whole of the Department when it is intended to be removed. This is no small matter, especially in the case of the polished writing of Matheson Lang, as Sir Percy Fitzpatrick, the gallant English gentleman who risks his life to save French aristocrats. He is fully supported by the versatile Naniwa. Keya in the part of the Italian helpmate. As Theresa's companion, Juliette Compton scores a triumph, and Marjorie Hunt is splendid in the comparatively small part of Lady Bledsoe. The character studies of Matheson Lang, whether as poor old Bledsoe who lives in the sunset of Paris, or as an old hag who incites the mob against the all powerful Robespierre, or as the gay and debonair Sir Percy Fitzpatrick, are very well introduced while the scenes of the Tribunal are particularly vivid. The film is presented by the W. and F. Film Service Limited. The programme would be greatly improved by the deletion of an "alleged" Crackerjack Comedy.

### The Singapore Base.

#### MILITARY VIEW OF THE SITUATION.

(THROUGH SEUTE'S AGENCY.)  
London, Nov. 17.  
From a distance point of view, the Singapore base is as much a question for the Army and Air Force as for the Navy, declared General Sir Ian Hamilton in a speech in London today. He said that he himself still the late Viscount French had visited Singapore as Inspector-General. They had to consider after the proximity of Formosa and South China, and there was no longer any harm in saying that they had both considered the formation of a very considerable mobile land defence force to be necessary, so that the base was expanded on the Singapore fortified base, in addition to a full fortress section of British troops.

#### Airship R101.

#### FLIGHT POSTPONED OWING TO WEATHER.

(BY WIRELESS.)  
Bagby, Nov. 17.  
Washed weather today called a postponement of the flight of eight members of the House of Commons and 20 Poms in the R101. There was a strong wind and torrential rain, but the postponement was decided upon not because there is any doubt of the ability of the airship to withstand such weather but because the passengers would have been unable to see the countryside or to distinguish a correct impression of normal conditions—British Official Wireless Service.

Cabinet meetings on board the R101 when Ministers would be able to escape from their worries were prophesied by Lord Thomson after a flight which he described as the most pleasant experience of his life, giving him a feeling of detachment and security greater than that obtainable on an aerial liner. He managed to do a lot of work in peaceful surroundings. The airship was able for ten hours and exceeded 70 miles an hour on several occasions.  
Morning was delayed owing to the wind and extending 300 feet of guy ropes and the airship was tied up.

### Tanganyika Camera.

#### CONTROLLING THE USE OF CAMERA AND REEF.

The public outcry raised against what was termed the "indiscriminate shooting of game," with Tanganyika as the principal centre of the controversy, brought to light the fact that the camera is rapidly supplanting the rifle as the main agent of the hunter. All through the rifle, in of course, assumes the character of a snare in some way, judged more from the point of view of the quality of the photographic plates than the actual trophies brought back. So much has the tendency increased that the Government of Tanganyika have felt the necessity of introducing legislation to control and regulate the photography of game. A Bill will be introduced into the Legislature which will impose similar penalties upon those found photographing game in closed areas as those imposed when an offender is caught shooting game in closed areas.

The Bill amends the 1921 Ordinance and generally tightens up the regulations and restricts game availability, the most important of which relates to photography. A Bill in any case declared a closed reserve shall be liable to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding six months without the option of a fine.  
The section further provides that any apparatus which is in the possession of a person, including his motor car, if he should be in one at the time of the offence, be confiscated.

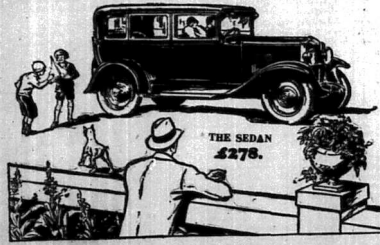

## The Nakuru Show.

After three difficult years in which the Nakuru district suffered increasingly from the adverse conditions, the intention of the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society to hold a show next month comes as a welcome encouragement to the belief and hope that the Colony has passed through this cycle and is emerging again at a period of progress and prosperity. In a special article which will be found elsewhere this morning, evidence is given that the Nakuru area, and indeed all the competing districts of the Colony, has recognized the psychological value of a Show of this nature. It is a matter of course, always involved in the maintenance of the spontaneous concentration by the agricultural industry upon this opportunity to prove to themselves and to the friends of the country elsewhere that despite all the difficulties which have been presented and the severity of the tests imposed on an small community that professed their faith in the Colony and in themselves is unshaken. Kenya has proved particularly slow to see that the degree of vitality it possesses in the face of obstacles is an amazing feature of its economic history. In no case has this been more marked than in the Nakuru district where the ravage of the drought and the threat from locust infestation, added to the normal risks of farming, have been so considerable that the area is still suffering from the absence of normal conditions. Yet Nakuru and the adjoining districts have shown an amazing power of resistance. The crop expectations of the district for the coming season show 80,000 acres under matured, the largest in the Colony—estimated to

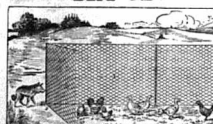

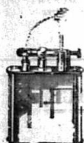
